- Summer School Offering come out at the end of May (4 weeks in July). If you take a course with a school board other than HCDSB you will need to provide us with a report card.

COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

• OSSD

- All Gr. 11 & 12 high school grades are sent to colleges (full disclosure)
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12) ENG4C is usually required for most programs
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required.

- Some programs are highly competitive, so apply right away before the deadline
- Colleges also offer Applied Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course



UNIVERSITY ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- Universities may consider both G<u>rade 11 and 12</u> U and M courses for early admission
- Almost every university program requires ENG 4U + 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level
- Some programs will have other pre-requisites such as Math, specific science courses etc.
- Make sure you do your research. Not every university has the same requirements for similar or the same program.
