- 1. Students will select courses electronically through their myblueprint account (www.myblueprint.ca).
- 2. When the student has submitted the course selection, the Parent/Guardian will receive an email to approve the courses. Course selections will not be processed without a Parent/Guardian approval. (See PART D)
- 3. Changes to elective courses or pathways can be made until June. After June changes may not be possible. Please be advised that courses may be cancelled due to low enrolment. Students will be given their alternate course elective if they have a conflict.

Students need to select 8 courses: 6 compulsory courses from PART A and 2 elective courses from PART B for a total of 8 courses.

<u>PART A</u>: Students must select one (1) course from each of the following 6 course subject areas. Exceptions to this will require an IEP or an ELL designation – Please see PART C below.
