4. Some big initiatives (grad, play, prom, sports, relay)

- Alanna Smith is our Drama Teacher, Director of Trinity Live Arts We have been working on our mainstage performance that will start tomorrow, Wednesday April 6. We present the musical *"You Are a Good Man Charlie Brown"*. Our last mainstage was March of 2020. We are thrilled to be back, students are excited, learning their material. The show will be on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday with the doors opening at 6:30 pm, starting promptly at 7:00 pm. It will run for 90 minutes and the tickets are on sale through SchoolCash online. A school messenger e-mail was sent to parents with this information. Danielle Dinno is in the play and thanked Ms. Smith who is a fantastic Director. Teresa also thanked Ms. Smith for everything she has done for our students.
- **Tim Henry** (CYC) is involved with our Bereavement group and is our Child and Youth Counselor. Tim will give us an update for our Equity and Change Team.

Tim and Teresa Tomaro took students to StFX school in Milton to meet with their Representation Matters group to learn about their student equity group that has been running for a few years. The students shared ideas, learned about initiatives, and bonded over the shared passion of equity. It was great to see the leadership of StFX students. One of Holy Trinity's initiatives will focus on black excellence. It is important to recognize what black people are doing in Canada. This meeting also provided next steps that HT could take.

GSA club– Tim Henry and Ms. Smith are Teachers on this committee, and they are working on pronouns of our student body.

Teresa Castellarin will join the next meeting of the Equity and Change Team to discuss issues, learn the language, have a panel discussion, talk to racialized individuals. A few weeks ago, we hosted a meeting which included 5 equity champions from our board who responded to questions that were posed by our students regarding equity issues and initiatives within the board.

5. Student Update

We are excited with everything that is going on in the school.

• **Student Council** - we are planning a trivia night on April 21st, this will be our first in person event in 2 years. Teams of students will participate.

- **Sports** We had our first hockey buyout today. Our boys team won against Loyola. We had 360 students that came to the game who were very enthusiastic. Our girl's hockey team played very well but lost their game.
- Track and field, boy's baseball, senior soccer, junior soccer, junior hockey, softball, touch football staff members and community members are staffing these teams.
- **SAC** is planning on having a PINK game for the soccer team. It will probably be our Senior female soccer team. This will be held during the day and we also invited our elementary feeder schools to this event.
- Tomorrow Jr. girls volleyball game at StA buy out.
- **Robotics** our team came in 4th in the event. This Saturday and Sunday they are involved in another competition, the St. Mary's district event. They have qualified for the provincial championships which happens April 14, 15,16 and if they qualify, they will be going to the world competition in Texas.
- **Relay for Life** Our launch is tomorrow, students can sign up in teams of 6-10 and our goal this year is \$50,000. Today Teresa met with the Relay for Life students regarding fundraising, donations, and guest speaker.
- We are interviewing Mentors and Trailblazers, SHIELD.

Teresa thanked Andrew and Danielle for all their involvement at HT.

6. School Council Updates:

- MMOG has opened fully and 75% 80% have been wearing masks. St. Vincent de Paul is running again, Confirmations, record number of marriages. Youth band, ABLAZE, is still looking for students with a musical instrument background. Every second Sunday of the month at the 11:00 am mass students run the Liturgy readings, ushering, eucharistic ministry. Adoration chapel has been successful, we have this available 7 days a week from 7am to 7pm except during mass times. Students are welcome to come. Our parish is moving towards a digital platform. We hold a daily rosary at 7:30 am.
- **St. Joseph Ukrainian Catholic Church.** HT donated \$2000.00 to St. Joseph's for Humanitarian Aid for Ukraine. These funds were raised from our school's blue and yellow civvies day on March 8.

7. Vice-Principal's Insights

Introduction of our new Vice Principal

Vice Principal Lisa Vasile moved to CtK as Principal on April 1st. Introduction of our new Vice Principal Jenn Peer, we welcome her to Holy Trinity. She previously was at Thomas Merton for the last 7 years, supporting adult learners, working on pathway plans. She was a CWS Teachers before that. Jenn was introduced to our student body at the inperson assemblies.

OSSLT

April 19th over a series of 4 weeks. We have a bigger grade 10 cohort and will run 3 classes at a time, 2 days in a row. A scheduled will be coming out next week. Any grade 11 students that have failed in their first attempt will write it and any grade 12's that are not graduating.

AP Exams

Exams will be in person this year. Last year we had 17 students who achieved a 3.5 average. This year we have 58 exams being written. Courses that we run are based on enrollment and student interest. We have been approved for Capstone which is a research-based project affiliated with a University. We are in the planning process and it will be about 2 years.

Expectations/School 'Assembly'

We held our grade assemblies last week in person. General reminder for all grade's regarding behaviour expectations, goals for the school, building community, children of God, treat everyone with equity, dignity and respect. Review of proper use of social media and potential consequence. Words, intentions and actions that are to hurt, upset, embarrass, humiliate, leave out, exclude – simple expectation that you do not do it. We've had 3 school/grade assemblies: quads 1 & 2, and Sem II. Administration have spoken to students about our expectations. We also reviewed the attendance and late policy. Clarification: in-person students – if they are ill their parent must call in the absence to School Messenger because they are legally absent. The student can attend classes on-line if they wish.

Social Media

We made it very clear to our student body that if they record a fight there will be suspension consequences.

8. Teacher Update

Lindsay is our ELL Teacher. She is also involved with Graduation activities with Sandra Moretta. Prom committee met last week and will meet tomorrow.

Prom is June 24th at the Burlington convention center (\$90.00 per ticket) and our grade 12 students are looking forward to our events. Next steps, finalizing a theme where grade 12 students will be given an option to choose.

Graduation June 28th at 7:00 pm held in our gym with a live feed in the Theatre. We limit it to 2 tickets, with an opportunity for an extra ticket to be purchased.

Graduation photos started this week, a school messenger was sent to the grade 12 parents.

Grad Mass rehearsal and BBQ on June 8th. Our sunset event will also take place. Teresa shared the Grad website with parents. Please ensure your grade 12 students are sharing information with you.

We have an Instagram page for graduates.

We are hoping to host a used prom dress sale.

Grads can bring a non-HT student to Prom. Students will be informed of the process.

Covid Protocols

You have been receiving e-mails. No issues about whether someone is wearing a mask or choose not to. Things are quickly returning back to normal. All parents have been receiving emails from the Board regarding Covid protocols.

Activity Fee

Only 400 students have paid the activity fee this year. School generated funds (SGFs) are funds that are received, raised or collected in the name of our school or a school activity. Many of these funds are raised through the direct involvement of the Catholic School Council and our parent community. This fee assists in providing for your children at HT i.e. speakers, athletics, clubs, field trips/excursions, special events, the mural that is being painted in the religion hallway. Halton Initiative Meeting held at Holy Trinity on May 4th

Doors open at 6:00 pm and we have extended the invitation to our elementary feeder school students. There will be tables and booths in the Atrium (community partners, ROCK, Lighthouse).
