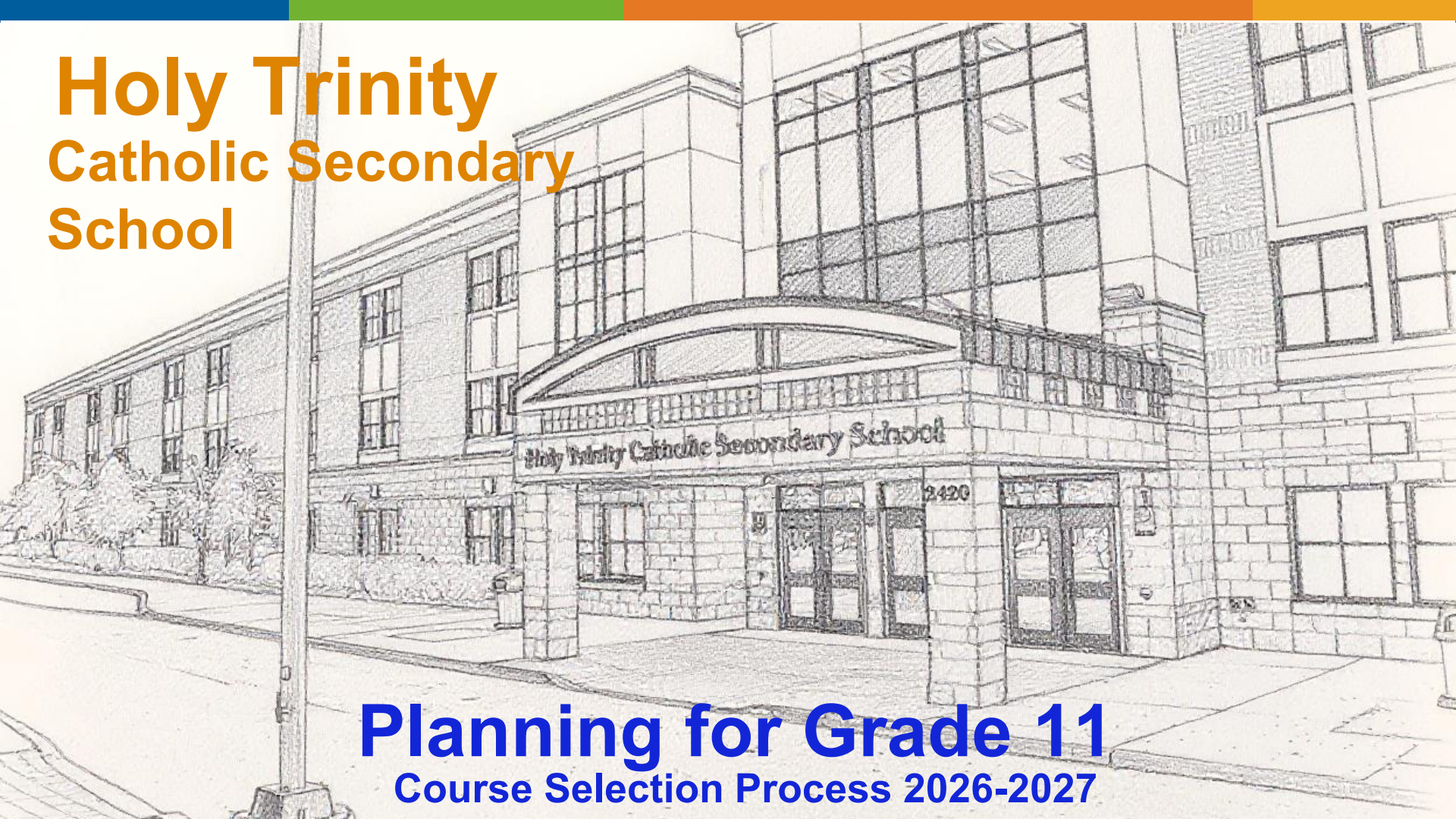
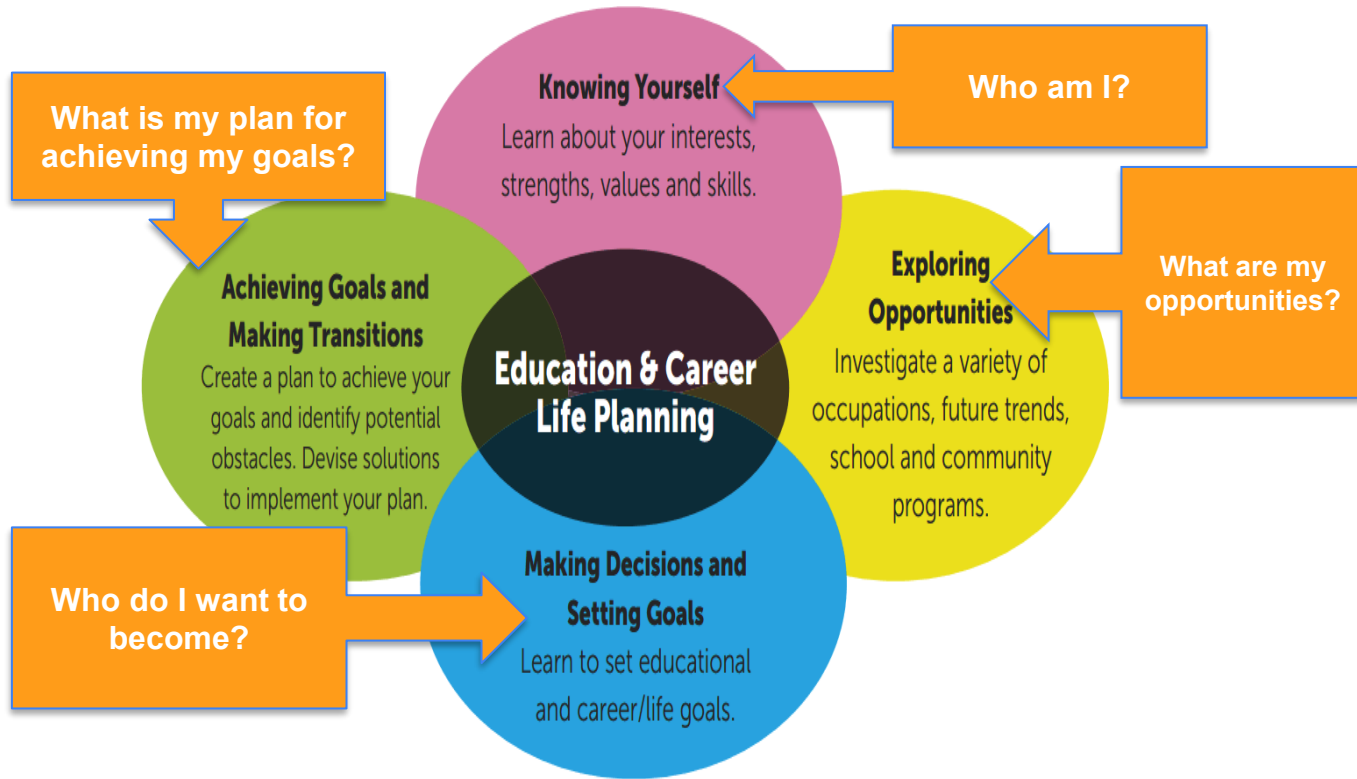

What do I need to Graduate?



Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) Requirements:

- ✓ **30 credits total** - 17 compulsory and 13 elective credits
- ✓ **40 hours of community involvement**
- ✓ **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)**
- ✓ **2 online learning credits** (or opt-out form)



Secondary Diploma Requirements

Compulsory Credits (17)

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
- 3 credits in mathematics (Grade 9, Grade 10 & Grade 11)
- 2 credits in science
- 1 credit in technological education (Grade 9 or Grade 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian history (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in the arts
- 1 credit in health and physical education
- 1 credit in French as a second language
- 0.5 credit in career studies
- 0.5 credit in civics and citizenship
- 1 credit from the [STEM-related course group](#)

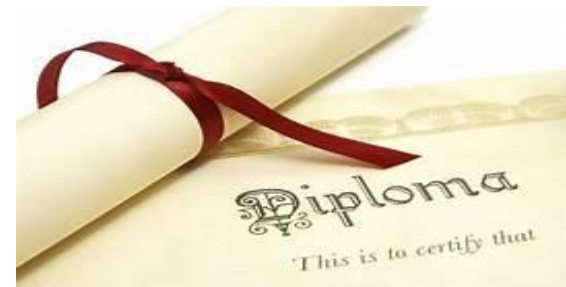
Optional credits (13)

You must earn 13 optional credits by successfully completing courses from your school's program and course calendar.

STEM-related course group

Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from the following group:

- Business Studies
- Computer Studies
- Cooperative Education
- **Mathematics** (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- **Science** (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- **Technological Education** (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)



Community Involvement Hours:

- ❑ **40 hours required** to earn an OSSD
- ❑ Hours can be completed in **Grades 9-12**
- ❑ **Submit only once all 40 hours are complete**
 - Only 40 hours are submitted to Student Services
- ❑ **Any hours beyond 40 should be tracked by students**
(Helpful for some **post-secondary supplementary applications, scholarships, and bursaries**)
- ❑ **Submitting Hours:**
 - **At Holy Trinity:** a Volunteer Form with a teacher signature. (*Forms available on Guidance D2L or HT website*).
 - **Outside Holy Trinity** – submit a **signed letter** from the organization with contact information (*See Guidance D2L/Website for letter requirements*)



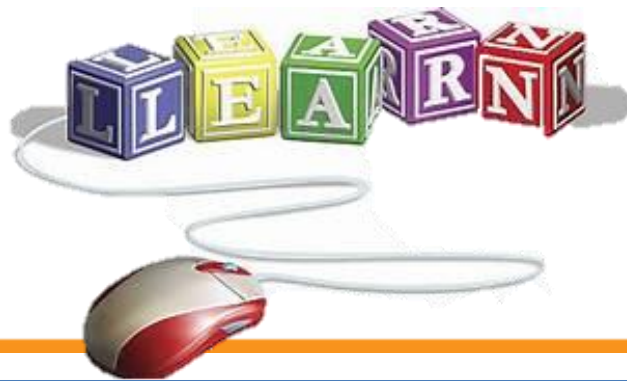
Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test:

- ❑ **Written in Grade 10** (usually same semester you have English)
- ❑ **If you pass:** requirement is complete 
- ❑ **If a student is unable to meet standards in the first attempt, they will either:**
 - Rewrite the test in Grade 11
 - Be directed to complete the Ontario **Literacy Course (OLC40)** in Grade 11 or 12
- ❑ **Passing either OSSLT or OLC40 fulfills the graduation literacy requirement**

E-Learning Requirement

- ❑ Students are required to complete **two e-Learning** courses to graduate
- ❑ Students may **opt out** of the e-Learning requirement:
 - Select the **opt-out option in myBlueprint** during Grade 12 course selection
 - Or complete the **e-Learning opt-out form**
- ❑ **Graduation will NOT be affected** if a student chooses to opt out

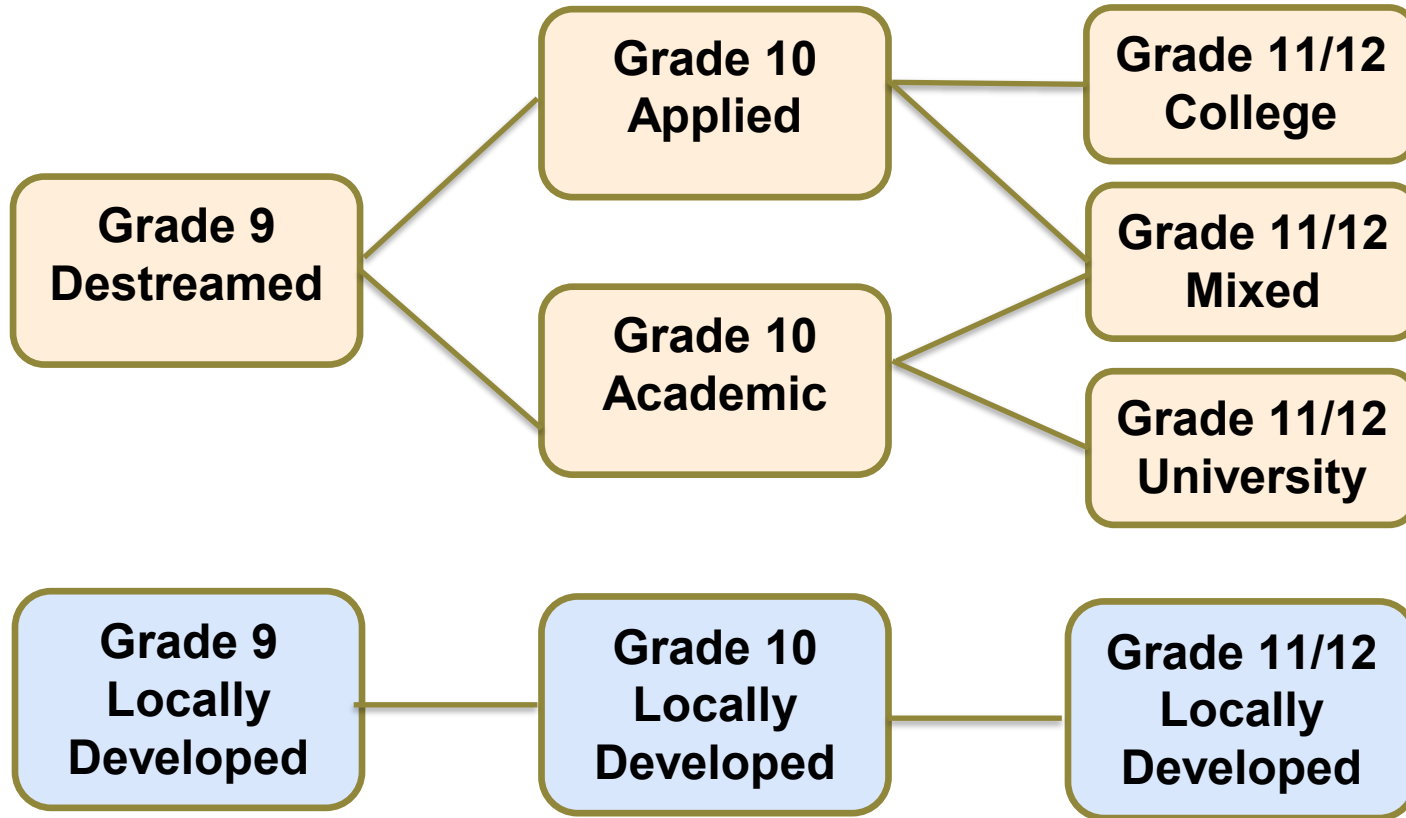

Courses Types



Choose a Pathway

Grade 9 & 10

ACADEMIC (A)

Courses develop students' knowledge and skills by helping students understand the theory behind concepts, and identify practical applications of concepts.

APPLIED (P)

Courses develop students' knowledge and skills by emphasizing practical, concrete application of the concepts.

LOCALLY DEVELOPED (L)

Courses focus on essential skills to build a student's knowledge and understanding, and to develop their literacy, numeracy, problem-solving, decision-making and communication skills.

OPEN (O)

Courses allow students to learn concepts and skills designed to prepare them for further study in the subject area. Expectations are designed to be appropriate for all students.

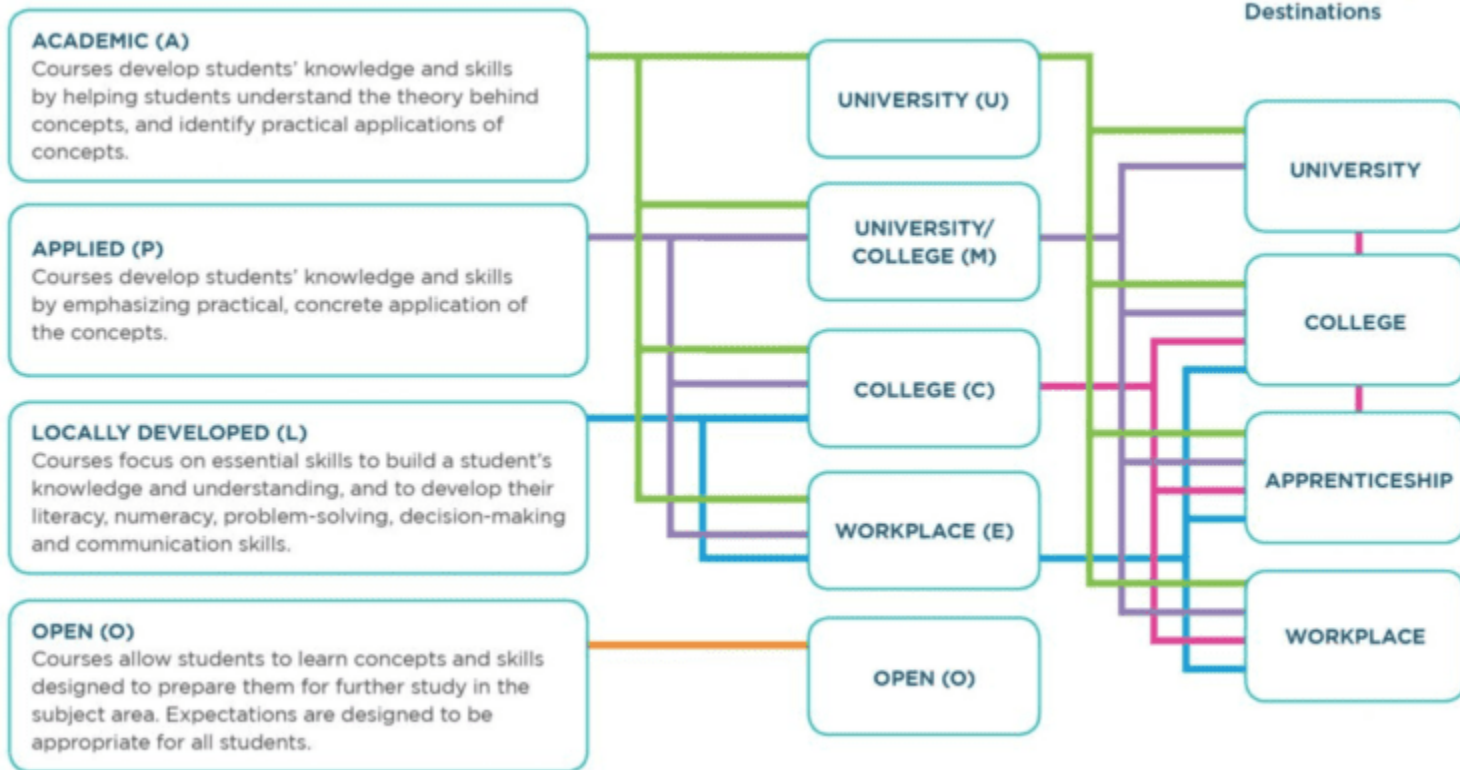

*Students are required to take a minimum of 8 credits in Grade 9, 10 & 11 and a minimum of 6 credits (3 each semester) in Grade 12

34 Credit Threshold

- ❑ Students need **30 credits** to graduate
- ❑ Most students earn these in **4 years** (9-12)
- ❑ After **4 years**, students can earn **up to a maximum of 34 credits total**

(If needed, you may earn **up to 34 credits** within five years).

The 34-credit limit does NOT apply if:

- You are in your **first four years** of high school
- You have an **Individual Education Plan (IEP)**
- You are taking **ESL courses**

- ☐ Students' official record of all credits earned
- ☐ Grades 9 and 10: only **successfully completed courses** are recorded
- ☐ Grades 11 and 12: **all course attempts and marks** are recorded (unless course dropped by mark maintain date)

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Specialty Programs Offered at Holy Trinity

Extended French: Available to students who successfully completed the Extended French program in Grade 10.

Advanced Placement: Available to students who were in **AP program in Grade 9 & 10** also by application to those who achieved high academic standing in Math, French, Science, English or Canadian & World Studies.

AP Capstone program Enrollment is through a **selection process based on program criteria**

- Prepares students for **Grade 12 Capstone Project**
- Designed for students who demonstrate readiness and interest

- If you are taking Extended French you must select both of these courses in Grade 11:
HRT3MF (Extended French World Religions)
FEF3U1 (Extended French)
- Students in this program continue to develop French Language skills by taking one course in Extended each year along with one additional subject taught in French
 - Grade 9: Geography & Extended French
 - Grade 10: History & Extended French
 - Grade 11: Religion & Extended French
 - Grade 12: Extended French
- Upon completing a minimum of four Extended French courses and 3 additional subjects taught in French (total of 7 courses), students will receive an Extended French Certificate at graduation.

Cooperative Education (Co-op)

- ☐ Available to **Grade 11 and Grade 12 students**
- ☐ Explore a career area to see if it's something you truly enjoy
- ☐ Gain **hands-on experience**, possible employment opportunities, and **work references** for your résumé
- ☐ Counts as **two elective credits** in your timetable
- ☐ Includes approximately **two weeks of in-class preparation**
- ☐ After preparation, students attend the **workplace for two periods each day**
- ☐ Select **Co-op in myBlueprint** and complete the application form

Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)

- ❑ Allows students to focus on a **career pathway** that matches their **skills and interests** while meeting all **OSSD requirements**
- ❑ Students receive the **SHSM seal on their diploma** when they:
 - ❑ Complete a **bundle of 8-10 courses** in their selected field (**including Co-op**)
 - ❑ Earn **industry-recognized certifications** (e.g., First Aid, CPR)
 - ❑ Gain **hands-on, workplace experience** through **Co-operative Education placements**
 - ❑ Application occurs during Grade 10 course selection; program runs in Grades 11–12

Co-op & Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program



- ❑ Turn Co-op into Apprenticeship Training
- ❑ Explore **apprenticeships** through your Co-op placement
- ❑ All Co-op students are **registered as apprentices** and can **accumulate hours toward apprenticeship certification**
- ❑ Participate in **monthly integration sessions** back at school
- ❑ Helps students **start apprenticeship programs while completing high school**



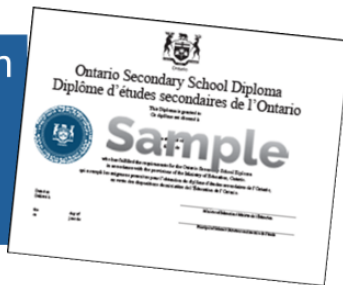
OYAP lets you get a head start on your trade career by earning official apprenticeship hours while still in high school!

OYAP-FAST Apprenticeship Program

- ✓ Are you a hands-on learner who wants to get a head start on a great paying career in the skilled trades?
- ✓ Would you like to work towards becoming an apprentice while earning your high school diploma?

Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training (FAST) is a specialized program that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional Co-op credits, while completing their OSSD.

Students who meet the completion requirements, and all other OSSD requirements, will be awarded the OYAP-FAST seal on their diploma.

Dual Credit Programs

- ❑ Students earn **high school credits (OSSD)** and **college credits** at the same time
- ❑ Offered in partnership with **Sheridan College** and **Mohawk College**
- ❑ Helps students **transition successfully from high school to college or apprenticeship programs**

- ❑ Your **Grade 11 and 12 course choices** help determine your post-secondary options.
- ❑ There are **multiple pathways after high school** – no one path is “better” than another. Your pathway can change over time, and that’s okay!

- ❑ Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- ❑ All Gr. 11 & 12 high school grades are sent to colleges.
 - Some programs will only use the grades of the required courses (e.g. English, Math, Science)
 - Specific courses and grades may be required.
 - Some programs are highly competitive.
- ❑ Colleges also offer Bachelor Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M courses

- ❑ Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- ❑ 6 Grade 12 U or M courses; one must be English.
- ❑ Programs require ENG 4U plus 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level
- ❑ Some programs will have other pre-requisites like math and science
- ❑ Some programs are grades + (e.g., portfolio, interview, essay)
- ❑ <https://www.ouinfo.ca/> for prerequisites and entrance requirements
- ❑ Joint university/college programs available – apply via OUAC

Planning Your Courses

- ☐ Think of your possible post-secondary destination and plan **backwards** from there.
- ☐ Check course requirements on **E-Info** and **ontariocolleges.ca**
- ☐ Check each program's website for details
- ☐ Use **myBlueprint** to **verify prerequisites** for your Grade 12 courses
- ☐ Make sure your **selected courses align** with your goals
- ☐ Consider your **interests, strengths, and potential career paths**
- ☐ Choose a **balanced course load** for flexibility and options
- ☐ **Unsure?** Book an appointment with your **Guidance Counsellor**

Reaching Ahead

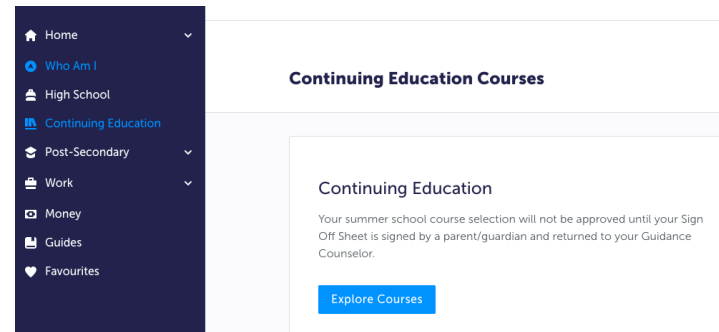
- ☐ Some students choose to reach ahead in grade 11 with grade 12 courses
- ☐ Be ready for an increased workload and expectations
- ☐ Grade 11 students are committed to 4 courses per semester
- ☐ Dropping a course for a spare is not in option in Grade 11
- ☐ Once you choose to reach ahead with a course, you are expected to remain in it, even if your mark isn't what you hoped it would be. *There isn't an opportunity to drop a course in grade 11 or switch to a different course if things start going sideways.*
- ☐ We really encourage students to reflect on all of these points prior to choosing to reach ahead with any grade 12 course



Summer School



- If you plan to take a course in Summer School. Do NOT put in your selections now
- Instead select another course and use the “**ADD COMMENT**” feature to tell us your plan
- Registration for Summer School usually opens in April
- Information about Summer School can be found on the Thomas Merton Website <https://merton.hcdsb.org/secondary-students/summer-school/>
- Register for Summer School through: myBlueprint → Continuing Education
- 4 week courses are offered:
 - For repeating a failed course
 - For earning a reach-ahead course
- You may enrol in only one course

Online Courses

- If you are interested in taking an **e-learning** course during the school year, you must select these courses through **MyBlueprint**
- The 6th character of the course code will have an “E” and “Online” will be listed next to the course name for easy identification.
- Daily log on required (75 min / day) with computer access
- **Asynchronous, self-directed learning** monitored by a teacher
- All courses delivered through D2L platform
- Some courses are offered outside of HCDSB
- **Not for everyone** - students should carefully consider their learning style

English

Grade 9 ENG1D1 1 Credit Academic

This course is designed to develop the oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in their secondary school academic programs and in their daily lives. Students will analyse literary texts from contemporary and historical periods, interpret informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on the use of strategies that contribute to effective communication. The course is intended to prepare students for the Grade 10 academic English course, which leads to university or college preparation courses in Grades 11 and 12. Students considering moving from one destination to another (e.g., applied to academic; academic to applied) are strongly encouraged to take a summer school course to encourage success in the transition.
