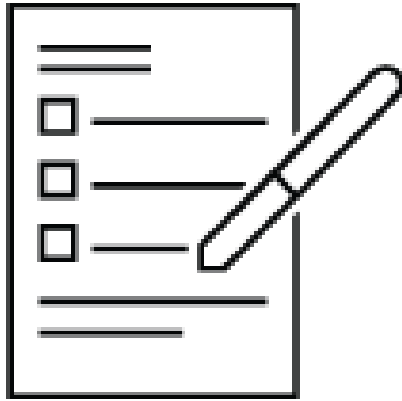

Having trouble with myBlueprint?



You will not be able to submit your course selections without myBlueprint, so make sure you can log on.



Forgot your Password? Click on the “forgot password” link.



Can't remember your email? Speak to your Guidance Counselor or contact myBlueprint directly (contact details are on their homepage).

Forget how to get into myBlueprint?

Log in with your board/school provided email and password.

What Do You Need to Graduate?

✓ Of the 17 compulsory credits, you must complete 1 from the

✓ following STEM group:

- ✓ **Business studies**
- ✓ **Computer studies**
- ✓ **Cooperative education**
- ✓ **Mathematics** (*in addition to the 3 compulsory Math credits required*)
- ✓ **Science** (*in addition to the 2 compulsory Science credits required*)
- ✓ **Technological Education** (*in addition to the 1 compulsory Tech credit required*)

What Do You Need to Graduate?

30 Credits in Total

17 Compulsory Credits + 13 Elective Credits

Of the 13 Elective Credits Students are required to take:

- 4 Religious Education courses *(1 each year in Gr. 9-12)*
- 9 Optional credits *that match a student's interests and individual pathway plan*

What Do You Need to Graduate?

Completion of the Financial Literacy Requirement



Starting in September 2025, you must earn a new financial literacy graduation requirement as part of your compulsory Grade 10 mathematics course.

You will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement and earn your high school diploma.

What Do You Need To Graduate?

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

40 hours



- Pick up a form in Student Services or visit the STA website for a form to record the details of your involvement – dates, hours completed and organization/contact names, signatures and phone numbers.
- **Students must submit 40 hours of Community Service hours to their Guidance Counselor**
- To help students keep track of hours completed beyond the 40-hour minimum, they may choose to record them in their **Individual Pathways Plan (IPP)** in myBlueprint.

What do you need to graduate?

Online Learning Requirement



Two online learning credits are now a graduation requirement, unless an opt-out is completed

It is recommended that students/families delay an opt-out request until Grade 11

If you prefer to opt-out before Gr.11 course selections, opt-out forms are available on the board website and may be submitted to Student Services

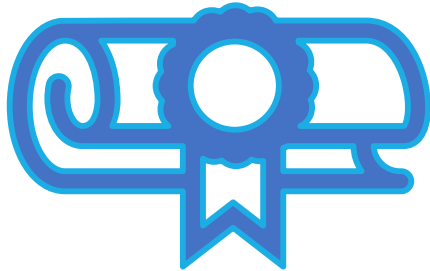

- Transcripts used for admission to university and college

Planning Considerations



Research university/college programs and their course requirements using the “[Post-Secondary Planner](#)” in **myBlueprint**. Every university and college program can have different requirements.

For example, Engineering programs usually require Physics, Chemistry, and Math, while Health Science programs require Biology, Chemistry, and Math. All programs require English!

You should also check the admission requirements on the University or College website. In particular, check to see if repeated/upgrade courses are accepted.

Electives/Summer School



You may choose to take BOTH *Gr. 10 Civics & Careers* in summer school

If you decide that you will be taking Gr.10 Civics & Careers in summer school, please **DO NOT** select it on your myBlueprint course selections for Gr.10; instead, select a 3rd elective

Please Note: Civics & Careers is a mandatory graduation requirement and there is no guarantee that there will be room available if you decide not to take it during summer school.

**** Pre-IB Students must complete their Civics and Careers courses BEFORE the start of Grade 10 to fulfill mandatory Tech Credit requirement**

Summer School (July 2025)

Why Take Summer School?

- To repeat a failed course
- To earn a reach ahead credit
- Registration for summer school will take place in **April 2025** using myBlueprint
- If you plan on taking a compulsory course, such as English, Math, or History in the summer, ***you must still select it in myBlueprint***
- Once you are registered for summer school (April/May), **see your Guidance Counselor to have it removed and another course can be chosen**
- **NO IB COURSES ARE OFFERED IN SUMMER SCHOOL OR NIGHT SCHOOL!!!**
(NOTHING THAT HAS A 7 IN THE CODE)

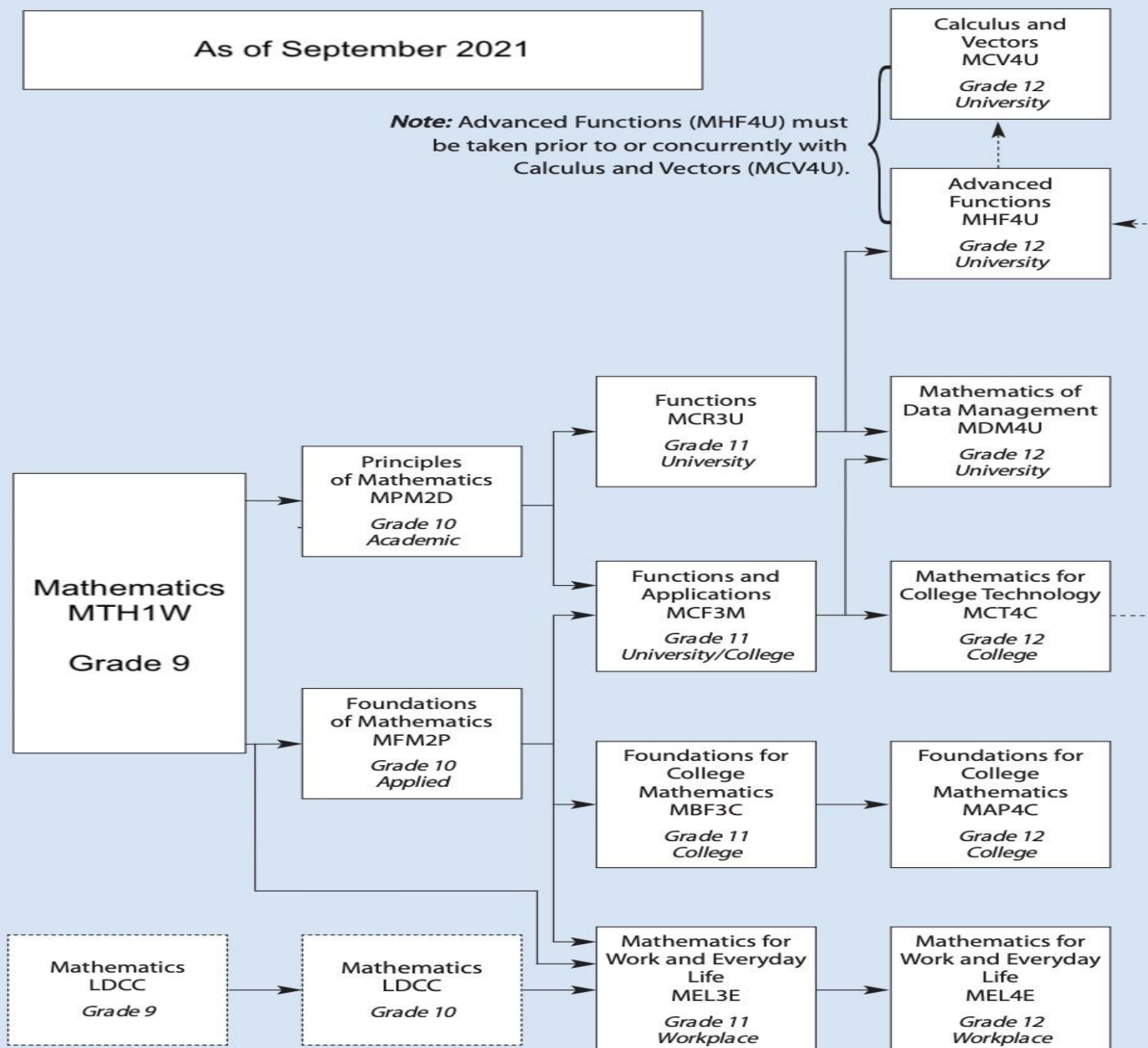

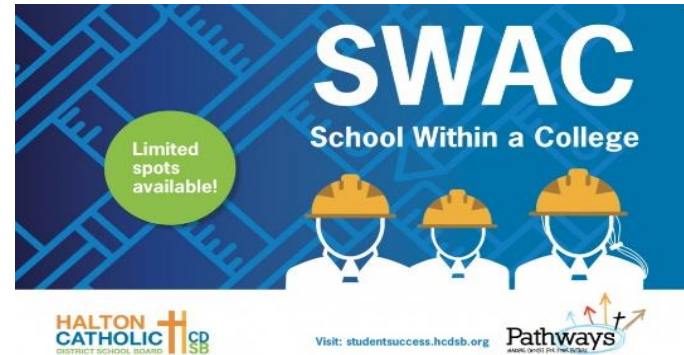

CO-OP & Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program

- Get hands on experience in a career/profession of your choice and an employment opportunity.
- Explore Apprenticeship through a **CO-OP** work placement by turning it into an OYAP.
- Students can be registered as an apprentice while still in High School
- Awareness Campaign from the Ontario Government to try and address a shortage of highly skilled technical people.

OYAP-FAST Apprenticeship Program

- ✓ Are you a hands-on learner who wants to get a head start on a great paying career in the skilled trades?
- ✓ Would you like to work towards becoming an apprentice while earning your high school diploma?

Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training (FAST) is a specialized program that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional Co-op credits, while completing their OSSD.

Students who meet the completion requirements, and all other OSSD requirements, will be awarded the OYAP-FAST seal on their diploma.

Grade 10 ENG2D1 1 Credit Academic

This course is designed to extend the range of oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in their secondary school academic programs and in their daily lives. Students will analyse literary texts from contemporary and historical periods, interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on the selective use of strategies that contribute to effective communication. This course is intended to prepare students for the compulsory Grade 11 university or college preparation course. Students considering moving from one destination to another (e.g., applied to academic; academic to applied) are strongly encouraged to take a summer school course to encourage success in the transition.

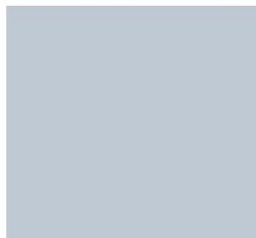

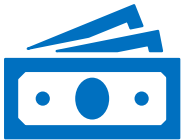

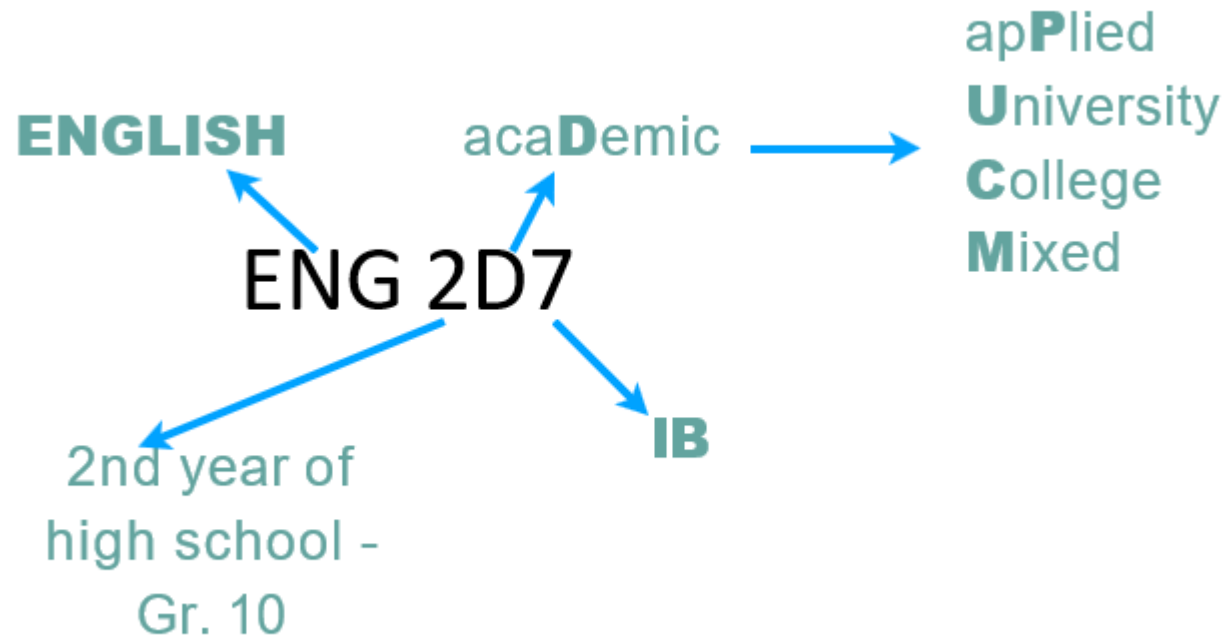
