# CREDITS

## **Course Package**

EachEach SHSM program offers students a bundle of 8 -10 credits. These courses are regular Ontario secondary school courses that allow students to work towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma, but have been bundled as the most relevant courses to prepare students for a future in the Health & Wellness sector.
