Creating an account if you did not come from an HCDSB school:

Students activate their accounts by following the steps below:

- 1. Visit www.myBlueprint.ca/hcdsb and click 'Sign Up'
- 2. Select your school from the drop-down and click 'Create Account
- 3. Select 'Student'
- 4. When prompted, enter your Ontario Education Number (OEN) & Date of Birth and complete the sign-up steps

What do you need to graduate?



30 credits, 18 of which are compulsory credits. PLUS one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1: Additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance & Career Education or Co-op

Group 2: Additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business Studies, or French as a second language or Co-op

Group 3: Additional credit in senior level science, Technological education, or French as a second language or computer studies or Co-op

COMMUNTY INVOLVEMENT 40 hours

Pick up a form in Student Services or visit the STA website for a form to record the details of your involvement – dates, hours completed and organization/contact names, signatures and phone numbers.

The form must be accompanied by a formal and signed letter from the volunteer organization.



Students' official record of credits earned

- Grades 9 and 10: only successfully completed courses are recorded
- Grades 11 and 12: all attempts, and the marks are recorded
- Transcripts used for admission to university and college



Planning Considerations




Research university/college programs and their course requirements using the "Post-Secondary Planner" in **myBlueprint** or **OntarioUniversitiesInfo**. Every university and college program can have different requirements.

For example, Engineering programs usually require Physics, Chemistry, and Math, while Health Science programs require Biology, Chemistry, and Math. All programs require English!

You should also check the admission requirements on the University or College website. In particular, check to see if repeated/upgrade courses are accepted.

E-learning Requirement



It is recommended that students/families delay an "opt-out" request until Grade 11 (when selecting courses for Grade 12)

If you prefer to opt out before Grade 11 course selections, opt-out forms are available in Student Services.

If you do plan on selecting an E-learning course, select it through MyBlueprint with your other course selections. An E-Learning course will appear as a scheduled class.

Summer School (July)



- 4 week courses are offered:
 - For repeating a failed course
 - For earning a reach ahead course (such as Religion, English, Math)

Registration will take place over myBlueprint in April 2024.

Summer School (continued):

If you plan on taking a compulsory course in summer school, you must still select it in myBlueprint during course selection. Once you are registered for summer school (April), see your Guidance Counsellor to have it removed and another course added to your planner.

E-Learning during the school year:

If you plan on selecting an e-learning course, you will need to register online with your guidance counsellor.



COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- Ontario transcripts with high school grades are sent to colleges
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12).
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required
- www.ontariocolleges.ca
- Some programs are highly competitive apply by deadline
- Colleges also offer Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course. (required marks sometimes lower than University)

OSSD

 Universities may consider both G<u>rade 11 and 12</u> U and M courses for early admission

Programs require ENG 4U plus 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level

Some programs will have other pre-requisites like math, science

Some programs are grades + Supplemental

Each university could be different even with the same program
