MYBLUEPRINT EXIT SURVEY (AVAILABLE IN DECEMBER)

- **Log on to myBlueprint with your email from last year** (unless you have already changed it - can update in your settings after logged in).

Will prompt you to start your Exit Survey (under 5 minutes to complete)

- **Complete your Exit Survey - Due with Graduation Package Deadline!**

Deadline: January 22nd, 2020

- Listen to announcements / Grad Channel for more details / info

COMPLETE YOUR GR. 12 EXIT PLANS WITH YOUR COUNSELOR!

- **Book your appointment** -Come to Guidance Office on your lunch, before/after school to book your appointment time.
- **Meet with your counselor to complete your exit plan;**
 - OSSD requirements - 30 Credits (18 Compulsory and 12 Elective)
 - Community Hours - Completed? Plan?
 - Literacy Test - Completed? Enrolled in OLC401?
 - Plans for September 2020 - College, University, Apprenticeship, Work, Thomas Merton, OYAP, Other... (**Plan A, Plan B...Plan C**)
 - Look at programs, requirements, additional requirements, websites.
 - Review your courses after reporting periods (% , U/M's, and C courses).

See you counselor if you need help/pathway changes/support!

CONCENTRATED ONTARIO YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP (OYAP)

- Students will take a number of courses in a specialized area and complete a 2 credit co-op course. Participants will learn from a certified person for a specific number of hours.
- A typical apprentice completes their high school diploma, gets signed on as an apprentice, and goes to college to complete Levels 1, 2 and possibly 3 of their apprenticeship training. They will then need to complete between 6,000 – 10,000 hours working with a qualified person. This could cost several thousand dollars. However, students who participate in the Concentrated OYAP programs can access the same learning and training opportunities for a fraction of the cost (\$250), and in a shorter time period!
- OYAP students will often have the opportunity to complete Part 1 of their training and use the hours towards their apprenticeship.

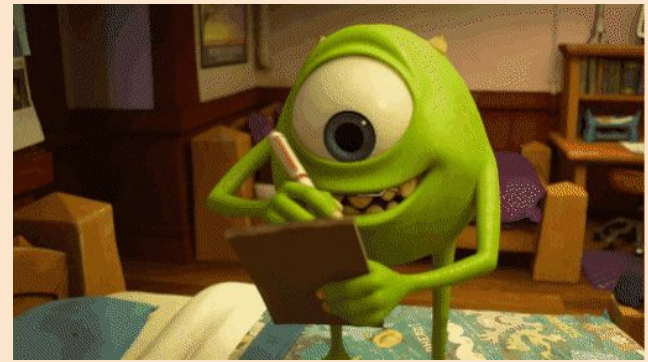

INFORMATION BEFORE YOU APPLY:

- The application processing fee is \$95.00 (non-refundable).
- An application allows you up to 5 program choices (no more than 3 at any one college).
- All program choices must start within the same academic year (August-July).
- There may be additional fees to request transcripts.
- Your username is permanent.
- Your password must be between 8 and 14 characters in length.
- Use a valid email address.
- DO NOT create more than one account.
- The application works best in: - Internet Explorer 9,10, 11, Firefox latest version, Chrome latest version, Safari 7 + & IOS 7+

HOW TO APPLY:

- Log in to your account.
- Fill in your personal information and educational history.
- Add your program choices.
- Pay the application processing fee
- Log back in to verify your transcript information, or to **make changes or updates to your application**. (Changing your program choices after February 1 may affect your chances of receiving an offer, as applications will be considered first-come, first-served.)
- Log back in after February 1 to view and **confirm offers of admission**.



IMPORTANT DATES:

- October: Applications become available for programs starting the following fall.
- February 1: Equal Consideration Date – apply to highly competitive programs on or before this date.
- February 1: Colleges may begin sending offers of admission after this date.
- May 1: Deadline to confirm offers (colleges may extend offers after this date).
- Mid-June: Tuition deposit payment due. Each college sets their own deadline.

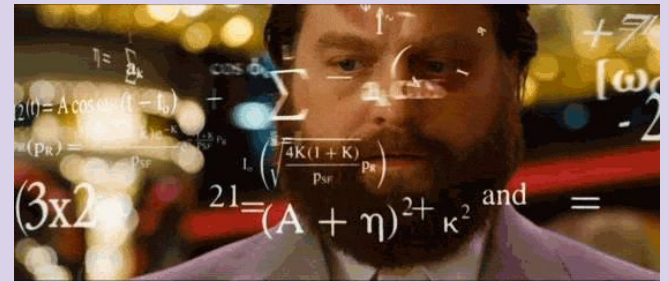

ONTARIO UNIVERSITY INFORMATION (OUAC)

The 101 Application:

- You are taking courses during the day at an Ontario high school (this includes students returning for second semester and graduated students returning to upgrade 1 or more courses).
- You have not, at some point, been out of high school for more than 7 consecutive months.
- You will have received or expect to receive your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) with **six 4U/M courses** at the end of the current year.
- You have not attended a postsecondary institution (college/university/career college).
- You are applying to the first year of an undergraduate degree program or diploma program at an Ontario university.
- You are under 21 years of age.

INFORMATION / SUMMARY OF FEES



- You will receive your **Application Access Code Letter** from your Counselor TODAY! This letter contains the access codes you need to begin the application.
- Your access codes should not be shared with anyone!
- The OUAC cannot provide access codes over the telephone or email.
- Deadline = Completed applications to the OUAC are due JAN. 16, 2019 BEFORE MIDNIGHT!

Fees: Basic Application Fee: \$150 = 3 University / Program Choices

Additional Choice Fee: \$50 / Choice

*** You will be charged a fee of \$50 if you submit, pay and THEN change your choices. ***

Note: You may apply to as many Universities / programs as you wish - HOWEVER - you can only apply to a MAX of 3 programs PER UNIVERSITY (including affiliates)

RESEARCH & GATHER IMPORTANT INFO:



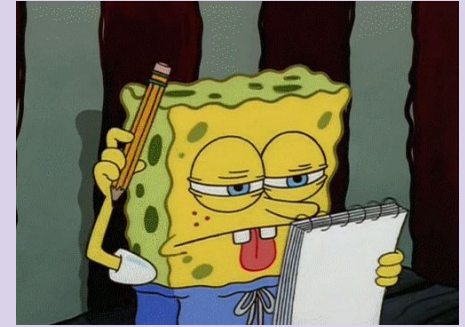
- Check out University publications / websites
- Visit Open Houses
- Take school tours
- Visit e-INFO and the 101 Application to browse programs online.
 - Record your program choices and their OUAC codes.
 - Be sure you are aware of Admission Requirements and program specific deadlines.
- Review the 101 Application Guide
- Grade 12 Exit Plans with Guidance Counsellors (in process)
- Narrow down selections by talking to your support team (family, counsellor) - Remember - everyone is on their OWN PATH!

HOW TO APPLY:



- Use the information in your **Access Code Letter** to log in to your online application. NOTE: The **FIRST** time you log in, you must change your temporary PIN to a personal password. Use your password (instead of your PIN) the next time you log on.
- Complete **ALL** the sections of the application.
- Review your program selections before clicking “**I Verify and Agree**”
- Submit your application, with payment, well before the 101 Application Deadline and any University Program specific deadlines.
- Record the **OUAC Reference Number** you receive and keep it in a safe place. You will need this number for future access.

IMPORTANT DATES!!



- November 2019 - PINS are given to students
 - Make an appt with your counselor if you are unsure / overwhelmed with the process!
- January 15th, 2020 - DEADLINE to submit your completed application
 - The initial application includes all final grades from completed Grade 11 and 12 courses and a list of all current year courses in progress
- Feb. 28, 2020 - Semester 1 Mark Transmission
- May 5, 2020 - Semester 2 Mid Term Mark Transmission
- May 27, 2020 - the LATEST date applicants will hear from Universities
- June 1, 2020 - The deadline to accept offer / submit payment

AFTER APPLYING:

- After 1 business day, log in to your online app to verify the details. Review and make any necessary changes.
- Ensure spam filters are set to accept email from OUAC and the Universities you applied to. **E-MAIL is the PRIMARY mode of communication for both.**
- The Universities will acknowledge that they have received your application.
- After you receive your report card (Final – Semester 1, Mid-Term – Semester 2) Verify that your grades are accurate on the OUAC website.
- Expect to receive either an offer or refusal by the end of May.
