## GRADE 12 WORKLOAD SCENARIO

- Grade 12 students carry at least 6-8 courses
- This means that grade 12's who finish grade 11 with at least 24 credits could have 1-2 spares.
- Grade 12 students need to weight out the pros and cons to having a spare.
- For example, if you have a spare will you use this time wisely.

This chart maps out all the courses in the discipline and shows the links between courses and the possible prerequisites for them. It does not attempt to depict all possible movements from course to course.

## Types of Courses

The $4^{\text {th }}$ character of a course code denotes the year in which the course is offered. The $5^{\text {th }}$ character of the course code denotes the level of the course.

## Will I graduate?

- Have you earned 30 credits, including all compulsory credits?
- Have you completed 40 hours of Community Service?
- Elearn Credit Requirements
- Have you passed the Literacy Test?**
- If you were unsuccessful on the Literacy Test you must select the following course in grade 12: OLC401. This course, once earned, will satisfy the Literacy requirement.


## eLearn Requirement

- Two eLearn courses are now a graduation requirement, unless a an opt-out is completed.
- Grade 11 students who wish to opt out of this requirement can do so when selecting grade 12 courses in myBlueprint.
- Students who have not opted out will see an option to do so in your high school planner. Under the grade 12 column you will see the option to add " Online Learning Opt-Out" Click this option and select "Grade 12 OLOPTO"
- If you wish to opt out, please add this the same way you would add a course to your planner.


## eLearn Requirement (coninime)

- Please note this opt out code does not carry a credit value. Its purpose is to indicate to the school that you and your parents/guardians wish to have you opt out of the eLearn requirement.
- If you decide not to opt out, you will require two eLearn credits to graduate in June 2025.

## What do you need to graduate?

In order to obtain your Ontario Secondary School Diploma (O.S.S.D) you need:
18 Compulsory Credits:
4 credits in English (1 credit per grade)
3 credits in mathematics (1 credit at the senior level)
2 credits in science
1 credit in Canadian History
1 credit in Canadian Geography
1 credit in the arts
1 credit in health and physical education
1 credit in French as a second language
.5 credit in career studies
. 5 credit in civics

## What do you need to graduate?

## PLUS one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1: Additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance \& Career Education or Coop*

Group 2: Additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business Studies, or French as a second language or Coop*

Group 3: Additional credit in senior level science, or Technological education, or French as a second language or computer studies or Coop*

## Summer School (July)

- 4 week courses are offered:
- For repeating a failed course
- For earning a reach ahead course

Registration will take place over myBlueprint in April 2024. Listen to announcements for details, check the school website and the school twitter.

Summer School (continued):
If you plan on taking a compulsory course in summer school, you must still select it in myBlueprint. Once you are registered for summer school (April), see your Guidance Counsellor to have it removed and another course added to your planner.

E-Learning during the school year:
If you plan on selecting an e-learning course, you will need to register online with your guidance counsellor. Select e-learning on myBlueprint, then see your Guidance Counsellor for more information..

## COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

OSSD
All Gr. 11 \& 12 high school grades are sent to colleges.
Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12).

Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses English, Math, Science etc.
-Specific courses and grades may be required.

Some programs are highly competitive.
Colleges also offer Applied Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course (Required marks usually lower that University)
