 - SHSM will purchase items that can be used year after year
 - Business Leadership to help acquire donations for food & beverage

Principal's Report: Mr. Roberts

• Grade 9/10 Dance: Police vs. Security

- 265 students in attendance
- The board instructed the school to hire security, rather than police, as police presence may be a trigger for students and parents. If there was any type of issue during the event, police may be called
- School's liaison officer was made aware of the event
- Security did not show up to the event last minute due to a family emergency
- School Council will be reimbursed
- VP's and Teachers helped with security, but students were well behaved. No issues reported

School Council Constitution

- Stephen to send out constitution and by laws to the rest of council via email
- Student Awards Night: Honor roll and subject awards
 - Reports from the board arrived late this year
 - Honor roll & subject awards to be presented:
 - Last year grade 9s: Dec. 15, Period 4
 - Last year grade 10s: Dec. 16, Period 1
 - Last year grade 11s: Dec. 16, Period 2
 - Presentation cannot be streamed to parents due to privacy issues
 - Friends & Family will not be invited in-person as we have done in the past as the school cannot accommodate the amount of people
 - Parents are upset they will not be included and disappointed in the lack of communication and planning
 - Admin to do better next year

• Bathroom Update

- Kid still congregating in the washrooms, however vaping and vandalism is down
- VPs and supervisors continue to monitor
- No alcohol has been found just vaping
- Items needed to fix plumbing issues in one of the bathrooms are backordered

• Cafeteria Update

- Admin looked into Subway, however Subway cannot handle the amount of students
- Student Council increased pizza days and are planning Pasta Days
 - Parent concern that they may run out of pizza: don't generally run out of pizza unless you come right at the end of lunch



- A local catering company was scheduled to tour the cafeteria but they unfortunately did not follow through
- Chartwell (Board catering company) is currently underemployed they employ other cafeterias (nursing homes)...High schools generally make the least amount of money, so they are at the bottom of the list to be employed
- Students aren't necessarily missing out on too much! Cafeteria food is not what it used to be. Board deemed no fryers (French fries etc..), no pop, nothing unhealthy
- Food Trucks very difficult to have them here regularly because of City of Burlington "red tape"

• Alternative Lunch Areas

- Cafeteria is not ever full
- If the cafeteria is too noisy, there are some classrooms available and other quiet areas. Case by case basis please contact principal for arrangements
- Certain stairwells are open to students. They are regularly monitored by VPs and Supervisors. Several staircases are not open to students due to illicit activities taking place
