Chair Items	 Ciara De Jong Review of STA CSC Bylaws Minutes: Bylaws reviewed by CSC, feedback for changes provided by members. A Bylaws Sub-Committee will be formed to review and finalize bylaws for the STA CSC. Gerry Bergin volunteered to be on the committee. Selena McLeod has provided many revisions to the bylaws document therefore she will be a good representative for the subcommittee.
Principal Report	 Kathleen Moro Ciara De Jong Fall Fair/Gratitude BBQ iDARE Update with Sana Farid Traffic Flow/Parking Lot Minutes: Fall Fair/Gratitude BBQ was well received by students and staff. The first iDARE Meeting was held on Tuesday, November 1st, 2022. The meeting was well attended by students, however, only one parent was in attendance. The ESL students who attended the meeting talked about Students presented what Room 214 means to the ML learners, particularly that it is a safe space for ML Learners. The Room 214, safe space for ML Learners, shared about Hispanic Heritage Month and Islamic Heritage Month activities. Canadian Food for Children Field Trip helped students become aware of global aid needs. Modupe Agbi and Sidra Anjum, grade 12 students, discussed succession planning for iDARE given that they are grade 12 students. The STA student They presented a Power Point sharing all that Representation Matters has planned for this year. Student body will be surveyed to see what impact iDARE events are having on students, and to source future student needs. Traffic Flow/Parking Lot – grade 9 students have come forward with potential solutions to traffic flow situations – entry on Rebecca and exit on Dorval. We are not able to have staff directing traffic. Parents have been ticketed for stopping on Dorval to drop off students. A traffic flow study has been requested. Facilities has reviewed the parking lot and will install additional speed bumps, and 'no idling' signs. Support of CSC may expedite the solution to the traffic flow problem – Ciara De Jong will contact the Town of Oakville. A suggestion was made to have police officers directing traffic for a week.
ACHIEVING	 IB Update OSSLT Update After School Literacy Minutes: IB Update Natalie Cook, IB French teacher has stepped into the IB Guidance role in the month of September, while retaining her IB French classes. Successful IB Info Night on October 19th – attended by > 700 people. Recruitment continues into November with grade 8 classroom visits at our FOS elementary schools as well as elementary schools outside of our FOS. Applications for gr 9 pre-IB programme available starting November 21st and due on December 9th, 2022. Exam registrations for Gr. 11 and 12 students are complete. Registrations due on November 15th. Common Compass Mental Health Workshops for gr. 11 and 12 students were well received. Great strategies on how to cope with stress/anxiety, and how to develop time management skills were shared with students. OSSLT Update Gr. 11 and 12 students (previously eligible and students who have not yet written due to other factors) will write on Thursday, November 3rd in the library during periods 1 and 2. Ms. Munro has met with each of the students. Accommodations will be provided for students who have an IEP. Gr. 10 students will write Booklet 1 in their English class on Monday, November 7th and Booklet 2 on Tuesday, November 8th.
