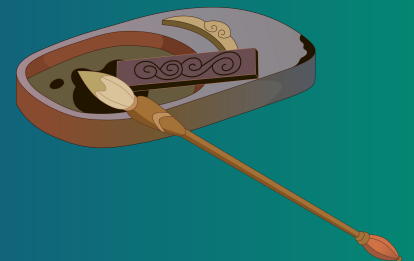

INDIA LIFTS MILLIONS OUT OF POVERTY

India has historically had a high poverty rate, which as of late 2022 was defined as living on less than US\$2.15 a day. But there are other ways to define poverty.

That's why the United Nations Development Program and the Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative measure multidimensional poverty—things like health, education and the standard of living.

A 2022 report from the two groups was promising. It showed that 415 million people in India had gotten out of multidimensional poverty in the span of about 15 years.

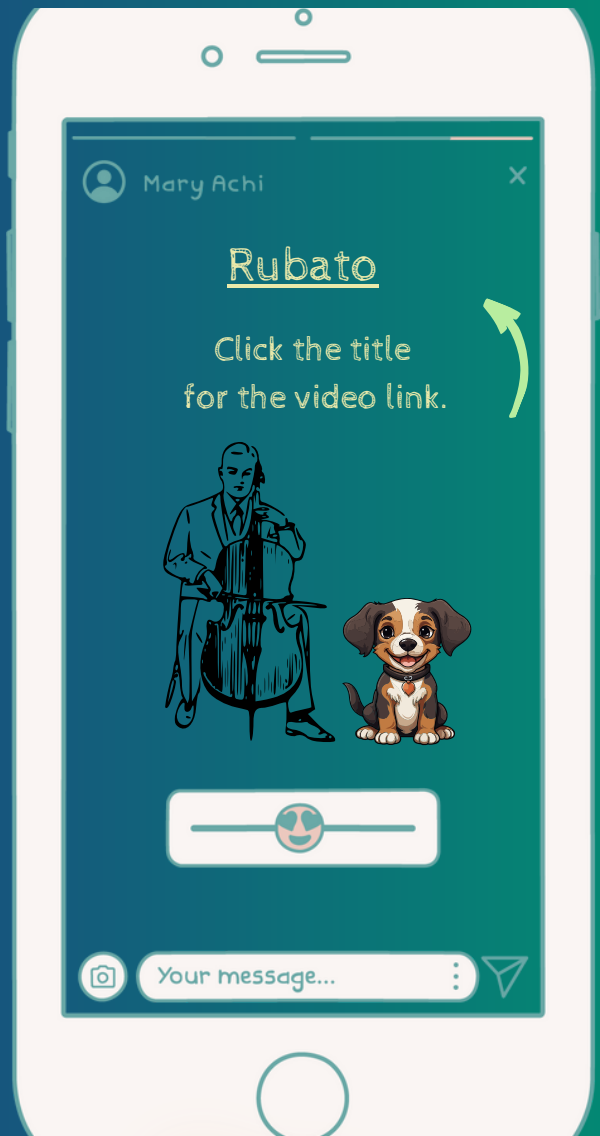
At the start of the study, in 2005-06, the incidence of multidimensional poverty in the country was 55.1 percent. By 2019-21, it had fallen to 16.4 percent.

The drop is due in part to India's efforts in sustainability, providing skills training to women and youth and increasing services to vulnerable communities. —Tina Knezevic
