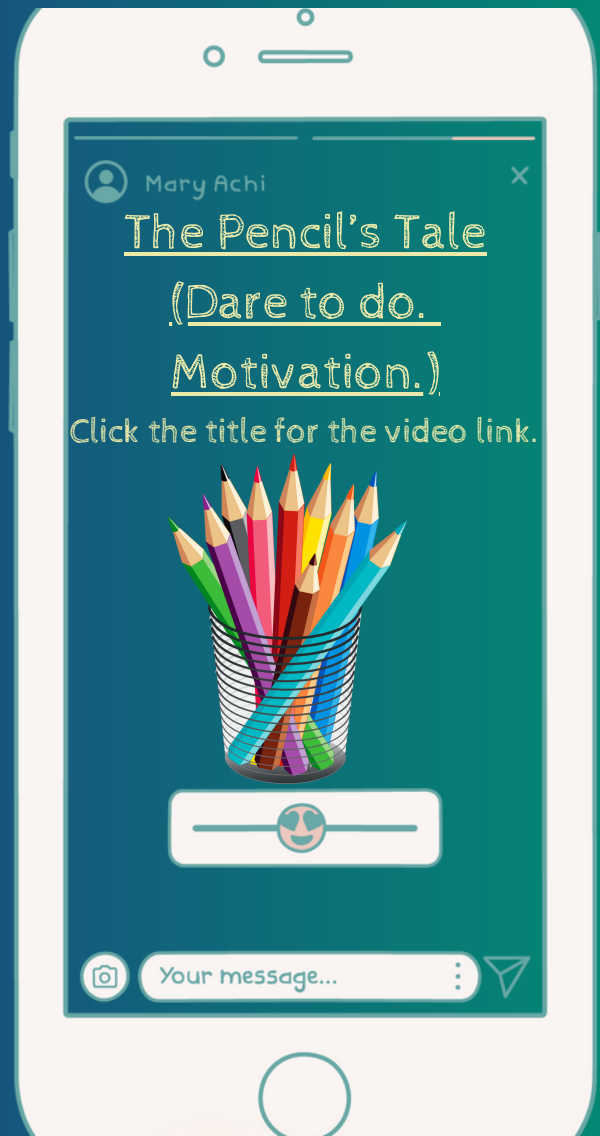
# THEATRE FOR THE PEOPLE
