CHANGING COURSE LEVELS

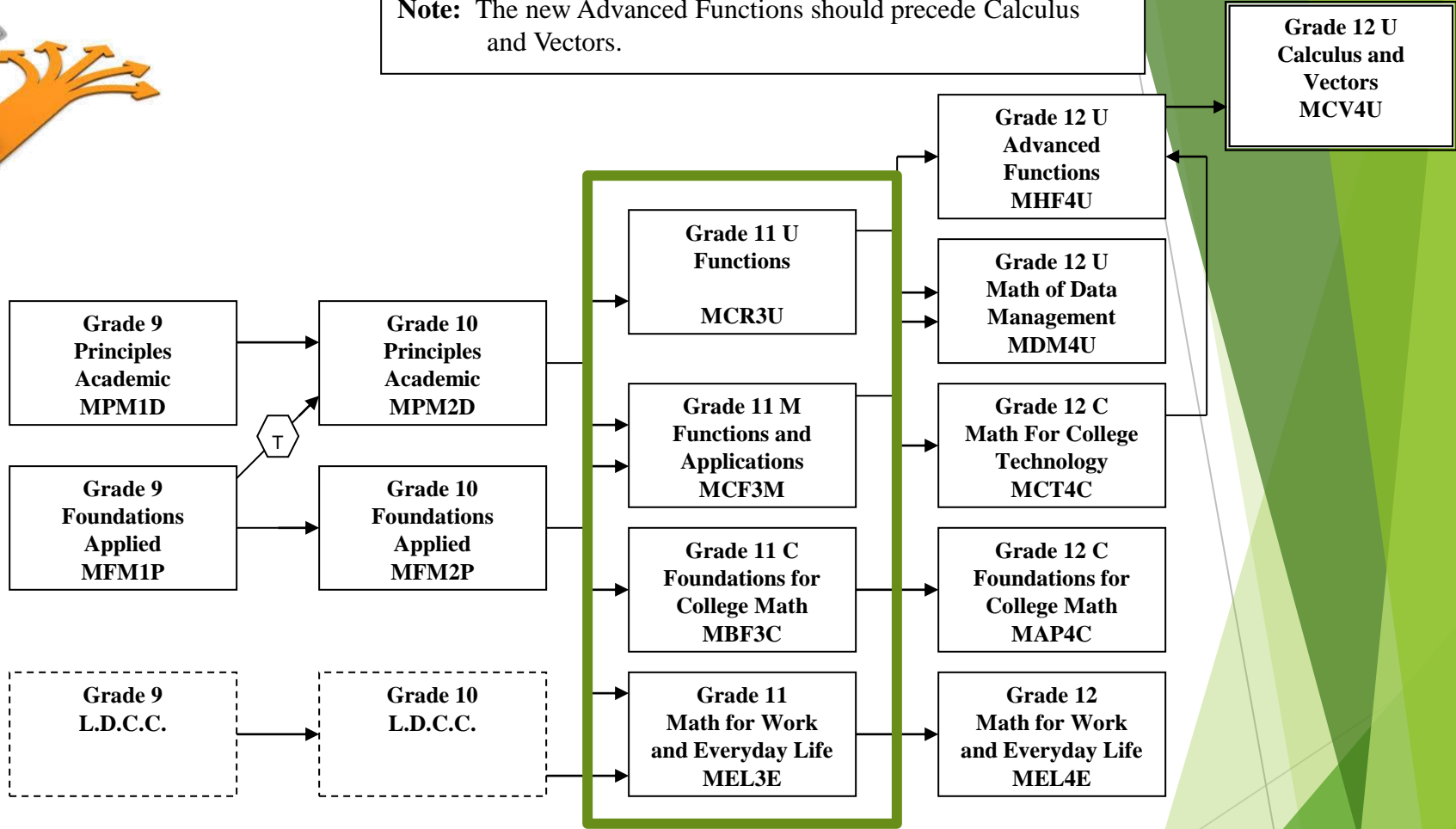
- ▶ **Applied to Academic:** It is strongly recommended that students take the **full ACADEMIC** summer course prior to starting the academic course for English and Science. Students must complete the **four week** academic summer course for Math. (MFM1P → MPM1D)

SUMMER SCHOOL (JULY)

- ▶ All summer school courses are 4 weeks in length. Upgrading a mark will also require 4 weeks.
- ▶ FULL COURSE TO MOVE FROM APPLIED TO ACADEMIC * MANDATORY FOR MATH *
- ▶ REGISTER through myBlueprint early May.



TRANSCRIPT RULES

- ▶ **Grade 9 & 10 courses:** only successful attempts of courses are recorded.
- ▶ **Grade 11 & 12 courses:** all attempts of courses (including failures) are recorded
- ▶ **Grade 11 & 12 courses:** courses dropped before the mid-term date are NOT recorded on the transcript. (Students must carry at least 3 courses per semester)

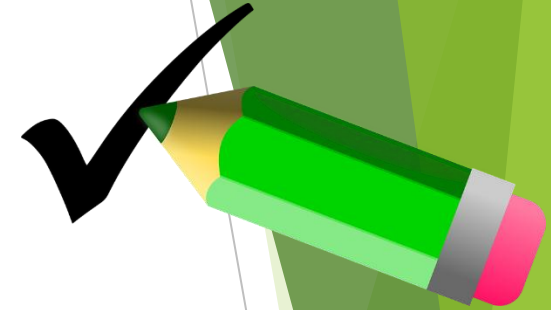

Description

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in scientific and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using academic language coherently and confidently, selecting the resulting strategies best suited to particular texts and particular purposes for reading, and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace. Students transitioning moving from one destination to another (e.g., college to university, workplace to college) must successfully complete a transfer course.

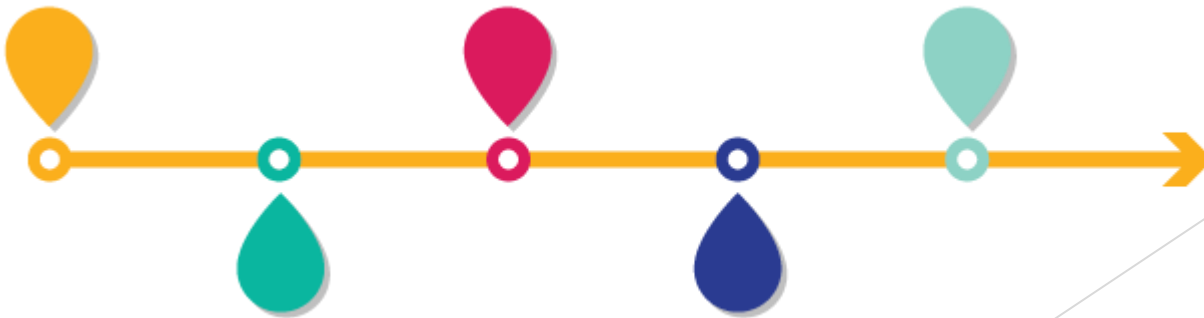

New Courses for Grade 11

▶ **AWA30 - Arts and Crafts**

This course focuses on the exploration and creation of both traditional and contemporary craft while pursuing the theme of 'Fusion'. Students will use the creative process to make artworks using a variety of materials and reflecting on a wide range of subjects. They will discuss and evaluate the artworks using the critical analysis process. Students will explore and create works of art with a personal, contemporary, historical, and cultural context.

New Courses

► CHT30 -World History Post-1900

This course focuses on major developments in world history from 1900 to the present. Students will explore the causes and consequences of global and regional conflicts as well as responses to social, economic, and political developments in various countries and regions. Students will extend their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking and the historical inquiry process, including the interpretation and analysis of evidence, when investigating historical developments and events, including those that continue to affect people in various parts of the world.

New Courses

► IDC30 - Personal Finance

This course is designed to help students learn about and navigate through various financial decisions they will be faced with in life. Some of the financial planning topics to be covered include budgeting, savings, mortgages, investments, insurance, and debt. Students will learn to apply these concepts critically through theoretical investigation and research into a variety of Canadian and International financial institutions. **Prerequisite: any grade 10 math**

SHSM - Specialist High Skills Major

It combines on-the-job and in-school training to allow students to gain sector-specific skills and knowledge while meeting OSSD requirements

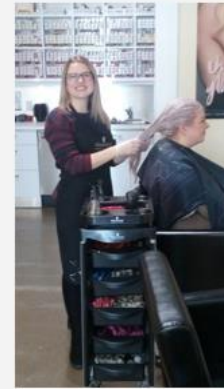

Co-Op

HOW ARE CREDITS EARNED?

- Students will attend pre-placement classes (2 weeks) and then go to their co-op placements for the remainder of the semester (17 weeks)
- Students are at a work site for a specific number of hours (i.e., approx. 3 hours/day) for the duration of the semester.... roughly 200 hours of work per semester.
- Students must also return monthly for in-class sessions
