

SUMMER SCHOOL (JULY)

- Grade 11 & 12 courses: courses dropped before the mid-term date are NOT recorded on the transcript. (Students must carry at least 3 courses per semester)

Description

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the interace, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in analysing and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary iccoix from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create local, writiker, and evaluate in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using variety before language coherently and confidently, selecting the reacting strategies locat suited to particular texts and particular purposes for working, and developing greater control in writing. The course is interacted to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace. Students constantly moving from one destination to another (e.g., college to university; workplace to college) must successfully complete a constant or university;


