CC Chaplaincy Award	Presented to a graduate who gives witness to their faith in God through service to others in their school and community.
CC H.E.A.R.T. Award	Recognizes graduating students who are Hardworking, Enthusiastic, Active, Responsible and Trustworthy.
CC Ambassador Award	Recognizes graduating students who are role models in the promotion of school spirit and who inspire positive involvement in school life.
