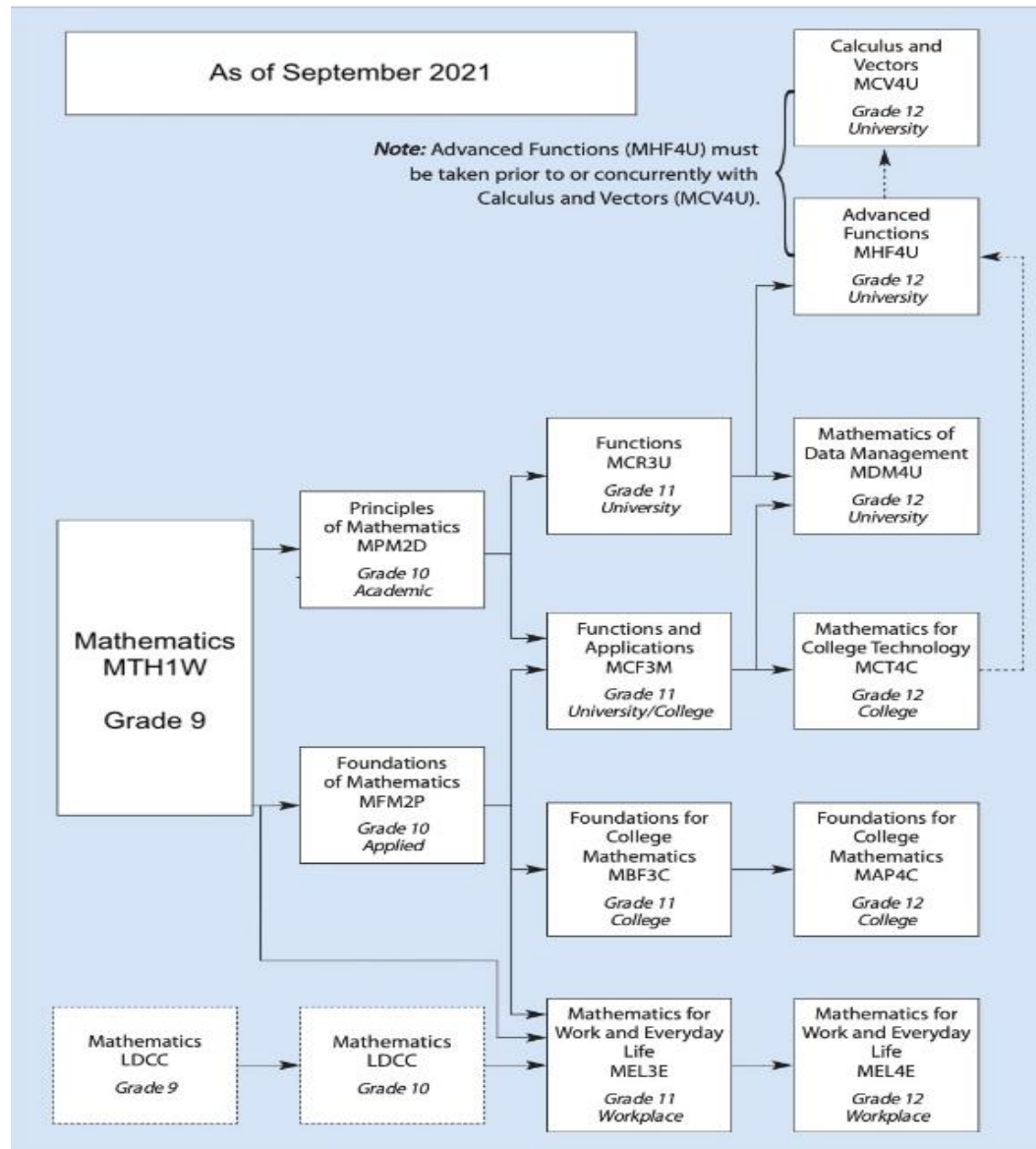


# CHANGING COURSE LEVELS

- ▶ **Applied to Academic:** It is strongly recommended that students take the **full ACADEMIC** summer course prior to starting the academic course for English and Science. Students must complete the **four week** academic summer course for Math.

# SUMMER SCHOOL (JULY)

- ▶ All summer school courses are 4 weeks in length. Upgrading a mark will also require 4 weeks.
- ▶ FULL COURSE TO MOVE FROM APPLIED TO ACADEMIC \* MANDATORY FOR MATH \*
- ▶ REGISTER through myBlueprint in early May.
- ▶ If you are sure that you will take summer school and plan to take CHV20/GLC20 (Civics/Careers), you can leave that course off your course selection in myBlueprint and select another course in its place.





# TRANSCRIPT RULES

- ▶ **Grade 9 & 10 courses:** only successful attempts of courses are recorded.
- ▶ **Grade 11 & 12 courses:** all attempts of courses (including failures) are recorded
- ▶ **Grade 12 student:** if a grade 12 student drops a course before the mid-term date this will NOT be recorded on the student transcript.
- ▶ **No spares for students in grades 9-11.**
- ▶ **Grade 12 students must carry at least 3 courses per semester.**

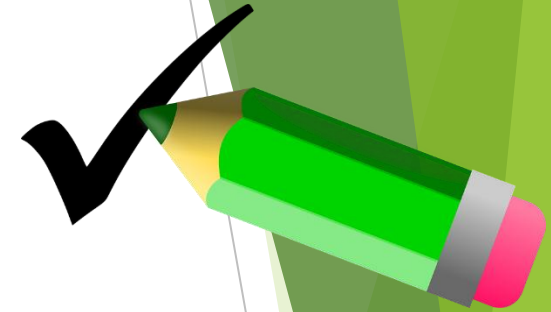

## Description

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using academic language coherently and confidently, selecting the reading strategies best suited to particular texts and particular purposes for reading, and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace. Students considering moving from one destination to another (e.g., college to university or workplace to college) must successfully complete a grade 12 course.

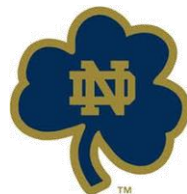

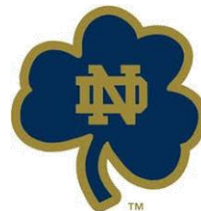
