





## PATHWAY OPPORTUNITIES



**SHSM PROGRAMS** - Gr. 11 and 12; sector focused; experiential learning; certifications; special diploma and record card; for all pathways


**COOP -** Unique experiential learning opportunity; 1-4 credits; hands on; day, night, and summer school options

**CONCENTRATED OYAP PROGRAMS -** Specific apprenticeship opportunities; most of education is paid for; reduces number of years required to become an apprentice; dual credits









### Each SHSM consists of five required components:

- 1. Bundled courses (8-10 sector related courses)
- 2. Experiential learning & career exploration (coop, field trips)
- 3. Reach ahead experiences (post-secondary fair)
- 4. Certifications & training (recognized in specific sector)
- 5. Sector-partnered contextualized experiences (workshop)





## PATHWAY OF THE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM



#### A typical apprentice:

- Earns OSSD
- Signs on as an apprentice
- Goes to college to complete Levels
  1, 2 and possibly 3 on the job training
- Completes between 6,000 10,000 hours working with a journeyperson
- Works/studies 2-5 years (usually 4-5)
- Can earn a Red Seal
- Government grants!



OYAP is a high school program that allows you to try a huge variety of apprenticeship based careers in skilled trades, through the COOP **Education Program**



Students access the same learning and training for about \$250 (electrical) to \$450 (hairstyling) and in a shorter time period than a regular apprenticeship program!

> Ease the transition from school to work.

OYAP students will often have the opportunity to complete Part 1 of their training and use the hours towards their apprenticeship

## SWAC: SCHOOL WITHIN A COLLEGE COLLEGE

#### What is SWAC and why should you take it?

- ☐ A program that focuses on the skilled trades pathway
- ☐ Secondary students attend Mohawk college for the semester
- ☐ Students will EARN 4 OSSD credits and 2 college credit
- Hands on experience and development in the skilled trades
- ☐ Access to Accessible Learning Services for students with IEPs
- College experience and full access to their facilities
- ☐ All expenses paid for including transportation, safety equipment, and field trips
- Support from a Mohawk Learning Officer- career planning, community involvement, etc.







## WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR SWAC? COLLEGE

- ☐ Grade 11 and 12 students who are looking into the college pathway
- ☐ Students looking for an alternative to earning high school credits
- May be unsure about their pathway beyond high school
- ☐ Is in need of career clarification
