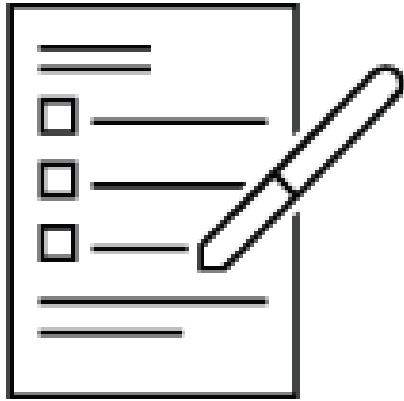

2. Select your school from the drop-down and click 'Create Account'

4. When prompted, enter your Ontario Education Number (OEN) & Date of Birth and complete the sign-up steps

What do you need to graduate?



30 credits, 18 of which are compulsory credits. PLUS one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1: Additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance & Career Education or Co-op

Group 2: Additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business Studies, or French as a second language or Co-op

Group 3: Additional credit in senior level science, Technological education, or French as a second language or computer studies or Co-op

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT 40 hours

Pick up a form in Student Services or visit the STA website for a form to record the details of your involvement – dates, hours completed and organization/contact names, signatures and phone numbers.

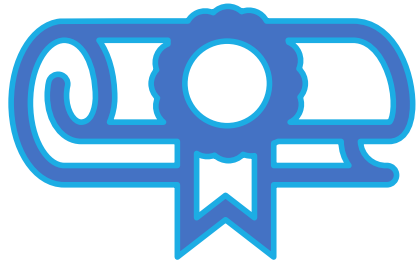

- **Grades 11 and 12:** all attempts, and the marks are recorded
- Transcripts used for admission to university and college

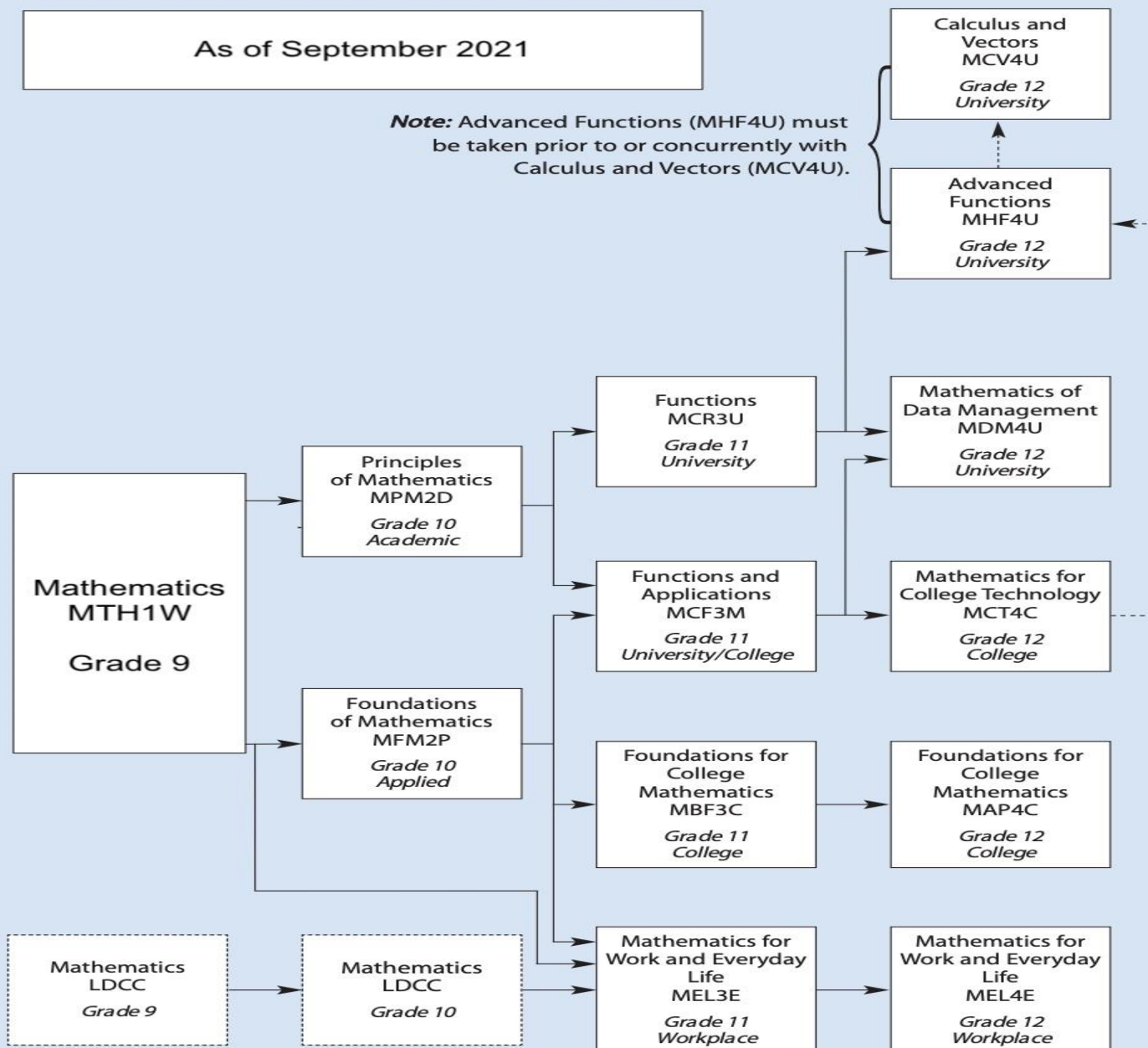
Backwards Map: Plan your courses from grade 12 to grade 10 on myblueprint.ca

Planning Considerations




Research university/college programs and their course requirements using the “Post-Secondary Planner” in **myBlueprint** or **OntarioUniversitiesInfo**. Every university and college program can have different requirements.

For example, Engineering programs usually require Physics, Chemistry, and Math, while Health Science programs require Biology, Chemistry, and Math. All programs require English!

You should also check the admission requirements on the University or College website. In particular, check to see if repeated/upgrade courses are accepted.

E-learning Requirement



It is recommended that students/families delay an “opt-out” request until Grade 11 *(when selecting courses for Grade 12)*

If you prefer to opt out before Grade 11 course selections, opt-out forms are available in Student Services.

If you do plan on selecting an E-learning course, select it through MyBlueprint with your other course selections. An E-Learning course will appear as a scheduled class.

- Students who select an E-Learning course will be contacted by their Guidance Counselor to fill out a separate permission form

- Log on daily for course

Summer School (July)



- ***4 week courses*** are offered:
 - For repeating a failed course
 - For earning a reach ahead course (such as Religion, English, Math)

Registration will take place over myBlueprint in **April 2024.**

Listen to announcements for details, check the school website and the school twitter.

Summer School *(continued)*:

If you plan on taking a compulsory course in summer school, you must still select it in myBlueprint during course selection. **Once you are registered for summer school (April), see your Guidance Counsellor to have it removed and another course added to your planner.**

E-Learning during the school year:

If you plan on selecting an e-learning course, you will need to register online with your guidance counsellor. **Select e-learning on myBlueprint, then see your Guidance Counsellor for more information.**



COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- **Ontario transcripts** with high school grades are sent to colleges
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12).
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses – English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required
- www.ontariocolleges.ca
- Some programs are highly competitive – apply by deadline
- Colleges also offer Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course. (required marks sometimes lower than University)

Programs require ENG 4U plus 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level

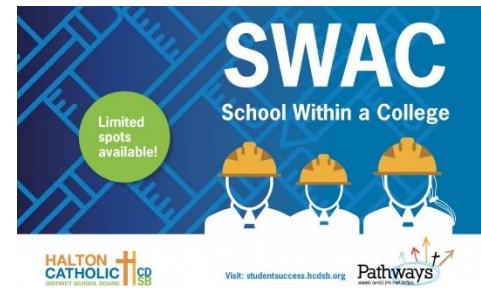
Some programs will have other pre-requisites like math, science

- Awareness campaign from the Ontario Government to try and address a shortage of highly skilled workers

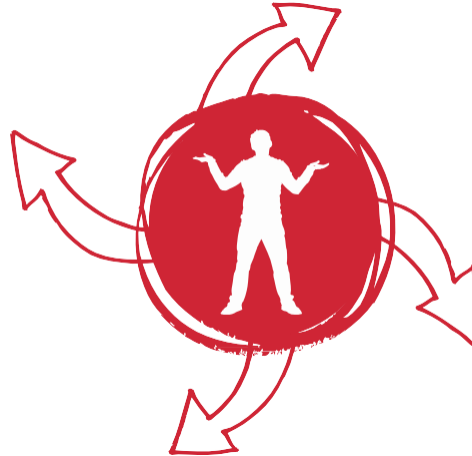

Grade 12 ENG4U1 1 Credit

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using academic language coherently and confidently, selecting the reading strategies best suited to particular texts and particular purposes for reading, and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace. Students considering moving from one destination to another (e.g., college to university; workplace to college) must successfully complete a transfer course.
