Principals Report (L. Triantafillou)

Achieving

- Students are adapting well to Health and Safety measures and a more normalized routine.
- Staff has been stepping up to get extracurricular activities up and running, both in person and virtual.
- Daily screening was in place for 2 weeks as per health guidance, but expectation now is that students and staff will complete daily on their own at home.
- Students are permitted to enter early, at 8:05am, working to avoid congregating.
- 150 min instructional time is long but breaks are happening including outdoor masks breaks to support student well-being.
- EQAO math assessments will be done online this year.
- OSSLT requirement is waived for this year's grads but will return next year.

Believing

- Opening school liturgy was virtual, which will continue for now until we can safely manage large numbers in the gym (1565 students registered this year, 102 are remote and the rest in person).
- In person contact with parish priests is returning with a staff mass planned with Fr. Dave on Friday Oct.
 8 (PA Day).
- Truth and reconciliation activities took place last week to raise awareness. Special thanks to Ms. Montgomery, Mrs. Lozowsky and Ms. Benati for organizing the activities.
- Many students have been dropping by to visit/pray in chapel.
- Partnering with *Live Different* youth organization and will be working with mentors to train them in a Circles program to support positive attitudes and a healthy sense of self. School wide assembly planned for March.
- Mentor Focus this year is Resilience, Empathy, Priorities, Values and Growth

Belonging

- The Board has created a Mental Health Literacy in Action program.

- Sept 29 was Jags Spirit Day, T-shirts purchased by school and distributed to students.
- Extracurriculars, Mental Health Team, Student Council, Rainbow Jags GSA Club and more all up and running.
- \$4000-5000 in grant (PC Charities) money was set aside for snacks bins. Bins are in place for each classroom full of healthy snacks (apple sauce, granola bars). Looking at options to fund continually –no child will go hungry at CtK!
- Gr 8 info events for parents and students being planned.
- Fall Awards Night (virtual) being planned for next month to recognize honour roll students from last year and special awards. Additional celebration for special awards possible Stay tuned

Recent messaging home: There have been some challenges with student behavior during lunch – very small group of students – see email sent to parents for details and recommendations on speaking to children. Improvement already seen since note went home.

Update from M. Lozowsky – Grade 9s will take part in retreats, meeting 4 times over the next 2 quads (activities such as nature walks and faith and community days).
