Zangilli led discussion about the following:         <ul> <li>OAPCE – Virtual Summit – Saturday May 8, 2020 – the poster and link to register was shared with council members</li> <li>Gently Used Uniform Sale – Due to the closure, Council will await direction from the Board/Public Health with regards to requesting and taking in used uniforms, access to the building to organize items, and whether the annual sale can occur in June and/or August.</li> <li>New Business: Used Uniform Funds - allocation of funds that was previously agreed upon; council unanimously agreed to continue to support these areas when school reopens.</li> <li>Next Meeting: Council agreed to meet again on June 2, 2020</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	L. Triantafillou shared the email and link with council members for the OAPCE Virtual Summit L. Triantafillou to inquire about if/when used uniforms may be dropped off; inquire about potential sale date
Principal's Report:	<ul> <li>L. Triantafillou provided the following Update:</li> <li>On Sunday the Minister of Education announced an extension to the current school closure two at least may 31st 2020.</li> <li>Students in grade 12 will receive midterm marks for the courses they are currently taking, grade 10 students currently registered in civics and careers classes will receive their final mark for their term one class which was last week comma and for their term two class which ends in late June.</li> <li>All students will receive a final report card grades nine through 12. As has been directed from the ministry final marks will include work done prior to the school closure period up to March 13th and any work done after well informed the students final mark.</li> <li>Teachers will continue to provide delivery of curriculum through the distance learning model that's been established.</li> <li>We will await further direction from the ministry as the closure.</li> <li>Communication to parents from the Board - the most recent communication was a document that was sent last week and it was a guide for parents to support their children in a distance learning setting</li> <li>The Board has assisted in helping us to provide access for students who don't otherwise have access to either a laptop or to digital devices due to a number of reasons.</li> <li>Administrators and board staff are continuing to support teachers in their learning and in their professional development with regards to distance learning platforms.</li> <li>Teachers and administrators continue to support students in their learning and encourage students to access the online learning courses engage with staff and students, and submit assignments in a timely manner</li> <li>For many of us particularly our students, this is all new territory and we will continue to exercise patience with ourselves with each other and in particular with our students as we continue through this model .</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>All overnight trips that were planned to take place to Washington and New York City have been cancelled</li> <li>Any other field trips that we had scheduled were also cancelled</li> <li>Athletics has been canceled for the remainder of the year</li> <li>Our Graduation Gala that was scheduled for May 22nd has also been cancelled</li> <li>Our Commencement ceremony that was scheduled to take place at the end of June has been postponed indefinitely , rescheduling this event will be undertaken once we have a better idea as to whether large gatherings can take place and what the parameters look like around large gatherings</li> <li>Rescheduling this event will be done as per the recommendations from public health and our school board.</li> <li>Graduation awards specifically the ones that school council sponsors , will continue to be awarded at the commencement ceremony when we're able to have it.</li> </ul>
