He was the first-known black Catholic priest in the United States after his ordination in 1886.

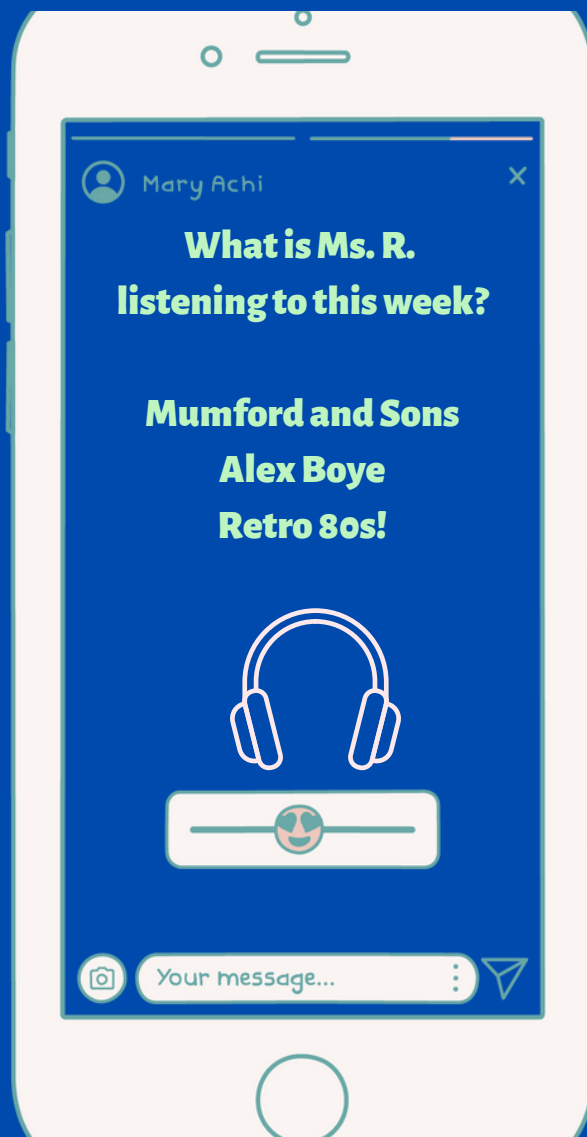
Born into slavery and baptized Catholic in the United States Ven. Tolton studied for the priesthood and was ordained in Rome.
