WHAT: High school classes participate in an anatomy workshop.

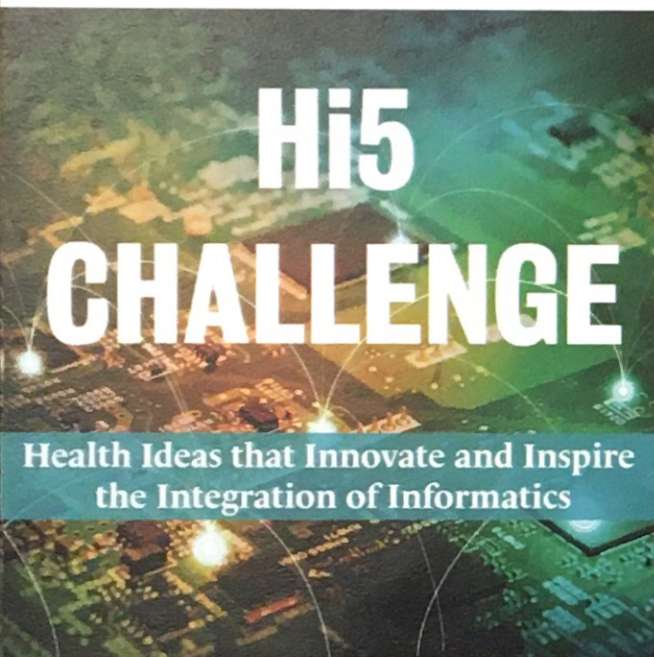
WHO: Grade 11 and 12 classes in Introductory Kinesiology, Biology, and Health and Wellness Specialist High Skills Major.
