- Students from 106 still come to school all day, every day
- School is very empty and becomes difficult when there is a change in routine
- To help the staff like a camp take over the school over the extra day during the Exam Period and lots of events planned for the whole day

Remembrance Day – Cynthia Obrovac

- Reached out to more students and staff
- With tech department (Mr Vicic) and Arts department students made decorative poppies, welded together and painted
- Poppies are on display for ceremony and are for sale (\$5 each) email and picture sent to parent community
 - o Donation will be made from some of the proceeds to the Royal Canadian Legion
 - ND will also donate on behalf of Irish Cares
- Partnered with Social Justice put together an interactive museum display with photos of Canadian Veterans – linked with QR code linked to videos, songs or information

- Gymnasium cannot be painted yet as lockers which will be removed will be stored there to be picked up by dump trucks
- Goal have some painting in gym at the completion of the work of the removal of lockers and the installation of lockers
- All hallways will be painted with installation of new lockers
- Areas of library will be transformed into Learning Commons carpet to be gone with possibility of laminate floors
 - Update some areas to make it more laptop/computer friendly
