Ontario Secondary School Diploma 30 credits (graduating class of June 2028)

- 18 compulsory credits
- 12 elective credits
- (4 Religion courses compulsory, 1 in each year)
- 2 Mandatory e-learning credits
- 40 hrs. Community Involvement Activities
- The Provincial Literacy Requirement





2-Mandatory E-Learning Credits

- 2-Elearning Credits are required to graduate (unless they opt out)
- Families that wish to opt-out can opt-out by indicating this in myBlueprint when selecting courses in grade 11.
- A student's graduation status <u>will not</u> be affected if they opt-out of the eLearning requirement.
- The opt-out form need only be submitted once. Students may also choose to opt-in at a later date.





Community Involvement

Minimum 40 hours beginning summer before Grade 9

- Encourages civic responsibility, Catholic values, and importance of volunteering
- Supports career explorations
- Students may begin community hours starting July $1^{\rm st}$, 2024
- Ministry and Board Guidelines governing placements





New Mandatory Tech Credit

In March 2023, the Ontario Government released this statement

- Starting with students entering Grade 9 in September 2024, all students will now be required to earn a Grade 9 or 10 Technological Education credit as part of their Ontario Secondary School Diploma.
- At this point we have no further information regarding this requirement from HCDSB





OSSD Literacy Test Requirement

MUST meet Literacy Test requirement to graduate (recorded on OST-transcript)

- Students take the Literacy Test in Grade 10
- Students will receive test support as they prepare to write the Literacy test
- If student is unable to meet standards on first attempt;
 - ✓ Help is available through the after-school Literacy program to prepare them for retaking the test in Grade 11



✓ If you were unsuccessful, you can take and pass the OLC4O1 course in Grade 12






