

AP Preparation and AP courses provide:

- topics and material studied in greater depth
- opportunities for enriched learning that go beyond facts and figures
- learning environment built on critical thinking and application of concepts
- rich course material
- thought provoking classroom discussion
- assignments enhanced rigor
- development of knowledge and enhanced critical thinking skills
- AP courses offer university level content to students at the Grade 12 level.





What is Advanced Placement?


The Advanced Placement ®(AP) Program helps students connect with university opportunities globally.

- University-level courses taken in secondary school.
- End-of-course assessment externally developed and scored by university faculty and experienced AP teachers.
- Recognized by universities in more than 60 countries for admission.
- Advanced standing granted by universities in the U.S. and Canada.



Advanced Placement in Canada

- 32,014 students from 580 schools participated in AP
- 100,000+ students from 800+ schools in 250+ communities participated in AP pathway courses
- Students from every province & territory
- Advanced Credit granted by every English-speaking university

Results

- 93% of students said taking at least one AP course significantly reduced the stress of their first year of university
- 94% of students said that AP gave them an advantage over their peers in the same class
- 98% of students said they would take AP again in high school if given the chance

What is AP Preparation?

The AP Preparation courses are an advanced series of courses that are designed to be a rigorous preparation for the AP courses and exams in grade 12. These courses also prepare students for success in university. They are intended to be challenging, but the benefits to students are well worth it.







The Grade 9 AP Preparation Program

The Grade 9 AP Prep Program at Corpus Christi Catholic Secondary School will offer:



English (ENG1WA)

French (FSF 1DA)

Geography (CGC1DA)

Mathematics

(MTH1WA)

Science (SNC1WA)



*minimum of 1 course per year

The Grade 10 AP Preparation Program

The Grade 10 AP Prep Program at Corpus Christi Catholic Secondary School will offer:



English (ENG2DA)

History (CHC2DA)

Mathematics (MPM 2DA)

Science (SNC 2DA)

*minimum of 1 course per year



Alignment of AP with the Ontario Curriculum

The AP curriculum significantly builds on the Ontario secondary school curriculum in the indicated subjects

Students in AP prep courses complete academic (9/10) or university prep (11/12) curriculum with appropriate extensions

The courses in grades 9-12 are designed to prepare students to write the AP Exams in grade 12



Assessment and Evaluation



- √ Students will be evaluated according to the Ministry's assessment and evaluation policy documents.
- ✓ Students will be evaluated on the appropriate grade level curriculum expectations.
- √ Teachers of AP preparation and AP courses attend additional AP training.
- √ The course mark as determined above, will be multiplied by 1.05 to determine the mark that will be reported on the Provincial Report Card.

Looking Ahead: AP Exams and Scores in Grade 12

AP exams are written in May in your own school. They are distributed by the College Board and administered by the school.

Each AP exam mark is a weighted combination of the student's scores on the multiple-choice section 50% and the open response section 50%.



The final mark is reported on a 5-point scale:

5 = extremely well qualified

4 = well qualified

3 = qualified

2 = possibly qualified

1 = no recommendation

The submission of AP exam results is determined by the student.

Advanced Placement (AP) Credit Policies at Ontario Universities

Most universities have an AP credit policy that states:

- the maximum number of university credits a student may earn through AP testing (often 2 – 3, but sometimes more)
- the minimum score required to earn a university credit (usually a 4 or a 5 out of 5).

Admission Process and Required Paperwork

AP Application Deadline: January 19, 2024

AP Admission is based on the following:

- Grade 7 June report card to be submitted with application
- Evaluation of Learning Skills and Work Habits on Grade 7
 June report card
- May require Grade 8 mid-terms for final acceptance

***Students applying from outside of HCDSB —in addition to the AP Application, will be required to complete the registration process. Further information on how to register will be provided upon acceptance to the program.

GR 9 AP PREP APPLICATION

Corpus Christi's AP Application will be completed online. This is for students who are currently in grade 8 and will be entering grade 9 in September, 2023.

Online Application Check-list:

☐ Complete and submit the online AP Application posted on Corpus Christi's website
☐ Scan your child's grade 7 June report card to a PDF file. Follow instructions provided in the Grade 9 AP Preparation Application
☐ Include any relevant information about your child's progress by the end of grade 7.
☐ If your child is not currently attending one of Corpus Christi or Notre Dame's family of schools, you are asked to complete the online Registration to attend Corpus Christi CSS. This is to be completed in addition to the online AP Application .
☐ Upon acceptance, we will contact you to finalize registration.

The AP Application can be found on our website between Dec. 2 - Dec. 22, 2022

Transportation

- The AP preparation and AP programs are specialized optional programs.
- As per HCDSB Policy 1-04: Transportation is only provided for students living within the Corpus Christi boundaries who qualify for bussing according to board policies.
- As per HCDSB Policy 1-04: Cross Boundary students attending the AP preparation or AP program DO NOT require a cross boundary form.
- Cross Boundary AP preparation and AP students are responsible for their own transportation.
