THE ADVENTURE

This annual event provides a unique opportunity for a select group of young Canadians to come together and gain a better understanding of our country. Through meetings with political leaders, senior officials and others, they learn a great deal about the workings of our democratic institutions. Through meeting one another and having discussions among themselves, they learn to appreciate the diversity of Canada and the privileges and responsibilities of citizenship.

A consistently positive response to this program is the value attached to the opportunity to meet their peers from across Canada. The discovery that Canadians hold much more in common than the matters that divide us.

ELIGIBILITY

The Rotary Adventure in Citizenship Program is open to students ages 16-18 years with excellent potential to become community leaders and are representatives of all religious and cultural communities that comprise the Canadian Society. The program is intended for Canadian Citizens or those who hold landed immigrant status.

PROGRAM COST

The program is completely administered by Rotary Club of Ottawa members, keeping program expenses low. Each student is sponsored by their local Rotary Club. The sponsoring Club covers the Registration Fee.



A TYPICAL PROGRAM:

THE PROGRAM EVOLVES FROMYEAR TO YEAR IN RESPONSE TO THE CHANGING POLITICAL AGENDA OF THE COUNTRY AND TO NEW OPPORTUNITIES. THE FOLLOWING IS A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF A TYPICAL PROGRAM:

> The Adventure begins with introductions and our opening plenary session with a keynote speaker.

> Discussions with the Speaker and staff members of the House of Commons.

Interactive discussion and debate on a topical subject.

Indigenous issues and discussions.

Citizenship Court where new Canadians receiving their citizenship.
