

- ★ Make sure you choose TWO alternates
- ★ If you are planning on taking a REACH AHEAD course in Summer School you may select a another elective
 - Make sure you bring your Sign Off Sheet Signed ASAP reach ahead courses fill up fast!
- ★ If you are planning on changing levels, make sure you have proper pre-requisite (read carefully!)
 - If you don't have the right pre-requisite, the course will be highlighted in RED - choose the right course!!!



- You need to take a minimum of TWO Pre-AP courses to remain in the program
- You you are thinking of dropping one OR adding one, you need to apply through Student Services
- If you no longer wish to be part of the Pre-AP program, please come and see us in Student Services
 - If you are no longer taking two or more Pre-AP courses and live OUTSIDE the HT boundary, you will have to return to your home school.

- Course Listings come out in April
- Sign up through myBlueprint → Continuing Education
 - Print off Sign off sheet, get signatures, hand it in to Student Services!
- Listen to announcements for details, and check the school website; Students → Academic Information → Summer and Night School


