FAQs for Secondary French Immersion

- Students who have had French Immersion instruction from grade 1 are candidates for the new French Immersion program.
- Students who are currently in an Extended French elementary school program are not candidates for the French Immersion program but are welcome to continue in Loyola's Extended French program
- Students who decide to go into French Immersion could switch into Extended French at any time. However, if they start in Extended French they must stay in Extended French or switch into Core French and forego their Extended French certificate upon graduation. They will not be able to enroll in Extended French and then switch over to full French Immersion
- Students in Loyola's family of schools do not need to register on the board website, they can enter their course requests in My Blueprint and follow their teacher recommendations.
- Students outside of the HCDSB will have to complete the online Registration and indicate they are interested in the French Immersion program. Once their requests are reviewed and dependingon availability of the program, they will be contacted directly with further instructions

• <u>Course description for FIF 1D:</u>

 This course provides opportunities for students to speak and interact in French independently in a variety of real-life and personally relevant contexts. Students will develop their skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, as well their ability to communicate in French with confidence, by using language learning strategies introduced in the elementary French Immersion program. Students will enhance their knowledge of the French language through the study of French-Canadian literature. They will also increase their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities and will develop skills necessary for lifelong language learning.
