### **OSSD Literacy Test Requirement**

MUST meet Literacy Test requirement to graduate (recorded on OST-transcript)

- Students take Literacy Test in Grade 10
- If student is unable to meet standards on first attempt;
  - Help available with an after school Literacy program to help prepare them for retaking the test in Grade 11
  - Still unsuccessful can take and pass OLC4O1 course in Grade 12





### **Our School Year**

Semester School with 8 courses over two semesters

- 4 courses from September to January
- 4 courses from February to June

Four courses daily (75 minutes each) Period 1, Period 2, Period 3, Period 4 and period 5
