WHAT IS A GRADE I2 EXIT PLAN AND A TRANSITION MEETING?

What is a Grade 12 Exit (Transition) Plan?

- All Grade 12s are expected to complete a transition planner that outlines their research of post-secondary pathways of interest to them.
- Guidance counsellors review each transition planner

What is a Transition Meeting?

Counsellors will meet with each Grade 12 student in the fall (may be virtual or in person) to review:

- the student's exit/transition plan
- graduation requirements
- post-secondary application process
- OYAP/Specialty program application process
- Workplace and GAP year options
- Scholarships/Awards
- OSAP/How to pay for post-secondary

Students MUST sign up for their transition meeting no later then Oct. 16th. Sign up on D2L.

Student Services D2L class

 Grade I2s MUST check this site daily since it is the primary way that counsellors will communicate with students

Student Services Grade 12 channel

- Download MySchoolDay app
- all grade 12s MUST subscribe to Student Services Grade 12 channel for updates to their phone



- 30 credits (18 compulsory, 12 elective).
 See your myBlueprint graduation indicator and be sure you see 30 credits completed!
- 40 hours of Community Service submitted to your guidance counsellor
- Successful completion of the OSSLT (the grade 10 Literacy Test) or the OLC (the Literacy course). See your myBlueprint account to ensure literacy requirement is complete

MANDATORY GRADUATION APPLICATION GRADUATION FEE

- All Grade 12s who will be graduating in June of 2021 MUST complete the Graduation Application that is now posted on Student Services D2L class. Deadline is Oct. 16th
- Counsellors are waiting for updates for the graduation and corresponding fees. This will be communicated later. In the past the fee has covered:

GRADUATION RELATED DATES-TO BE DETERMINED

Counsellors are waiting for dates for the following:

- How To Pay For Post-Secondary, virtual presentation
- Graduation Photos
- Valedictorian application speeches and voting
- Prom
- Graduation Mass
- Graduation Brunch
- Graduation gown pick up
- Graduation Ceremony



When the Prom date has been determined:

- To purchase a prom ticket, students must have submitted 40 hours of community service to their Guidance Counsellor
- Community service hours are due before April 8, 2021
- Students must have completed the HCDSB's Grade 12 Exit Survey (which is different from the Exit Interview!) Details will be provided in the spring.



- Ontario Scholar status is calculated by using the average of a student's top 6 grade 12 courses, at any level and taken at any time (day, summer, night school)
- If you do not have 6 grade 12 courses, you are not eligible for Ontario Scholar status
- Cooperative education is not considered a grade 12 course. You must speak to your Coop Education teacher if you have concerns.

 Applications to Ontario Universities will require a PIN which students will receive from Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC) in early Nov. <u>Be sure to use your legal first name and legal surname to apply</u> ... EXACTLY as you appear in the BR system.

December

- Complete and submit your Ontario university application. BR urges you to do this before Christmas break.
 - \$150 application fee to OUAC, gives you 3 programs at any schools.
 - \$50 fee for each additional program that you apply to. Maximum of 3 programs at any one university. Other fees may apply. See school websites

January

• OUAC application deadline is January 15, 2021. We think this is late!!

COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS (OCAS)

September, October, November

October

 Create your Ontario college application account by going to ontariocolleges.ca. Click APPLY and set up your account. <u>Be sure to use</u> your legal first name and legal surname to apply ... EXACTLY as you appear in the BR system.

December

- Complete and submit your Ontario college application. BR urges you to do this before Christmas break.
 - \$95 application fee to OCAS, gives you 5 programs at any schools.
 - You can select a maximum of 3 programs at one college
 - You are paying for 5 choices, so we suggest you select 5 programs!

February

OCAS application deadline for equal consideration is February 1, 2021.
 We think this is late!!

Colleges have "rolling admission" so the sooner you apply the sooner you may receive an offer of admission.

GRADES SUBMISSION: UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE

 ALL grade 11 and grade 12 marks are sent electronically to OUAC and OCAS. You do NOT have to provide a paper transcript to any Ontario university or college.

Transmission Timeline:

- October- all grade 11 and 12 final marks and courses on your schedule for this year
- Early November- Sem I (Quad I) midterms
- February- Sem I final marks
- April- Sem 2 midterm marks
- Early July- Sem 2 final marks
- YOU must provide mid-term and final report cards to your guidance counsellor for all courses being taken outside of Halton Catholic District School Board
 - These marks will be manually entered by your counsellor.

OYAP: HOW TO RESEARCH AND APPLY

OYAP/Specialty Programs

- The are several Ontario Youth Apprenticeship programs that are popular with graduates, including but not limited to BR's very own Electrical OYAP program

- Email your guidance counsellor to let them know that you are interested so they can check your prerequisite courses and tell you how to apply



- Major scholarships and awards are posted to the Student Services D2L class as they are received in Student services
 - This may be daily, weekly, or monthly
- Many are time sensitive with concrete deadlines so you must be organized
- Many limit the number of applicants per school. These will require a nomination process. These will be announced on:
 - D2L
 - Student Services Twitter
 - MSD (MySchoolDay) app
 - Instagram (coming soon)
