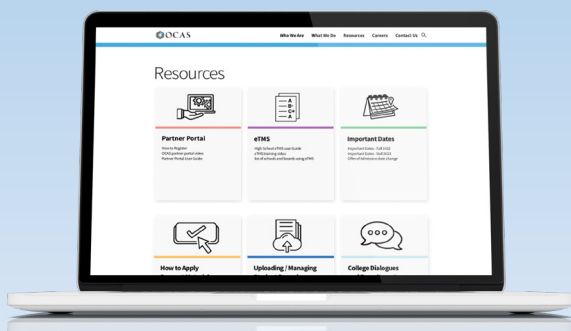

Important Dates

Fall 2024 Programs

Apply

Early October, 2023

With the 2024 - 25 college application cycle open, learners can now apply to programs starting fall 2024 at ontariocolleges.ca.

February 1, 2024

The deadline for applying to highly competitive programs. Applications received and paid for before this date will be given equal consideration by the colleges.

NOTE: Applicants for all programs are encouraged to apply before this date, as website and call volumes are highest at this time.

Offer

November 1, 2023

Earliest date the colleges may release offers to applicants. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait lists are established.

NOTE: Applicants who have not met admission requirements for a program may be notified at any time during the application process.

Accept

November 1, 2023

Earliest date that applicants may confirm an offer of admission.

May 1, 2024

The most common deadline for confirming offers of admission. Applicants should always review their offers of admission for exact deadline dates.

June 1, 2024

Earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees.

Data Transmission Schedule

Data files from school boards and / or high schools are due on the following dates.

October 6, 2023

Target date for demographics, marks history, and current and projected registrations for the entire school year. OCAS requires marks history for all courses taken in grades 9, 10, and 11.

November 17, 2023

Deadline for demographics, marks history, and current and projected registrations for the entire school year. OCAS requires marks history for all courses taken in grades 9, 10, and 11.

Deadline for first semester midterm marks. Schools may transmit interim marks for full-year courses as soon as they are available.

February 16, 2024

Deadline for first semester final marks and currently enrolled second semester courses. For non-semestered schools: Interim marks are due.

April 26, 2024

Deadline for second semester midterm marks. For non-semestered schools: Interim marks are due.

July 5, 2024

Deadline for all final marks and proof of graduation, regardless of the scheduling model.

August 9, 2024

Deadline for all final marks and/or summer school final marks and proof of graduation.

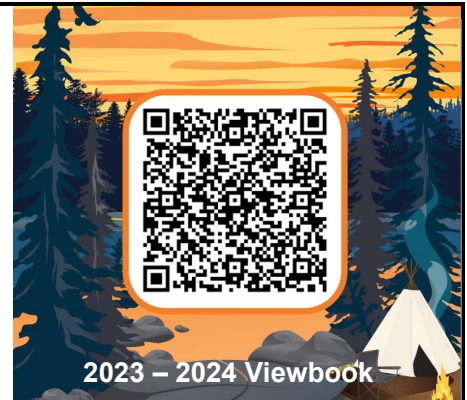

Selection process for oversubscribed programs:	With the exception of the Collaborative Nursing Program (BScN), admissions to oversubscribed programs will be based on the average of all grade 11 and 12 marks. *Collaborative Nursing is based on the average of final first semester grade 12 required (U) courses. If you have not taken the required Chemistry or Biology in your first semester of Grade 12, your Grade 11 (U) marks will be used.
Selection process for non-oversubscribed programs:	Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) with a majority of credits at the College (C), University (U), College/University (M), or Open (O) level or equivalent. All applicants must meet program specific requirements.
Grade 11 marks:	For oversubscribed programs, with the exception of Collaborative Nursing (BScN), applicants are ranked by the average of all grade 11 and 12 marks. Also, for selected "popular" programs, a grade 12 English mark will be used for ranking purposes. If a grade 12 English is not available, the grade 11 English mark will be used.
