


CHANGING COURSE LEVELS

SUMMER SCHOOL (JULY)

- All summer school courses are 4 weeks in length. Upgrading a mark will also require 4 weeks.
- ► FULL COURSE TO MOVE FROM APPLIED TO ACADEMIC * MANDATORY FOR MATH *
- REGISTER through myBlueprint in early May.
- If you are sure that you will take summer school and plan to take CHV2O/GLC2O (Civics/Careers), you can leave that course off your course selection in myBlueprint and select another course in its place.



TRANSCRIPT RULES

- ► Grade 9 & 10 courses: only successful attempts of courses are recorded.
- ► Grade 11 & 12 courses: all attempts of courses (including failures) are recorded
- ► Grade 11 & 12 courses: courses dropped before the mid-term date are NOT recorded on the transcript. (Students must carry at least 3 courses per semester)
