# ARE YOU READY FOR GRADE 11?

- All grade 11 students should have 16 credits by the end of Grade 10.
- Students who do not meet these requirements should attend Summer School.
- Summer School Offerings come out at the end of May and you can apply through MyBlueprint (Summer school runs for 4 weeks in July).
- If you take a course with a school board other than HCDSB you will need to provide us with a report card. Register through your myblueprint account - Continuing Education



# PROGRAMS

## haltonpathways.ca

- OYAP - Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program
- SHSM - Fitness and Health Promotion, Arts and Culture, Environmental Science, and Business - apply on myBlueprint, and fill in a form found outside of Student Services or on the school website

Each SHSM program offers students a bundle of 8 - 10 credits (including a two-credit coop). These courses are regular Ontario secondary school courses that allow students to work towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, but have been bundled as the most relevant courses to prepare students for a future in the selected sector.

- Students also get the opportunity to participate in a variety of workshops and certifications.
- You must sign up for a 2-credit co-op in grade 11 or 12 to obtain the SHSM certificate. Co-op occurs in various community placements (contact Mrs. Jurinic or Mr. Spadafora). An application is required

## Prior Learning Assessment Recognition

You may be eligible to “challenge” a specific course for credit if you can provide enough evidence that you have met the provincial course expectations (equal to 110 hours, and meeting all Overall Expectations of the course)

# COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- All Gr. 11 & 12 high school grades are sent to colleges (full disclosure)
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12) ENG4C is usually required for most programs
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses - English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required.
- [www.ontariocolleges.ca](http://www.ontariocolleges.ca)
- Some programs are highly competitive, so apply right away before the deadline
- Colleges also offer Applied Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course (Required marks usually lower than University)

# UNIVERSITY ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- Universities may consider both Grade 11 and 12 U and M courses for early admission
- Almost every university program requires ENG 4U + 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level
- Some programs will have other pre-requisites such as Math, specific Science courses etc.
- Make sure you do your research. Not every university has the same requirements for similar or same programs.
- Students apply to Ontario Universities in November

# Secondary Diploma Requirements

- 30 credits:
  - ▶ 18 compulsory courses
  - ▶ 12 elective courses(two mandatory e-Learning courses unless you OPT out)
- 40 hours community involvement
- Successful completion of the Grade 10 Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

\* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

\*\* In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

\*\*\* A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

† The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

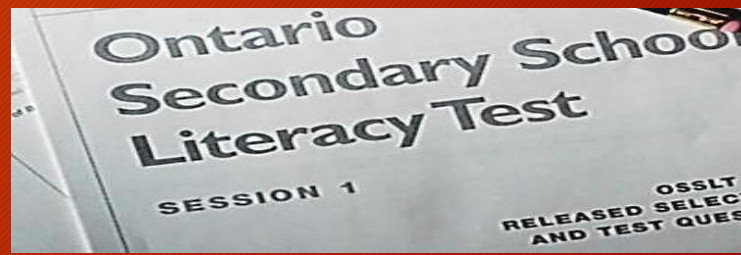

# Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

- Written in Grade 10
  - ▶ Based on expectations up to and including Grade 9
- If a student is unable to meet standards in first attempt, they will:
  - ▶ take the test again in Grade 11, or
  - ▶ may be directed to complete the Ontario Literacy Course in Grade 12 (OLC4O)

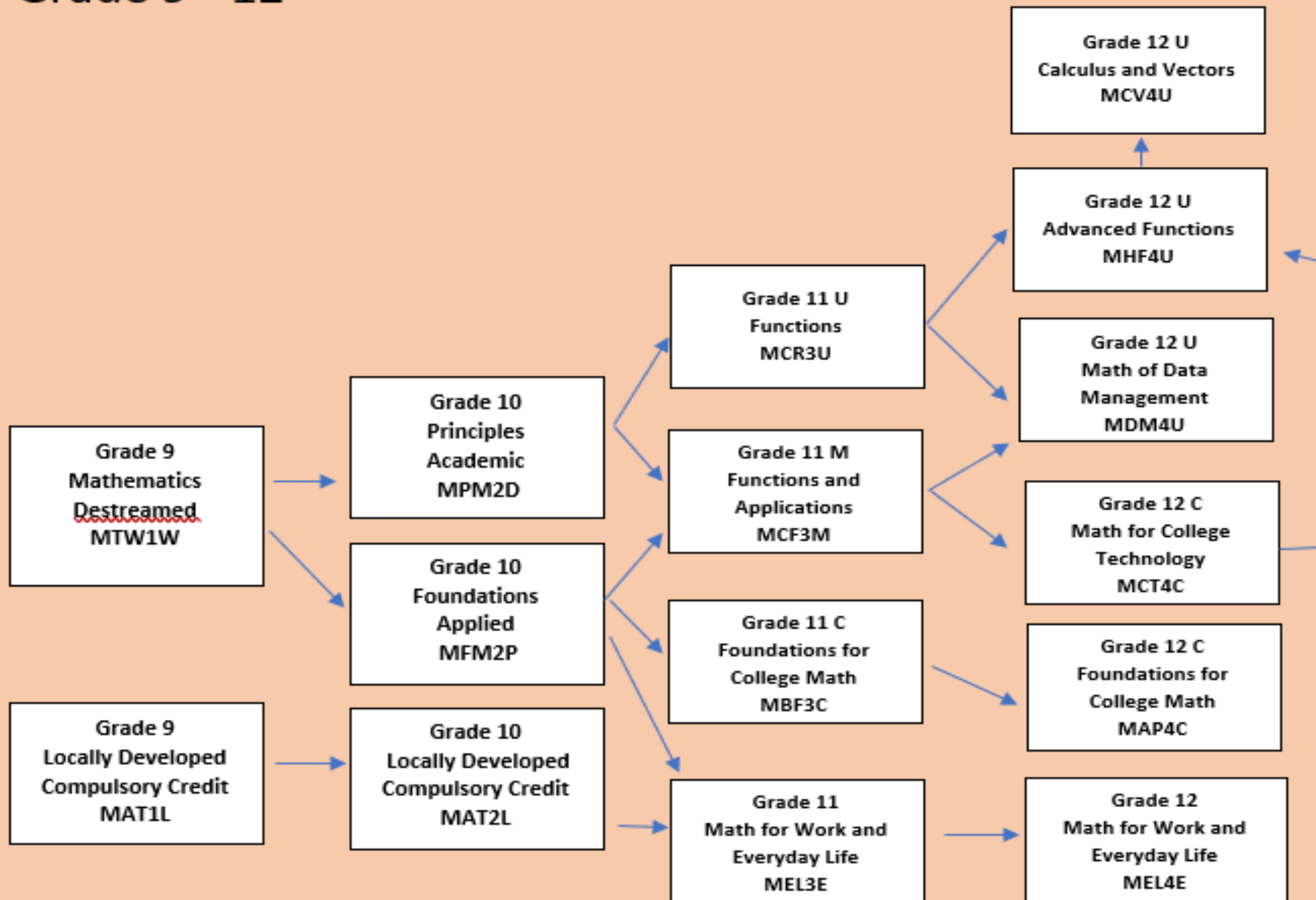

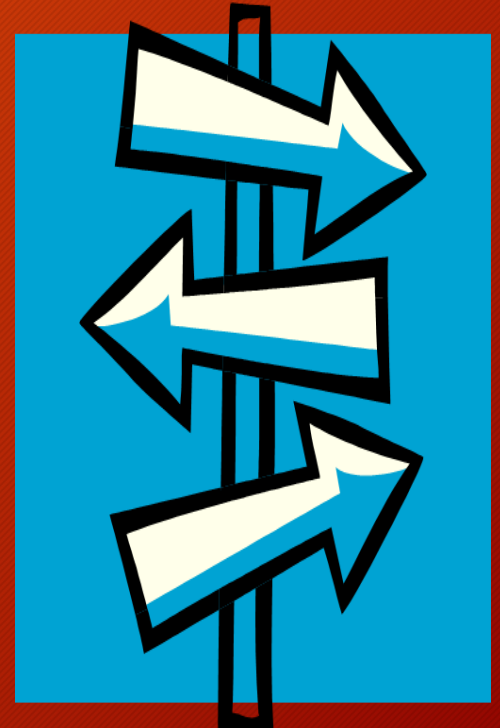

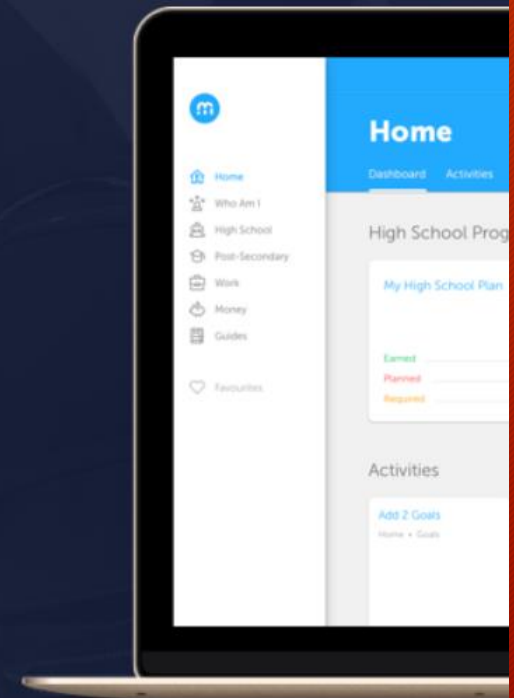
