- Do you accept courses that have been taken through night school, summer school, and correspondence? Do you accept repeated courses without penalty?
- What are the admission averages for programs that interest me?
- Do you look at grade 11 final marks? If yes, which courses are considered?
- What does "early offer of admission" mean?

## Programs

- Can I see a "viewbook" online?
- What is an undergraduate degree at a university and a college?
- What is an advanced diploma, diploma, and certificate at a college?
- Does your university/college have the program that interests me?
- If you have an IEP (individual education plan) What supports are available for students with and IEP and how do I access them?
- For university liaisons, what is the difference between a professional program and a master degree?
- Where can I get more information about a particular program?
- Should I look at your course calendar for more information?

## **Finances**

- What are the costs involved in attending your institution for one year (tuition, books, fees, residence, etc.)?
- Do you award scholarships automatically or must I apply?

## <u>Lifestyle</u>

- How do I apply for residence?
- Is residence guaranteed?
- What varsity sports are available?
- What sports can I play if I'm not on a varsity team?
- What campus support services are offered, especially for new students?
- What are the first-year class sizes like at your institution?

• Do class sizes vary according to the program I choose?
