SHSM Programs

- SHSM - Construction, Health and Wellness, Art and Business - apply on myBlueprint, and fill in a form found outside of Student Services or on the school website
- Each SHSM program offers students a bundle of 8 - 10 credits (including a two-credit coop). These courses are regular Ontario secondary school courses that allow students to work towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma but have been bundled as the most relevant courses to prepare students for a future in the selected sector.
- Students also get the opportunity to participate in a variety of workshops and certifications.
- You must sign up for a 2-credit co-op in grade 11 or 12 to obtain the SHSM certificate. Co-op occurs in various community placements (contact Mrs. Jurinic, Ms. Martin or Mr. Spadafora). An application is required

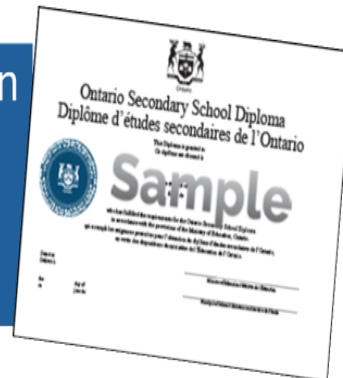

OYAP-FAST Apprenticeship Program

- ✓ Are you a hands-on learner who wants to get a head start on a great paying career in the skilled trades?
- ✓ Would you like to work towards becoming an apprentice while earning your high school diploma?

Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training (FAST) is a specialized program that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional Co-op credits, while completing their OSSD.

Students who meet the completion requirements, and all other OSSD requirements, will be awarded the OYAP-FAST seal on their diploma.

COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- All Gr. 11 & 12 high school grades are sent to colleges (full disclosure)
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12) ENG4C is usually required for most programs
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses - English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required.
- www.ontariocolleges.ca
- Some programs are highly competitive, so apply right away before the deadline
- Colleges also offer Applied Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course (Required marks usually lower than University)

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- Universities may consider both Grade 11 and 12 U and M courses for early admission
- Almost every university program requires ENG 4U + 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level
- Some programs will have other pre-requisites such as Math, specific Science courses etc.
- Make sure you do your research. Not every university has the same requirements for similar or same programs.
- Students apply to Ontario Universities in November

Making Course Level Choices

- Carefully consider your teacher's recommendations
- Consider your learning skills (initiative, homework completion, problem solving, independent work etc.)
- Carefully consider your interests and possible career goals
- Be aware of prerequisites required in grade 12 and choose appropriate courses for grade 11

Secondary Diploma Requirements

- 30 credits:
 - ▶ 17 compulsory courses
 - ▶ 13 elective courses

(two mandatory e-Learning courses unless you OPT out)

Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from the following group:

- business studies
- computer studies
- cooperative education
- mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- technological education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

- 40 hours community involvement
- Successful completion of the Grade 10 Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

- Make sure that your hours are true community service hours.
- Hours must be documented using the form available in Student Services or on-line on our website under Student Services - Forms
- Ideally you should try to complete a minimum of 10 hours per year.

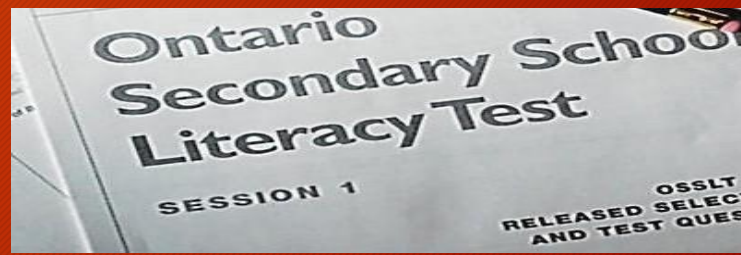

Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

- Written in Grade 10
 - ▶ Based on expectations up to and including Grade 9
- If a student is unable to meet standards in first attempt, they will:
 - ▶ take the test again in Grade 11, or
 - ▶ may be directed to complete the Ontario Literacy Course in Grade 12 (OLC40)

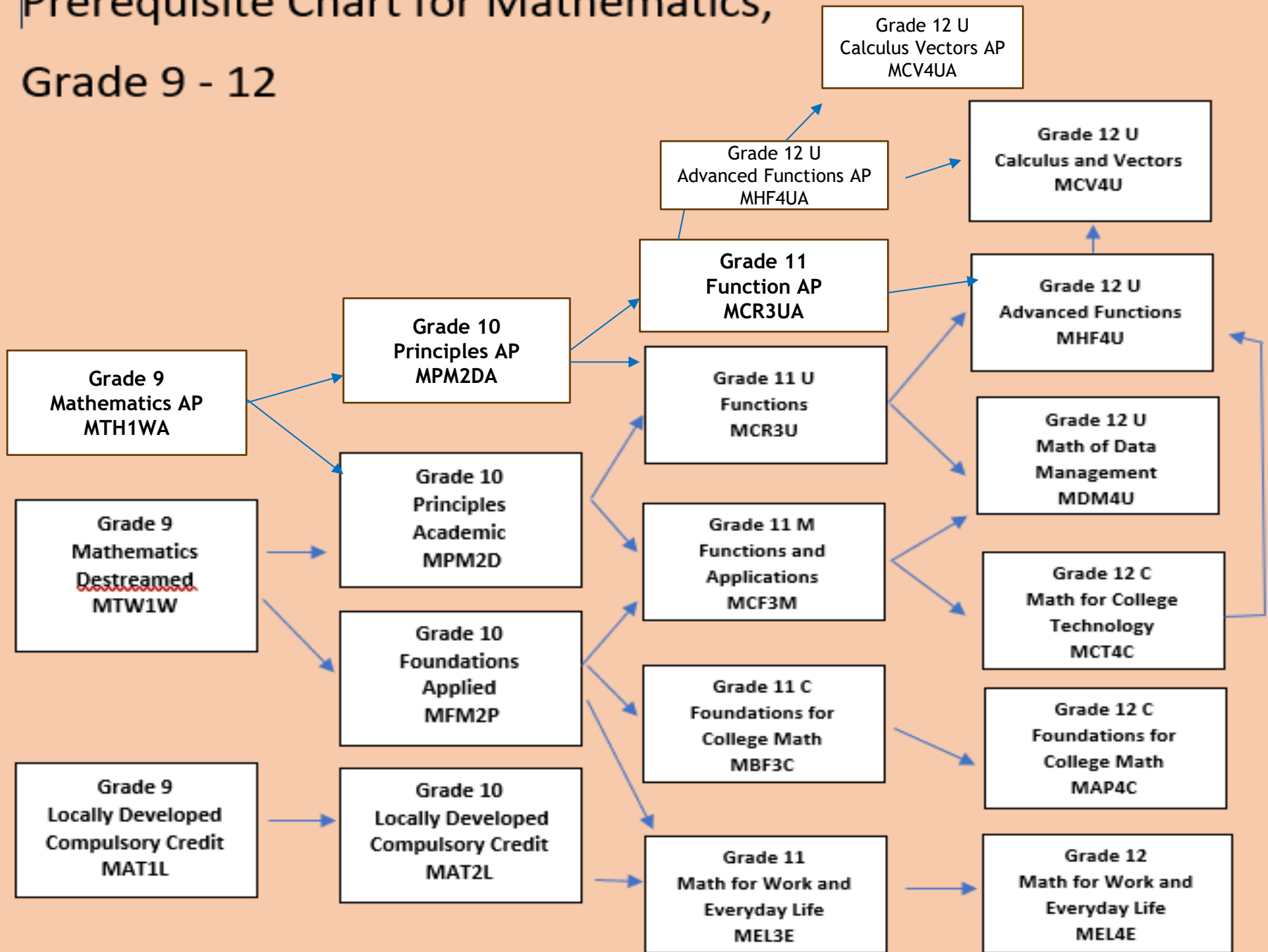

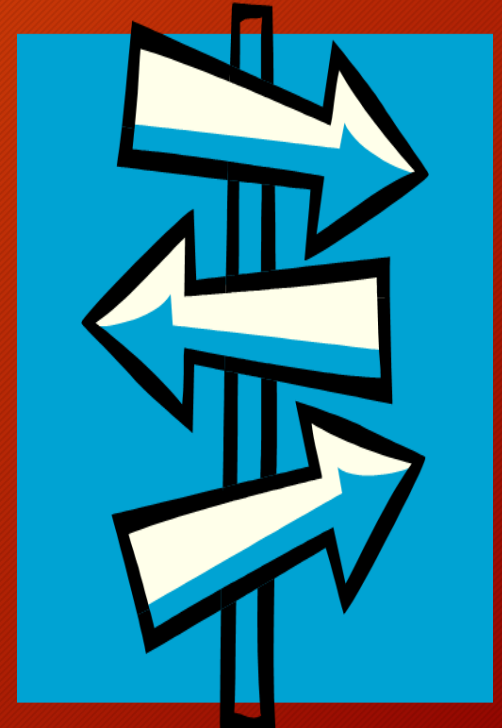

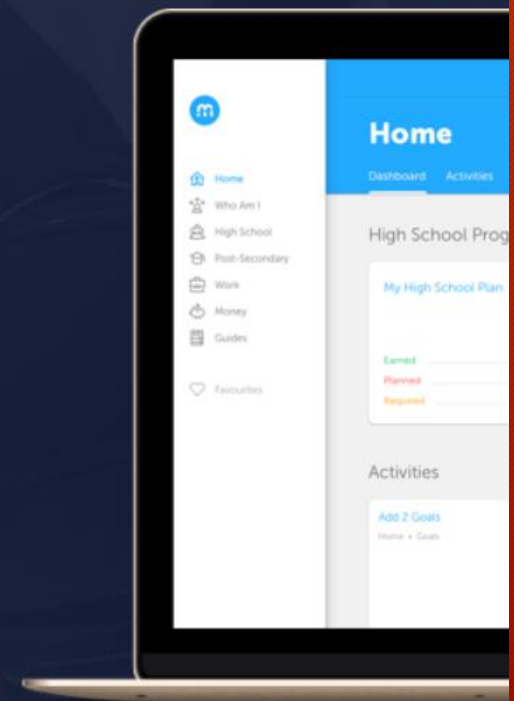
