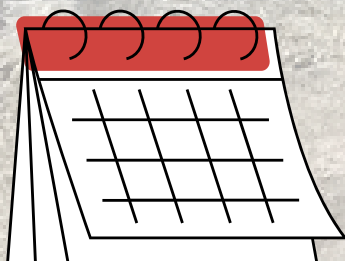

to truth and reconciliation.*

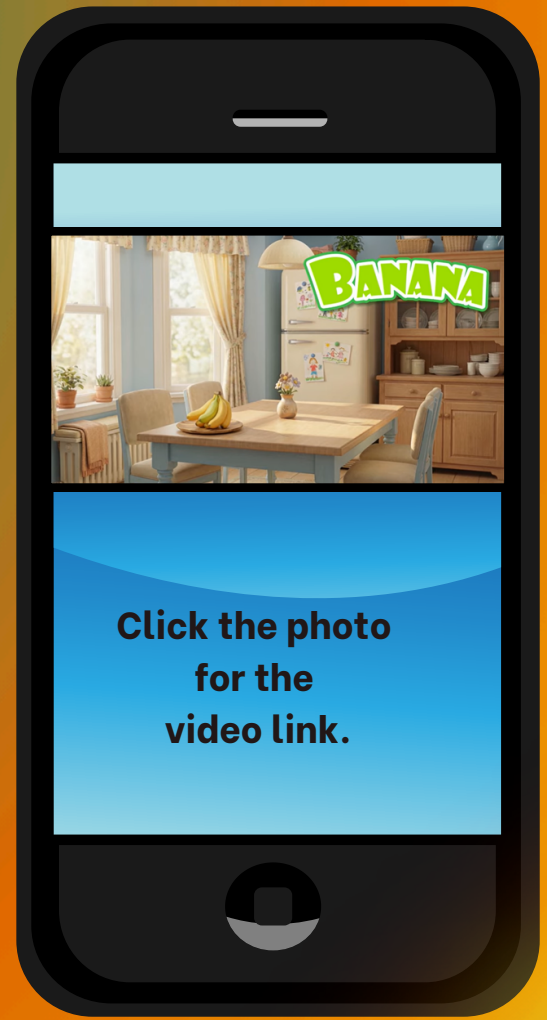




## Husky in Saskatchewan avoids the vet appt!

# PLUG IN TO YOUR FAITH - BONUS FEATURE

June is the month of the Solemnity of The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The heart of Jesus is adored as a symbol of his threefold love: human, spiritual, and divine.

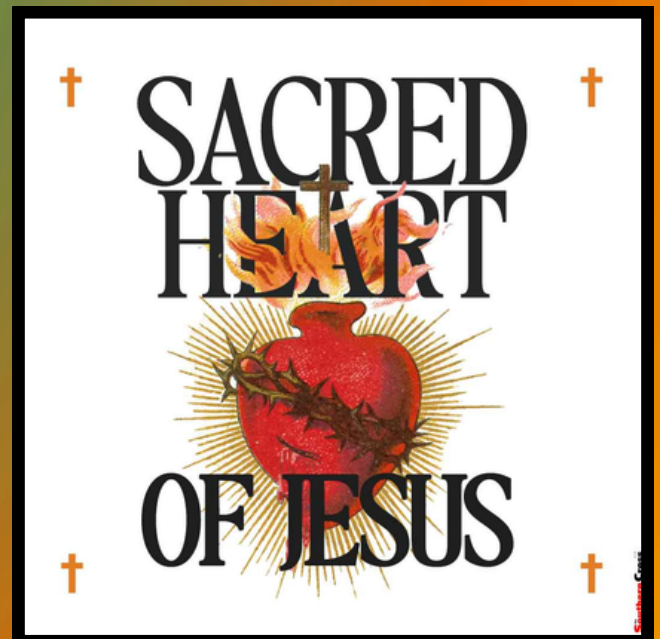
Novenas are a devotion that takes place over 9 days, usually beginning 8 days before the feast day of the saint, and the 9<sup>th</sup> day being the feast day itself.

The word novena is taken from “novem,” the Latin word for nine. A novena is made up of nine days of prayer and meditation usually to ask God for special prayer requests or petitions. Novenas are often used to ask specific saints to pray for us. The Saint Jude Novena, for example, is prayed to ask Saint Jude to intercede on behalf of a request that seems especially dire.

Novenas are an ancient tradition that goes back to the days of the Apostles. Jesus told His disciples to pray together after His ascension into heaven, so they went to an upper room along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, (Acts 1:14) and joined constantly in prayer for nine days. These nine days of constant prayer by the Apostles at the direction of Jesus led up to Pentecost. This is when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as “tongues of fire” (Acts 2:1-4). This pattern of 9 days of prayer is the basis the novenas we pray today.

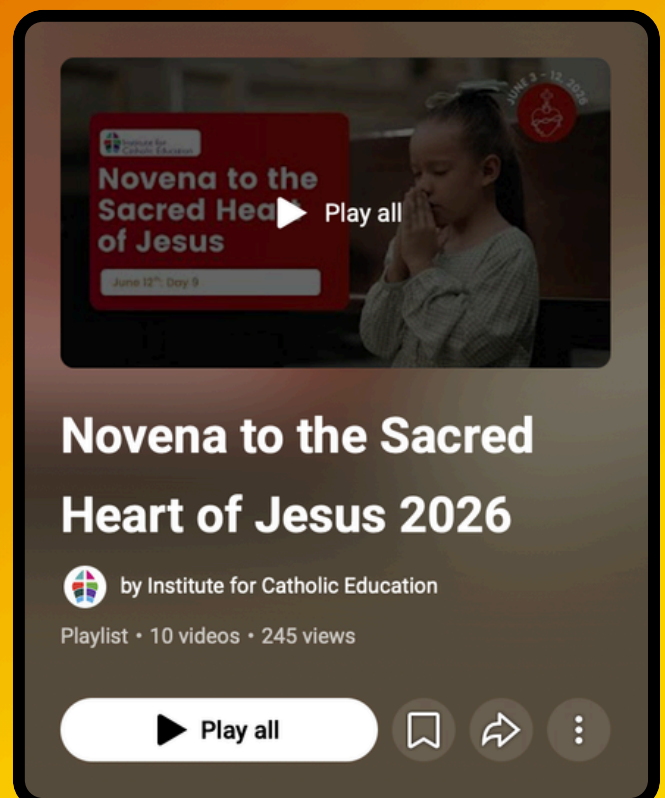

**Rules for life.**

Imagine a soccer game where the rules kept changing. As you're kicking the ball up the field, your opponent grabs the ball, tucks it under his arm like a football, and takes off running. Next time you get the ball, another player knocks you down with a roundhouse kick but no foul is called. Then, right as you're about to score, the goalie and his buddies take off with the net. Not much of a game, is it? Rules exist for a reason, even in soccer, or any sport for that matter. Knowing the boundaries, the expectations, and the consequences of breaking them helps players respect the game and each other. This kind of fair play also allows each player to develop their skills and have fun doing it. It's what makes soccer, *soccer*.

In the same way, we have rules for life: the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, the Golden Rule. These aren't just ancient things that don't apply any more. These are God-given laws that are written in our hearts: "*A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you, and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.*" (Ezekiel 36.26) Sure, we aren't murderers and thieves, right? But let's dig a little deeper. Because these boundaries and expectations, and the consequences of breaking them, are God's guidelines for a great life. Following the commandments--taking God's coaching--is how we develop character, connection, community, and find *real joy*.

Each commandment is more than a simple do or don't. Think about what each command protects and upholds. For instance, we may not be thieves, but have we cheated on a test? Do we use AI to do our school work and don't bother using our brain? We may not kill, covet, or give false witness--but are we judgmental, jealous, petty, and eager to gossip? Are we genuinely happy when good things happen to others? Do we respect our parents' rules? Most importantly, do we let other things or people take the place of God in our lives?

If we spend time thinking about each of God's commandments, we see the gift of this rulebook. One that teaches us how to respect our life and the life of others; we respect the Giver of Life and every player in God's league....which, of course, is all of humanity.
