- 3. Am I alterning my skin colour, facial/body features to make it darker or like a particular ethnicity, race or cultural group?
- 4. Am I dressing up as a culture or borrowing from a religion that is not my own or is not part of my background?
- 5. Do I understand and respect the history or tradition of the culture that I am borrowing my costume from?
