






CHANGING COURSE LEVELS

New Courses for Grade 11

AWA30 - Arts and Crafts

This course focuses on the exploration and creation of both traditional and contemporary craft while pursuing the theme of 'Fusion'. Students will use the creative process to make artworks using a variety of materials and reflecting on a wide range of subjects. They will discuss and evaluate the artworks using the critical analysis process. Students will explore and create works of art with a personal, contemporary, historical, and cultural context.

New Courses

► CHT3O -World History Post-1900

This course focuses on major developments in world history from 1900 to the present. Students will explore the causes and consequences of global and regional conflicts as well as responses to social, economic, and political developments in various countries and regions. Students will extend their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking and the historical inquiry process, including the interpretation and analysis of evidence, when investigating historical developments and events, including those that continue to affect people in various parts of the world.


New Courses

► IDC3O - Personal Finance

This course is designed to help students learn about and navigate through various financial decisions they will be faced with in life. Some of the financial planning topics to be covered include budgeting, savings, mortgages, investments, insurance, and debt. Students will learn to apply these concepts critically through theoretical investigation and research into a variety of Canadian and International financial institutions. **Prerequisite: any grade 10 math**

HOW ARE CREDITS EARNED?

 3 hours/day) for the duration of the semester... roughly 200 hours of work per semester.
