Student Council Update: Sara Reyes & Ryan Matteazzi	 Halloween: Civvies Day; haunted house on the stage - very popular with long line ups; look at strategies to get more kids through next year as there was a long line and some students were turned away Fall Coffee House: successful evening with variety of performances; 4 students max/parent with separate sign-up sheet for students that are not from Loyola Student Senate: 8 student reps from each school are chosen; meet once/month - discuss what each school is doing and plan board-wide initiatives e.g., bullying prevention launch; students in grades 10-12 (chosen in April); Bullying Prevention launch has been running for 6 years; contest (song, art or video submissions); one submission/school; prefer a group to work together on the submission as opposed to an individual submission; due in February; Jean Vanier meeting to discuss new initiative (each high school submitted one initiative); Loyola's choice was chosen! (Indigenous learning initiative); early stages of planning (ideas include: create your own art piece; have an Indigenous speaker come in; have sessions set up to do different art)

Mohawk-McMaster; Lakehead-Georgian; Humber-Guelph

b) Wellness Initiatives

- i. Large banner with artwork: "Loyola: Dignity, Equity and Respect" will be printed and placed in the atrium for students to colour together
- ii. Guest Teresa Lorentz, Child and Youth Counsellor (CYC)
- -social, emotional needs of the students; school-wide initiatives and individual work with students; exam de-stress information e.g., centers and activities set up before exams; Loyola Mental Health Committee run by students; lunch drop-in; best buddies to link spec ed with mainstream students; mental health presentations in-class e.g., kids help line; to boost positive school spirit in the school and help with exam stress
- -idea to promote apps that help students with stress and anxiety e.g., Head Space
- -referral process for students to receive support; need parental permission; duty to report if a student discloses he/she is going to hurt himself and/or hurt someone else
- -suggestion to help students build a relationship with Christ and to pray
- -lunch drop-in intramural
- -Team Unbreakable run/walk club; "Bold in the Cold" 5K run and a second run in the spring
- -School Chaplain is Mrs. Kandy Harkin
- -Roger Alfaro suggested that through CPIC we can arrange a mental-health speaker to come in and speak to either the students or a parent group

c) Fall Awards

- i. Honour Roll certificates were not handed out individually to students
- ii. Suggestion to make it during the school day to enable all students to attend
- iii. Idea to create a "Principal's List" as opposed to just honouring students on the Honour Roll; link to Board focus of Achieving, Believing, Belonging: Achieving (must have 80% average for Honour Roll); Believing (min. 10 community hours); Belonging (part of a minimum of one school activity)

d) School Generated Funds

- -Student Activity Fee: \$65/student is collected at the beginning of the year; money is used to pay for Breakfast Club so we can remove that from summary of expenses
- -need to have a purpose for the fundraising
- -motion to not do the fundraiser this year (typically it is a fall initiative; it's late in the year now); however, others feel that if we don't do it this year, parents won't want to contribute next year
