#### College Information

Job market indicators show that students with both college and university education are being hired at a faster rate.

Over 4500 programs are offered at Ontario colleges which are designed to meet the needs of both students and employers.

#### Colleges offer:

- Certificate Programs (1 year)
- Diploma Programs (2 years)
- Advanced Diploma Programs (3 years)
- Degree Programs (4 years require Gr. 12 U/M courses)
- Graduate Certificates Programs (require diploma/degree)
- Collaborative and Joint Degree Programs (partnerships with universities)
- Co-op Programs
- Apprenticeship Programs (Skilled Trades)

## College Information

<u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u> for all college programs with start dates **August 1, 2021-July 31, 2022**. Some programs start in May and some start in January.

Admission averages will vary from programs to schools:

- average of the five/six highest <u>senior</u> (Gr. 11 AND GR. 12) level credits (including required courses) for certificate/general/advanced diploma programs
- six grade twelve U or M courses for <u>Degree/Joint</u> programs.
- Admission testing/portfolio/auditions may also be included or required.

#### **Application Process**

- \$ 95.00 Application Fee. Students get 5 program choices with no more than 3 at any one school (Colleges give equal consideration to all program choices).
- Payment: Credit Card, On-line banking, by phone, or by mail (Certified cheque or Money order). Applications will not be processed until fees have been paid.

Important Dates:

November 1, 2021: Earliest Offer Date

February 1, 2022: Equal Consideration Date

May 1, 2022: Deadline to Confirm Offers of Admission

June 2022: Tuition Deposit Due at the Colleges
