Philosophy

St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Secondary School administration and faculty are committed to responding to student and parent concerns promptly and equitably. This is consistent with our schoolwide goal of providing opportunities in a supportive and nurturing environment that is characterized by individual integrity and mutual respect.

Complaints and Student Appeals Procedures

We will provide any student or their parent/guardian the opportunity to discuss a decision or situation that a student considers unjust or unfair. Specifically:

- Concerns about a student's academic work, instructional materials, and/or the classroom environment/procedures should be brought to the attention of the teacher. Students and parents/guardians are encouraged to discuss problems and complaints through emails, phone calls, and scheduled conferences with the classroom teachers.
- 2. If the classroom matter remains unresolved after meeting or corresponding with the teacher, the student, their parent/guardian or the teacher may bring the matter to the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) Coordinator's attention for consideration and action.
- 3. The IB Programme and students' overall academic performance issues will be handled by the IBDP Coordinator. These may include concerns about admission to the programme, core requirements for Diploma and Certificate Candidates, the internal calendar for Internal Assessments completion, IB assessments, and awarding of diplomas and certificates. All programme policies are posted on the school's website.
- 4. The IBDP Coordinator can be contacted to begin meetings to determine if special learning accommodations are warranted. The IBDP Coordinator will work with the Special Education Team to resolve any issues of this nature.
- 5. Parents/Guardians and students are welcome to contact the Head of School when problems cannot be resolved with the teachers or the IBDP Coordinator.
