- 6. Student Reports
  - a. Student Council Mia Rodgers & Taylor Popovacki
    - Relay 4 life was a HUGE success, more than \$60,000 was raised. Students and staff did amazingly. Many donations were collected by the Council members.

- End of year BBQ was held BBQ & food funded by collections from the Student Activity Fees. This was a great student bonding time before year-end culminating started

- b. Athletic Council Laura Ponkivar unable to attend, Mia gave an update

- 7. Teacher's Report
  - a. Mario Soster
    - The Athletic Banquet showcased sports talents and achievements
    - BBQ showcased the students school spirit. There was a noticeable excitement in the air.
    - Life Skills Graduation, Special Ed will be held next week. Life skills students graduate when they leave school. It can take 4-7 years; they receive a Diploma or Certificate of Achievement or Certificate of Accomplishment; this is determined together by the parents and teachers.

    - Tech in the main gym and small to be completed by year-end
    - Tech in the Cafeteria and Piazza have been completed

- 8. Chaplain's Report-Adriana Rerecich
  - a. The Easter season has now ended with Pentecost
  - b. Catholic Education Week is coming up
  - c. Hoisting the Pride Flag, each day a different person is featured in the Morning Show
  - d. School Closing year sessions theme: Reflections on the year gone by and thoughts for the future
  - e. Jun.24 Last day of Morning Show. This has been well received this year
  - f. Jun.27 Grad Mass
  - g. Jun.27 Staff Mass
- 9. Treasurer's Report Pascale Lapointe-Antunes
  - a. Detailed Funds generation and usage report was presented
  - b. There are some receivables outstanding that still need to be collected
  - c. Graduation Award will come out of the balance of funds available. \$100/- each, 10 awards in total. This award is a long-standing tradition. It was decided that this will be brough up in the meeting much earlier in the year. Maria proposed that the decision on the recipients of award should be made by the council and not the Chair of the Departments Clark was in agreement of this.
  - d. The awards are given to students who make a difference represent what an Assumption Crusader is. Currently the students submit a form with details about themselves. Clark to send out the criteria.
- 10. Fundraising Committee Update Briana Hamlet
  - a. When funds are going to be used it should be voted on to maintain transparency of needs and usage of Funds. Melanie acknowledged that this was achieved this year.

- b. Planning needs to be done a list of events that go on during a year should be complied so that the Council can plan for them. It was noted that pre-covid the calendar was planned at the beginning of the year. This year was 'planned chaos'.
- c. Planning has already started for next year. This will be shared with the Council at the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting next year. The SGF report should be addressed done early in the year to determine Funds to be Generated and Expected Usage of Funds.
- d. A list of contacts and companies for outreach needs to be maintained. There needs to be coordination during fundraising so that the same people or businesses are not contacted by several members.
- e. Important to contact community partners early in the year as some have limited budgets that are available for community support
- f. Used Clothing Sales does not generate loads of funds but enables student involvement and volunteer hours for the students.
- g. Better communication was advocated Communication is important and will benefit the school and Council
- h. A List of items for funds usage was established. This year we were able to spend on some items that needed support. Proposed and agreed that a list should be set-up every year so that the following year's committee can work on the projects; it takes too long for both the list and support to be completed in the same year. A comment was made that a lot may not have been done this year, but we have set-up groundwork and lists for the future year.
- i. Waiting of estimates on Sound & Lighting for the back room of the gym and Library.
- j. Mark C. suggested that seed money should be left for the next Council.
- k. Also suggested that money should be saved at the end of each year that will be used by the council of the following year for the Grad Awards. This ensures that there is never a question of whether there will be money available for the awards. To be decided by next year's council

Clark looking into working with sister schools to rent out a large facility together in the future; possibility of all 3 schools having their graduation on the same day different time slots.
