STUDENT SPOTLIGHT ASSUMPTION ASTRONAUT TRAINING

Linda Klocokova, a grade 10 student at
Burlington's Assumption Catholic Secondary School
is one of 52 young Canadians from across the
country who will virtually join astronauts, engineers
and scientists from the Canadian Space Agency
(CSA) for an exciting week of space training. The
participants were selected through a random draw
from a pool of eligible candidates who had
previously completed online Junior Astronauts

activities in three streams – science and technology, fitness and nutrition, and teamwork and communication – which represent the different types of knowledge and



skills needed by astronauts. The plan was to have the youngsters get the training at the Space Agency headquarters in Montreal but COVID forced a change in plans to a virtual event. The young space enthusiasts will be challenged through a series of activities, from operating a real rover during a simulated Moon mission, to solving Earth problems using satellite imagery and working out with astronauts and space fitness experts. The camp will offer them a unique chance to learn about space careers as well as the scientific, physical and leadership qualities they will need to develop if they strive to participate to a future mission to the Moon.
