It is <u>recommended</u> that students continue to self-screen everyday before attending school using the COVID-19 School and Childcare Screening Tool COVID-19 school screening (ontario.ca)

Students must stay home if they are feeling ill to prevent the spread of illness.



HCDSB COVID-19 Guide

Masks will <u>not</u> be required for students, staff and visitors in schools, or on student transportation.

Masks may be required if there is an increased risk of exposure or when required/directed by Public Health.

Masks may also be required as directed in the COVID-19 School and Childcare Screening Tool COVID-19 school screening (ontario.ca)

Schools will continue to provide masks for students who choose to wear masks.

You should continue to wear a mask if:

- You feel it is right for you.
- You are at high risk for severe illness.
- You are recovering COVID-19 or have symptoms of COVID-19.
- You are a close contact of someone with COVID-19 or symptoms of COVID-19.

Appropriate <u>hand hygiene</u> should always be followed.

Soap and water is preferred when hands are visibly soiled.

Use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with minimum 60% alcohol if handwashing is not possible.

School Uniform Policy



- We proudly represent our STA community at school and outside school by wearing the full uniform.
- This includes from the time of arrival to the end of period 5, including lunch periods.
- McCarthy Uniforms is our uniform provider.
- School Uniform Policy can be found on the school web page.

Attendance - You belong here!

Research has shown a strong connection between attendance and achievement.

- If you are absent: have your parent/guardian report your absence via the school messenger app.
- ▶ If you become ill during the day, report to the attendance office.
- > Students cannot leave the building without being signed out through the attendance office.
- When students are signed out, they must leave the school building.



Absences and Lates

- 1 to 5 Absences:
 - ► Teacher discusses effect of absences on performance with student.
 - Teacher to contact home and the vice principal.
 - For lates less than 20 minutes, students report to class.
 - ► For lates greater than 20 minutes, students report to the attendance office.





Attendance - Unexplained Absences

- The day following an unexplained absence, the teacher will direct the student to the office.
- The vice principal will meet with the student and discuss progressive discipline.
- ► Parent/Guardian will be informed.



Code of Conduct

- ► HCDSB Code of Conduct
- ▶ **Students** are to be treated with respect and dignity. In return, they must demonstrate respect for themselves, for others, and for the responsibilities of citizenship through acceptable behaviour. Respect and responsibility are demonstrated when a student:
- comes to school prepared, on time and ready to learn
- shows respect for others and for those in authority
- refrains from bringing anything to school that may compromise the safety of others
- follow the established rules and takes responsibility for his or her own actions

Code of Conduct continued

- upholds the Ontario Human Rights Code and helps to create an environment that is free of discrimination and harassment
- refrains from:
 - using harmful language or behaviour which may be intentional or unintentional. The Ontario Human Rights Code focuses on impact. Even if a person does not explicitly object to the comment or behaviour, it can be construed as harassment and must be addressed appropriately
 - making epithets, remarks, jokes or innuendos related to a person's race, gender identify, gender expression, disability, sex, sexual orientation, creed, age, and/or any other Code-protected ground
 - posting or circulating offensive/harmful pictures, graffiti or materials, whether in print form, via e-mail or other electronic means
 - singling out a person by humiliating, demeaning, "teasing" or humor because they are a member of a Code-protected group
 - making comments ridiculing a person because of characteristics that are related to a Code-protected ground of discrimination (for example, this could include comments about a person's dress, speech or other practices that may be related to their sex, race, gender identity or creed)

What to Do When You Witness Harmful Language or Behaviour?

Four Steps to Responding to Discrimination

DISRUPT & NAME

- Stop the discriminatory language or behaviour.
- Identify the infringement on human dignity and name the behaviour.
- Be specific (e.g. that language sounds racist).
- Ensure that all partners who witnessed the incident hear you disrupting and naming it.

DOCUMENT & ENSURE ACCOUNTABILITY

- · Record details of the incident.
- Meet all parties of the incident.
- Report to your Supervisor.
- Refer to the Code of Conduct for HCDSB to ensure accountability.



EXPLAIN & SUPPORT

- We all have a right to those things which are required by human dignity.
- Recognize and explain why the language is harmful in the context of Catholic Teaching and the Ontario Human Rights Code.
- Support the student or staff who has experienced the discriminatory comment or behaviour.
- Ask the student or staff what they need to feel supported.

REFLECT & RESTORE

- Identify factors and systemic barriers to promote equity and justice.
- Prioritize the common good and restore community.
- Provide ongoing capacity building and education.

The HCDSB has established a four-step process for staff and students to follow when they witness harmful language or behaviour.

If you have experienced a hate or bias motivated incident, be sure to tell a trusted adult at the school or report the incident online.

Fighting/Violence/Weapons

- Under no circumstances should one student strike another student with any object. This includes punching, kicking, <u>shoving</u>, slapping, or throwing an object.
- Whether intentional, <u>playful</u>, or otherwise, these actions will not be tolerated and will result in school consequences.
- Students are not permitted to bring weapons of any kind into the school. This includes multi-tool devices/pens (Swiss Army Tools) that have blades in them.

Lockers

- Each student has been assigned a locker; no sharing of lockers.
- Must use a school issued lock; come to the office if you need one or reach out to your period 1 teacher.
- Keep them clean and organized; discard any garbage (food) immediately.
- Contact the office if you have forgotten your locker combination or need a new lock (replacement cost: \$8)



Exterior Doors and Visitors

- Exterior doors will be kept locked all day with the exception of the main doors
- Do not prop open doors--they are locked for safety purposes.
- Visit your friends off school property.
- Visitors are not permitted on our property unless previously approved.
- Any visitors to our school (including parents/guardians) must sign in at the main office
- Unwanted visitors may be issued a trespass letter.





Drills and Evacuations



- Multiple and varied drills throughout the year.
- Take all drills seriously; they could save your life.
- Remain calm and follow the instructions of staff.
- Remain silent.
- During a lockdown, if out of classroom seek shelter or stay out of sight.
- Turn off all electronic devices the school will notify parents call 911 only if you have vital info.

Smoking/Vaping/Electronic Cigarettes/Chewing Tobacco

- Provincial law makes it illegal to smoke, use chewing tobacco, or vape on school property
- Students are prohibited from smoking, use chewing tobacco, or vaping on school buses, in school buildings, on school grounds, in vehicles parked on school grounds, as well as during school activities, including field trips and sporting events.
- Students who commit a smoking infraction will meet with administration to discuss progressive discipline consequences. NOTE: possession of smoking related paraphernalia will be treated in the same manner.
- Repeated infractions may lead to school suspension and/or a ticket (\$300) from the Public Health Department Inspector.

Bullying

- Policy II-40 Bullying Prevention and Intervention
- Bullying is defined as a form of (typically) repeated, persistent, and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual or individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem, or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived power imbalance.
- Behaviour can take different forms: physical, verbal, social or electronic (cyber bullying).
- Bullying will not be tolerated in any form. Remember that Social Media posts are PUBLIC
- Please report all concerns to a teacher or administrator who will follow-up in a timely manner.
- The school board is developing a form for students to report a hate or bias motivated incidents.



Electronic Devices

- ► Policy I-43 Use of Technology and Digital Citizenship
- ➤ To be used for educational purposes always follow the direction of the classroom teacher and school administration with respect to the use of electronic devices in the school.
- Respect all privacy laws.
- School is not responsible for lost or stolen devices.
- Return borrowed devices to your teacher or Mrs. Dennis in the library.



Food Allergies/Medical Concerns/Cafeteria

- We have students with life threatening allergies to peanut and other tree nuts.
- Do not bring any food containing peanut or any tree nut to the school.
- Anyone with a medical condition (such as Asthma, Diabetes, Anaphylaxis, or Epilepsy) that has not completed the necessary paperwork, please pick up the forms after the assembly from the main office. If we have your info and nothing has changed, there is also a form that needs to be completed also, pick up from office.
- School bags not permitted in the cafeteria.
- Uber eats and other food delivery services may only be delivered during lunch periods and drivers must be met outside the building (they are unapproved visitors).



Respect All Staff

- Teachers, secretaries, custodians, cafeteria staff and school bus drivers provide a variety of valuable services for students. Students are expected to be respectful of all staff and always follow their direction.
