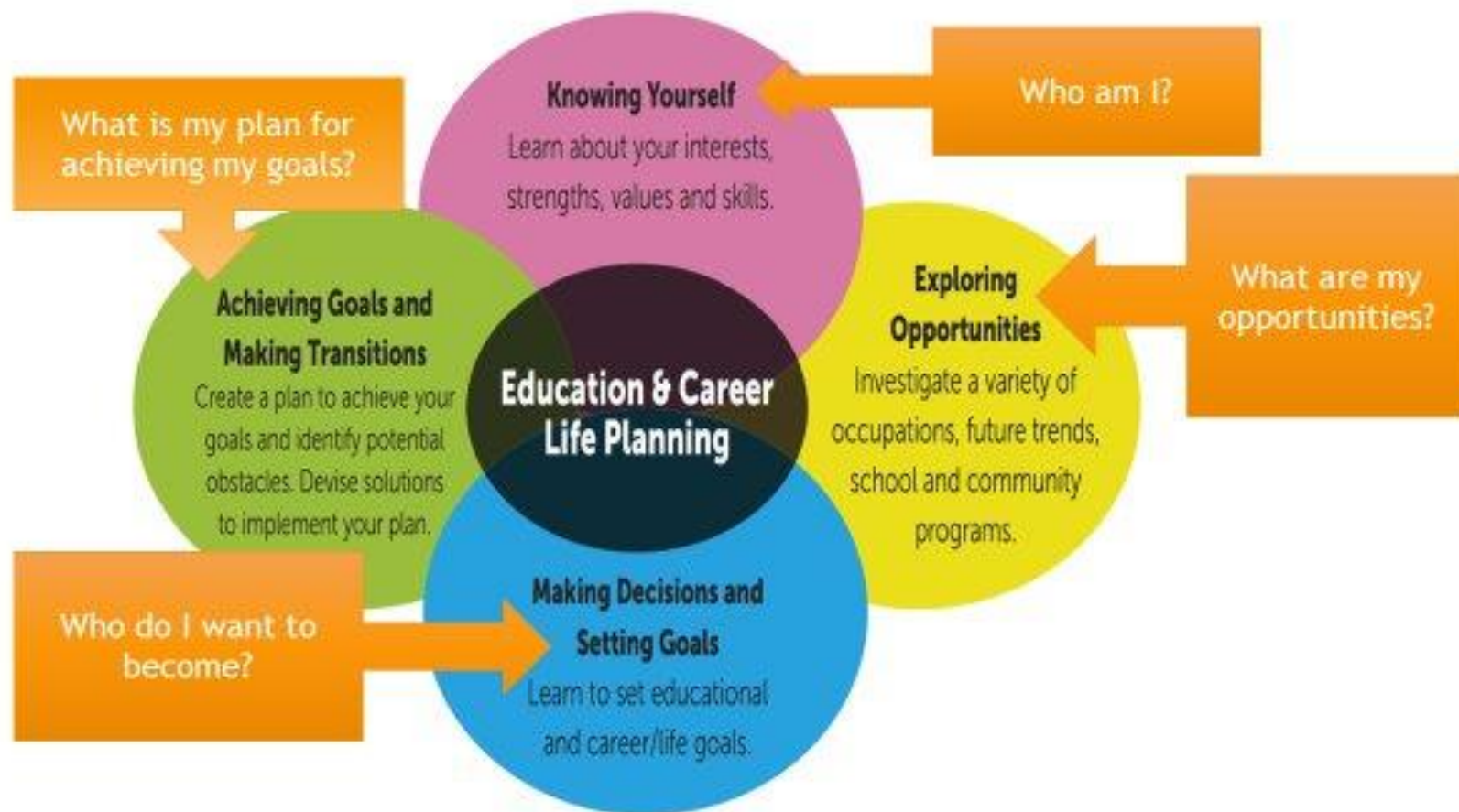

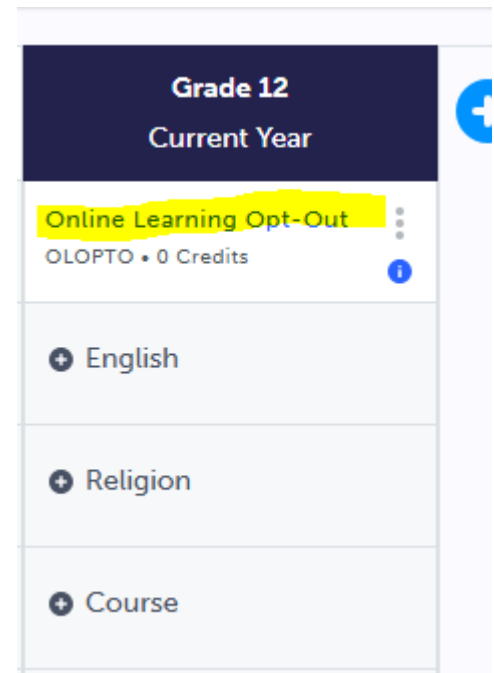


E-Learn Requirement

- You require TWO eLearning credits; unless you opt out of the e-learning requirement to graduate.
- Students who have not opted out will see an option to do so in your high school planner. Under the grade 12 column you will see the option to add “Online Learning Opt-Out”

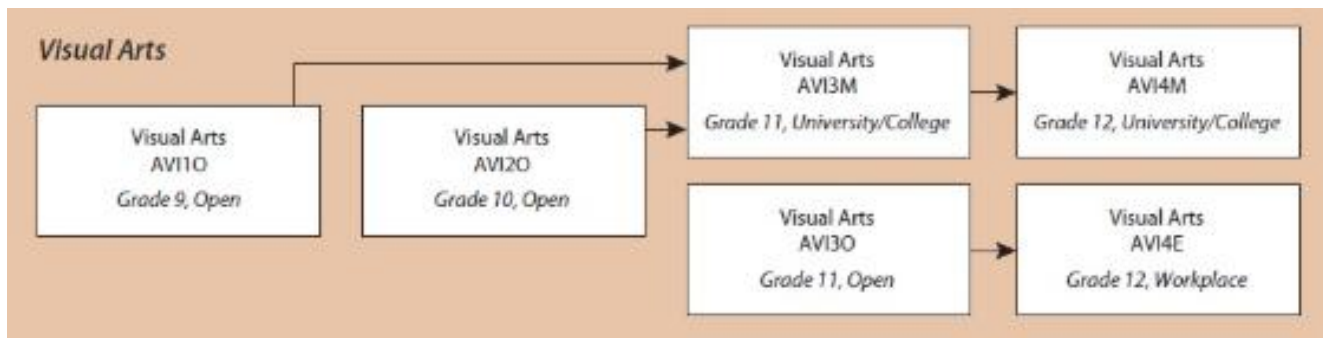
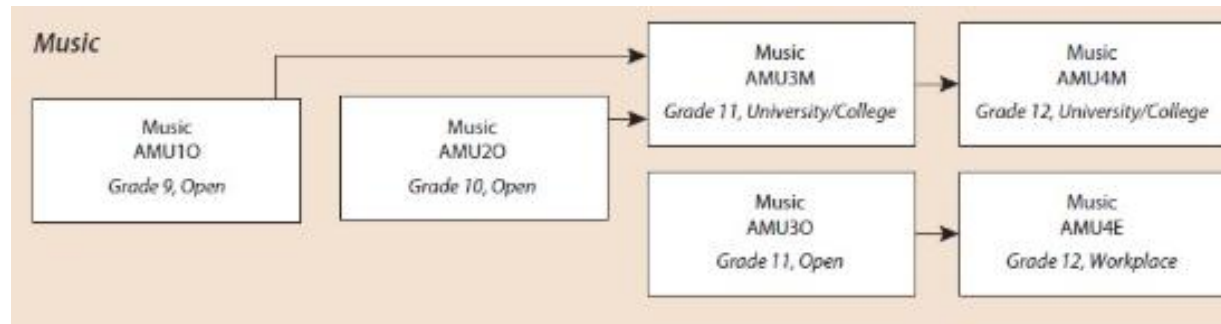
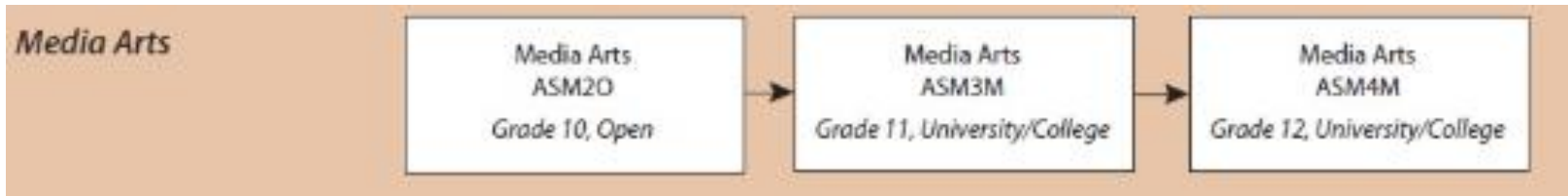
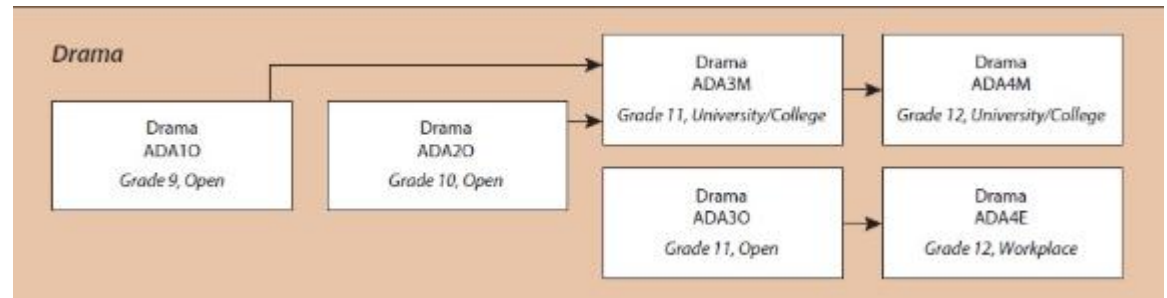
GRADE 12 WORKLOAD SENARIOS

- Grade 12 students must have a minimum of 6 courses at Corpus Christi (includes e-learning), up to 8 courses (or more with night school).
- Grade 12's who finish grade 11 with at least 24 credits could have 1 - 2 spares.
- Grade 12 students need to weigh out the pros and cons to taking a spare or e-learning class.
- For example, if you have a spare will you use this time wisely? Or will I work on my e-learning class when given time during the school day?
- Do you want a 7'th grade 12 U/M level credit?

What do you need to graduate?

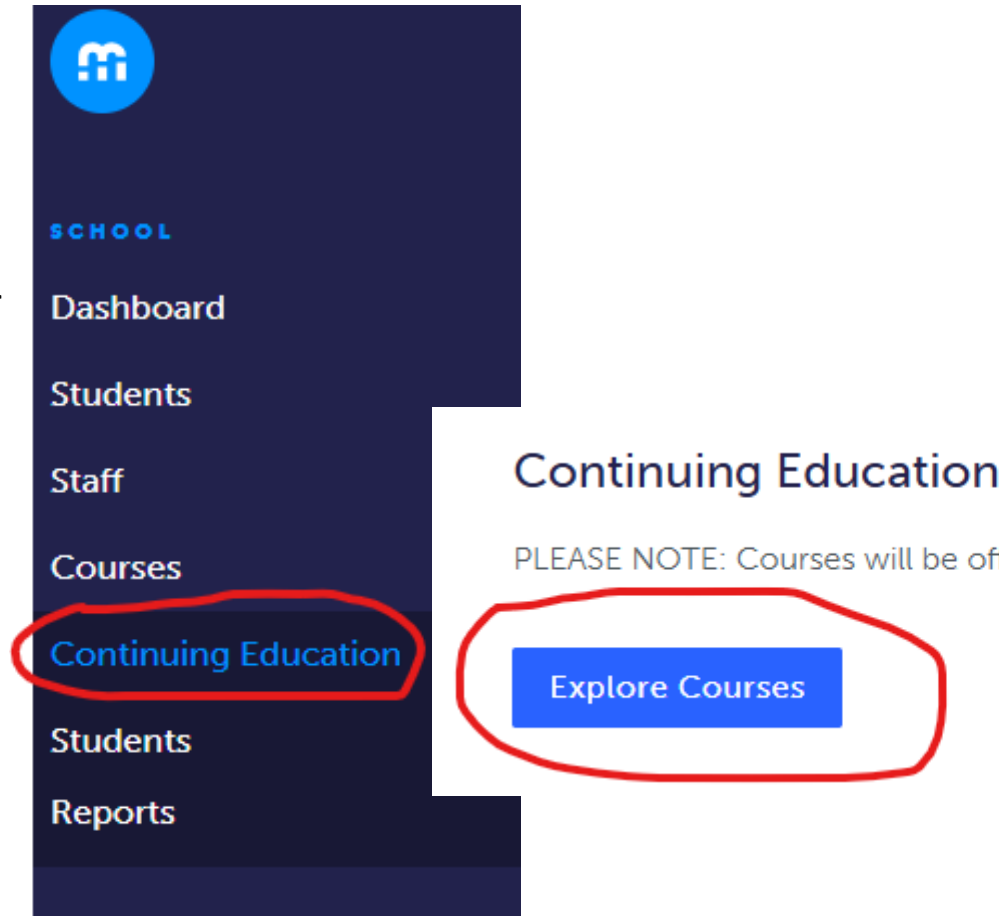
- In order to obtain your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (**O.S.S.D**) you need:
- **18 Compulsory Credits:**
- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (1 credit at the senior level)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in Canadian History
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics

What do you need to graduate?

- **PLUS, one credit from each of the following groups:**
- **Group 1:** Additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance & Career Education or Coop*
- **Group 2:** Additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business Studies, or French as a second language or Coop*
- **Group 3:** Additional credit in senior level science, or Technological education, or French as a second language or computer studies or Coop*

Summer School (July 6 – July 31)

- 4 week courses are offered:
- For repeating a failed course
- For earning a reach ahead course
- Upgrade courses also available for HCDSB students who have achieved at least a 50% in a particular course.
- Registration will take place through MyBlueprint in April 2026. Listen to announcements for details, check the school website and the school twitter.



Summer School (continued):

If you plan on taking a course in summer school, you do not need to select it in MyBlueprint (except for Religion/Social Justice).

Once you are registered for summer school (April), and you selected religion/social justice, we will replace the religion/social justice with one of your alternates. You can add a note under “Add Comments” when submitting your course selection about which course you would prefer to replace it with.

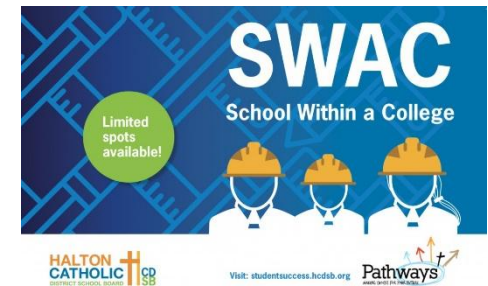

- Awareness Campaign from the Ontario Government to try and address a shortage of highly skilled technical people.

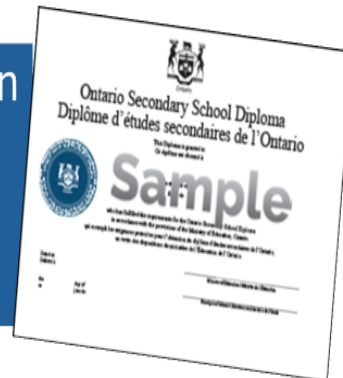


OYAP-FAST Apprenticeship Program

Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training (FAST) is a specialized program that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional Co-op credits, while completing their OSSD.

Students who meet the completion requirements, and all other OSSD requirements, will be awarded the OYAP-FAST seal on their diploma.

Prior Learning Assessment Recognition

- Are you in grade 10 – 12?
- Have you acquired knowledge and skills outside of school that could "challenge" for credit?

You may be eligible to “challenge” a specific course for credit if you can provide enough evidence that you have met the provincial course expectations (equal to 110 hours, and meeting all Overall Expectations of the course)

Thinking about Returning?

- Online application are usually available in late February or March. You are not automatically approved.
- Students must have an academic plan to return. You will have a meeting with the principal to review your options.
- There is a 34 credit threshold limit, therefore you need to make sure you only have 31 credits upon graduation so that you can be enrolled in 3 courses if accepted for another semester.
- If you repeat a course, that you have already passed this is included in the 34 credit threshold (i.e. a student who takes MHF4U gets 60%, then takes it again and gets 75%) this is counted as two credits for the threshold but not counted twice for graduation requirements.
- You may enrol in Adult Education to obtain more credits through Thomas Merton if you will reach the 34 credit threshold.

COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- **All Gr. 11 & 12** high school grades are sent to colleges.
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12).
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses – English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required.

- Some programs are highly competitive.
- Colleges also offer University Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course (Required marks usually lower than University)

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- Universities may consider both Grade 11 and 12 U and M courses for admission
- Programs require ENG 4U plus 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level
- Some programs will have other pre-requisites (i.e. math, science, etc.)
- Some programs require additional things as well as marks. For example; you may be asked to include one or some of the following; a separate supplementary application, student profile, portfolios, auditions etc.
- Each university could be different even with the same program

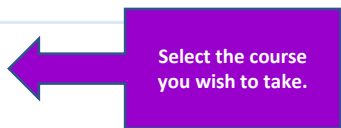

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using academic language coherently and confidently, selecting the reading strategies best suited to particular texts and particular purposes for reading, and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace. Students considering moving from one destination to another (e.g., college to university; workplace to college) must successfully complete a transfer course.

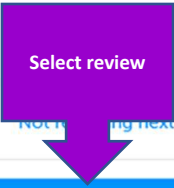
