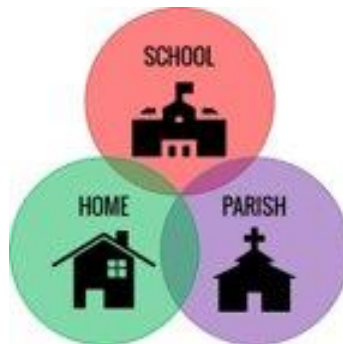

What is Advanced Placement?



- Advanced Placement (AP) is an internationally recognized program that allows students to enrich the Ontario Curriculum with the goal of achieving university accreditation while enrolled at Holy Trinity CSS.
- **AP** courses are offered in **grades 9 – 12**.
- **Grade 12**. Courses are audited by the AP College Board and include writing AP exams in May and June of that year.

What is Advanced Placement?



- Grade 9-12 enrichment courses
- Aim of courses: prepare students to successfully write standardized exams for potential first year university course credit
- For consideration in earning university credit students must achieve 3 or better out of 5 on an exam
- Overseen by the College Board, an internationally recognized U.S. non-profit membership association.

AP Courses

AP courses provide:

- topics and material studied in greater depth
- enriched learning opportunities
- thought-provoking discussion
- interaction with other motivated learners
- The focus is not to create more work, but a different kind of work that challenges a student's higher order thinking skills.
- AP courses offer university level content to students at the Grade 12 level.



What is AP Preparation?



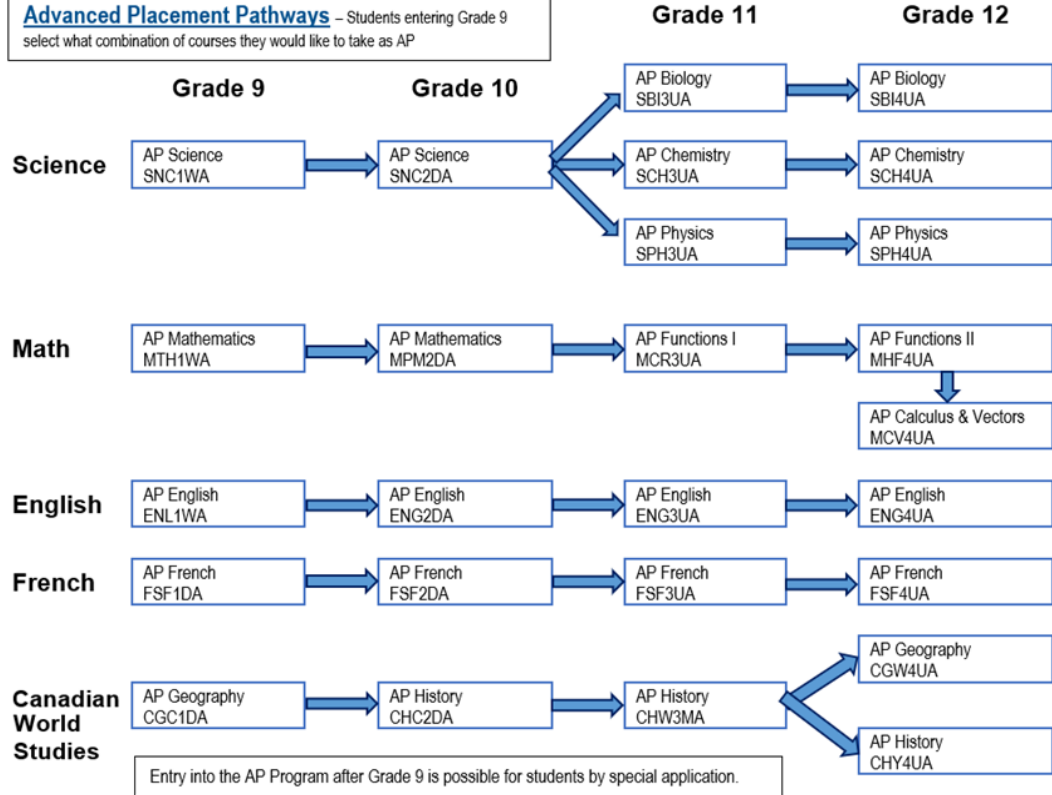
- AP Preparation (Pre-AP) courses are an advanced series of courses for students to help begin preparing for university.
- The Pre-AP Program begins in Grade 9 with classes in which students study both the Ontario Curriculum and the Advanced Placement Curriculum.
- They are designed to be a rigorous preparation for AP courses in grade 12. The courses are intended to be challenging, but the benefits to students are well worth it.
- The program offers students the flexibility to select the number of pre-AP and AP classes that best serve their academic needs.

Advanced Placement Pathways – Students entering Grade 9 select what combination of courses they would like to take as AP



Alignment of AP with the Ontario Curriculum



The AP curriculum and the Ontario secondary school curriculum overlap to a very large extent. Students in AP prep courses complete academic (9/10) or university (11/12) curriculum with appropriate extensions designed to prepare the student for writing the AP exams. Preparation for the exams is built into the program from Grade 9 through 12.

Assessment and Evaluation

- ✓ Students will be evaluated according to the Ministry's assessment and evaluation policy documents.
- ✓ Students will be evaluated on the appropriate grade level curriculum expectations.
- ✓ Teachers of AP preparation and AP courses attend additional AP training.
- ✓ The course mark as determined above, will be multiplied by 1.05 to determine the mark that will be reported on the Provincial Report Card.

- Students with a passion for learning
- Self-motivated learners with strong communication and analytical skills
- Passionate about learning
- Well organized with good time management skills
- High academic achiever

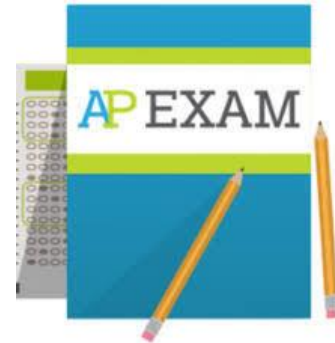

AP Exams and Scores

- Written in May at Holy Trinity.
- Distributed by the College Board and administered by the school.
- Each AP exam mark is a weighted combination of the student's scores on the multiple choice section 50% and the open response section 50%.
- The final mark is reported on a 5-point scale:

Grade	Meaning
5	Extremely well qualified
4	Well qualified
3	Qualified
2	Possibly qualified
1	No recommendation



- The submission of AP exam results is determined by the student.

Advanced Placement (AP) Credit Policies at Ontario Universities

Most universities have an AP credit policy that states:

- both the maximum number of university credits a student may earn through AP testing (often 2 – 3, but sometimes more)
- the minimum score required to earn a university credit (usually a 4 or a 5 out of 5).

November 8th - December 8th, 2023

(This is for students who are currently in grade 8 and will be entering grade 9 in September 2024).

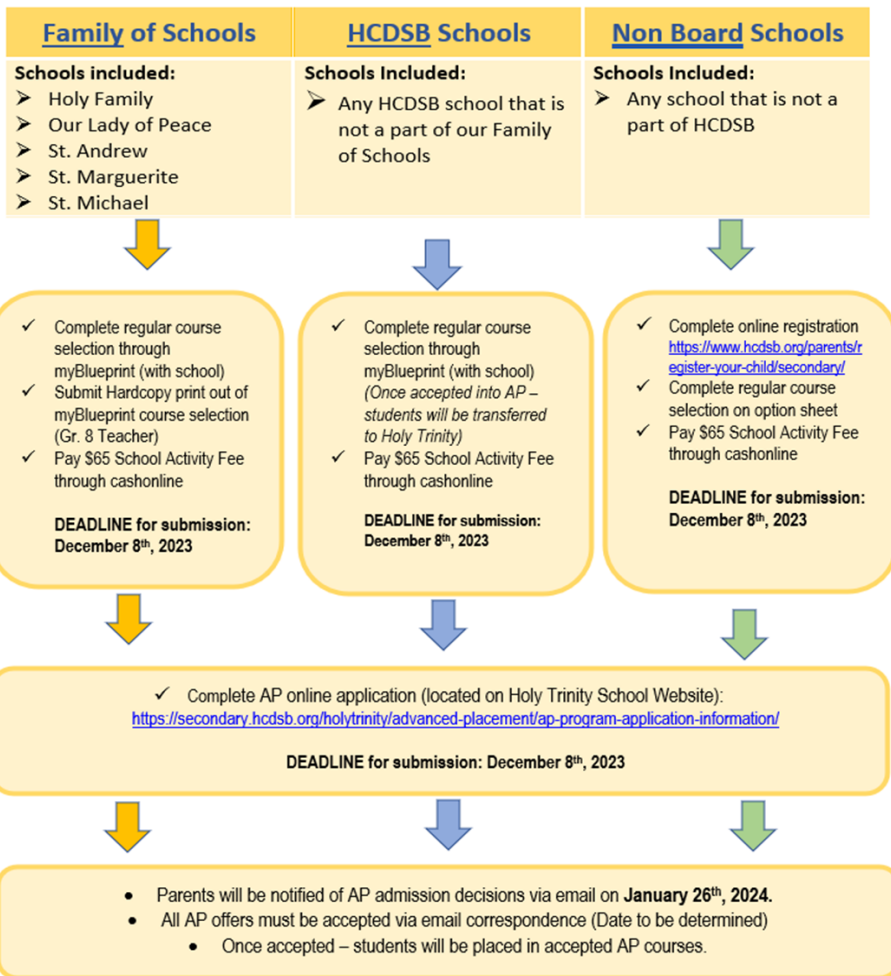
In order to complete the AP online application you will require:

- An active gmail account
- Your child's grade 7 final June report card scanned in a pdf file
(You will also need access to a copy of this June report card as you complete the application)

Admission Process and Required Documentation

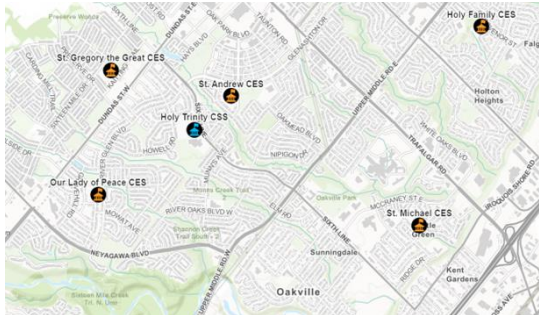
AP Application due date: December 8th, 2023

AP Admission is based on:

- Grade 7 June report card to be submitted with application.
- Evaluation of Learning Skills on Grade 7 June report card. These grades must be maintained in their Grade 8 year.
- Holy Trinity Registration Forms must be fully completed and submitted.
- Parents will be notified of admission decision via email on January 26th, 2024.

Cross Boundary

- Holy Trinity accepts cross-boundary students who are accepted and remain enrolled in the AP program
- Cross boundary students who withdraw from the AP program will be directed to their home school
- Cross boundary siblings of AP students cannot attend Holy Trinity unless also registered in the AP program.

Transportation

- The AP program is a specialized optional program.
- As per HCDSB Policy 1-04: Transportation is only provided for students living within the Holy Trinity boundaries who qualify for bussing according to board policies.
- As per HCDSB Policy 1-04: Cross Boundary students attending the AP program DO NOT require a cross boundary form.
- **Cross Boundary AP students are responsible for their own transportation.**
- Students in a specialized program who “OPT OUT” of the AP program will be required to return to their home school.

AP courses are recognized

- ✓ by 90% of post-secondary institutions in North America.
- ✓ by over 600 universities in over 55 countries around the world

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Are there any fees associated with the AP program?

There is no additional cost to parents other than the cost of writing the AP exam in grade 12.

2. How much homework can a student expect as part of the AP program?

The short answer is that there is generally the same amount of homework for students in AP Prep/AP as in an academic program.

3. Can I join the AP Program in grade 10?

There are limited spaces available in grade 10. Applicants will be assessed on an individual basis with feedback from their grade 9 teachers and report card.

4. Can I be a part of both the Extended French and AP Programs?

Yes, but students who chose Extended French, cannot select AP Geography and French as these courses are bundled in the Extended French Certificate Program.

Frequently Asked Questions

5. How do you decide how students are admitted to the AP program?

A committee reviews the applications and makes a determination. The decision is based on a combination of learning skills and level four marks. There is no entrance test for the AP program.

6. When is the deadline to submit applications?

The application for Grade 9 is due December 8, 2023

7. How many students do you let into the program in each grade?

We receive many applications for the AP program. Each application is reviewed independently. We accept all students who meet the application criteria
