
#### The Catholic Dimension in Practice

# The Grade 9 Program

#### High School Format

- 2 semesters
  - Semester 1: September to January
  - Semester 2: February to June
- Exams/culminating activities at the end of each semester
- 4 periods/classes a day (75 minutes each), per semester
  Period 1, Period 2, Period 3 and Period 4
- Lunch (40 minutes)
  - All Grade 9 students are on the same lunch
- School day is from 8:15 a.m. 2:20 p.m.

#### Ontario Secondary School Diploma

#### OSSD Requirements:

- 30 credits;
  - 18 compulsory
  - 12 optional
  - (4 Religion courses compulsory, 1 in each year)
- 40 hours community involvement
- Grade 10 Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

#### Community Involvement

- Ministry and Board guidelines governing placements (MUST be pre-approved)
- Encourages civic responsibility, Catholic values and the importance of volunteering in the community
- Supports career exploration
- Hours must be documented using a form available in Student Services or on cccss.ca
- Students may begin community service involvement on July 1, 2020

#### OSSD Literacy Test Requirement

- Students must meet Literacy Test requirement to graduate high school.
- The Literacy Test is taken in Grade 10.
- Students must achieve at least a Level 3 to pass.
- If a student is unable to meet standards on the first attempt; students can rewrite the test in grade 11 or take OLC 401.

#### Academic Courses (D)

- Greater emphasis on THEORY as a basis for future learning and problem solving
- Focus on critical thinking and theoretical thinking
- Students in grade 8 working at a Level 4
- Independent learners
- Pacing is fairly fast with new concepts presented every few days
- These courses have last 3 characters 1D1
  English Math Science French Geography

#### Applied Courses (P)

- Emphasis is on PRACTICAL applications
- Course work relates to familiar real-life situations and provides students with the opportunity for hands-on application of the concepts they learn
- Pacing is moderate with new concepts presented every few days.
- More dependent learners
- Require greater teacher direction and instruction
- These courses have last 3 characters 1P1
  English Math Science French Geography

#### Locally Developed (L)

- Locally developed courses are for students working at a Level
  1 or have modified curriculum expectations
- Content will address gaps in learning
- Pacing is matched to the needs of individual learners
- Students are dependent learners who require explicit teacher direction and instruction
- These courses lead to the workplace stream in grade 11 and 12
- These courses have last 3 characters 1L1
  English Math Science

#### Open Courses (O)

- Open courses have <u>one set of expectations</u> for all students.
  These courses are not specific to destinations and are appropriate for all students.
- These courses have last 3 characters 101


#### Gr 8 Teacher Recommendations

- 4 year program (Many students take 5 years)
- Grade 10 Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test
- 40 hours of community involvement (can start volunteering in July 2020
- Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses are chosen according to student's destination (Apprenticeships, Workplace, College, University)
