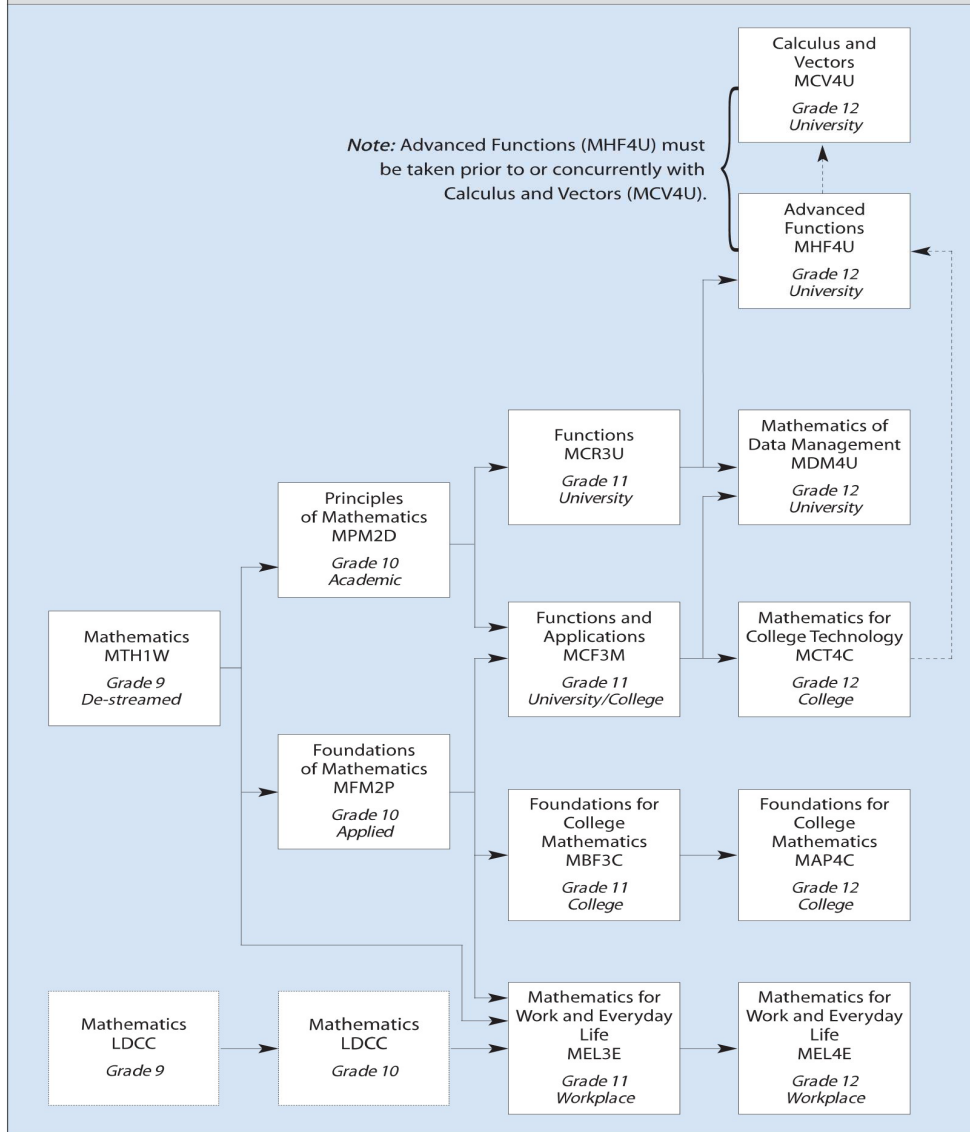

GRADE 12 WORKLOAD SCENARIO

- Grade 12 students carry at least 6-8 courses
- This means that grade 12's who finish grade 11 with at least 24 credits could have 1-2 spares.
- Grade 12 students need to weight out the pros and cons to having a spare.
- For example, if you have a spare will you use this time wisely.

Prerequisite Chart for Mathematics, Grades 9–12

This chart maps out all the courses in the discipline and shows the links between courses and the possible prerequisites for them. It does not attempt to depict all possible movements from course to course.



Note: LDCC – locally developed compulsory credit course (LDCC courses are not outlined in this curriculum.)

Online Learning Requirement

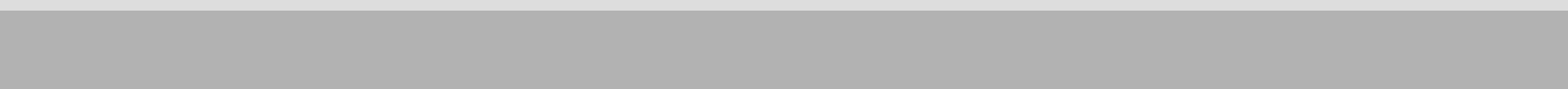
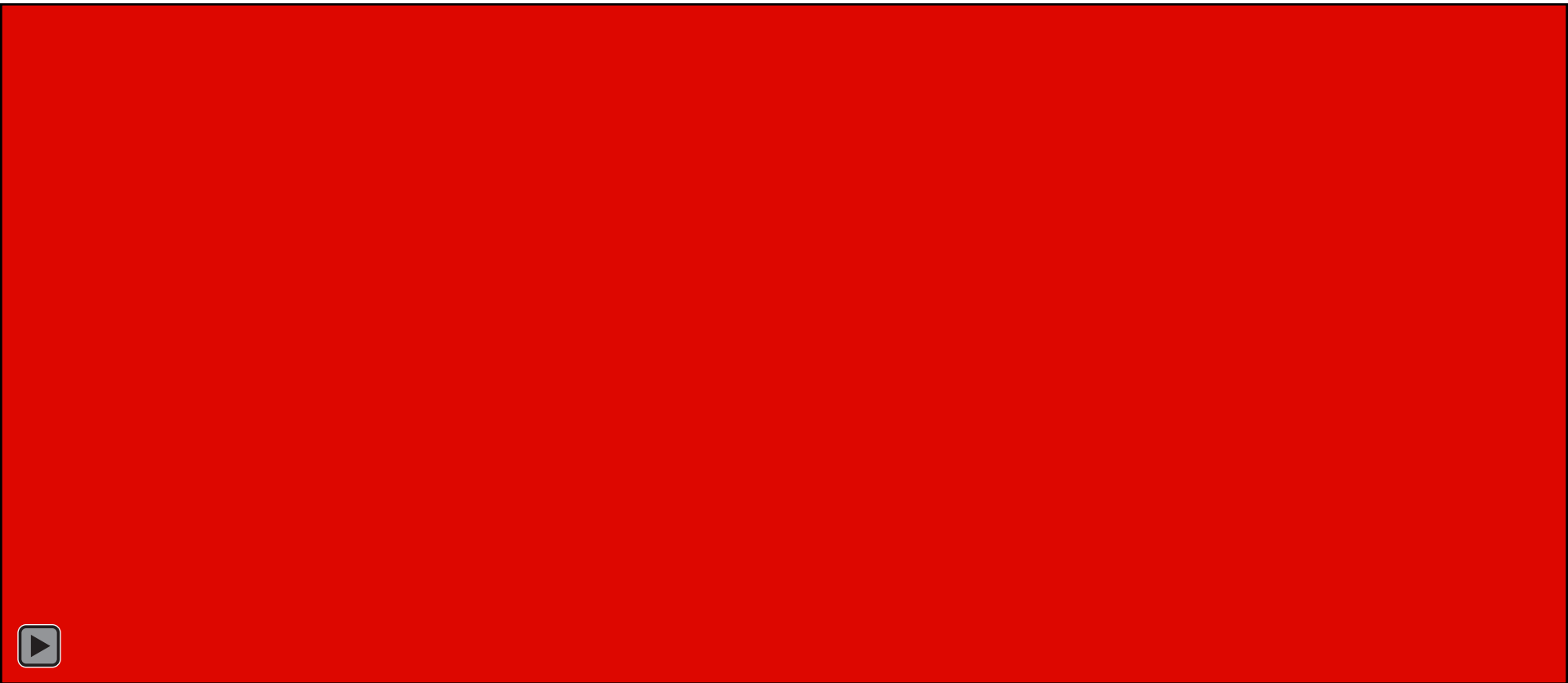
- Two Online courses are now a graduation requirement, unless an opt-out is completed.
- Grade 11 students who wish to opt out of this requirement can do so when selecting grade 12 courses in myBlueprint.
- Students who have not opted out will see an option to do so in your high school planner. Under the grade 12 column you will see the option to add “ Online Learning Opt-Out” Click this option and select **“Grade 12 OLOPTO”**
- If you wish to opt out, please add this the same way you would add a course to your planner.

Online Learning Requirement

(Continued)

- Please note this opt out code does not carry a credit value. Its purpose is to indicate to the school that you and your parents/guardians wish to have you opt out of the eLearn requirement.
- If you decide not to opt out, you will require two eLearn credits to graduate in June 2026.

1 credit in the arts

1 credit in health and physical education

1 credit in French as a second language

.5 credit in career studies

.5 credit in civics

What do you need to graduate?

PLUS one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1: Additional credit in English, or French as a second language, or Social Sciences and the Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance & Career Education or Coop*

Group 2: Additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or Business Studies, or French as a second language or Coop*

Group 3: Additional credit in senior level science, or Technological education, or French as a second language or computer studies or Coop*

Summer School (July)

- 4 week courses are offered:
 - For repeating a failed course
 - For earning a reach ahead course

Registration will take place over myBlueprint in April 2025. Listen to announcements for details, check the school website and the school twitter.

Summer School (continued):

If you plan on taking a compulsory course in summer school, you must still select it in myBlueprint. **Once you are registered for summer school (April), see your Guidance Counsellor to have it removed and another course added to your planner.**

E-Learning during the school year:

If you plan on selecting an e-learning course, you will need to register online with your guidance counsellor. **Select e-learning on myBlueprint, then see your Guidance Counsellor** for more information..

ONTARIO STUDENT TRANSCRIPT

- Students' official record of credits earned
- Grades 9 and 10
 - only successfully completed courses are recorded
- Grades 11 and 12
 - all attempts, and the marks are recorded
 - transcripts used for admission to university and college

Note: For students who have withdrawn from a course after five instructional days following the issue of the first provincial report card, the grade at the time of withdrawal will appear on a transcript.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

40 Hours

Pick up a form in Student Services or visit the STA website for a form to record the details of your involvement – dates, hours completed and organization/contact names, signatures and phone numbers. **The form must be accompanied by a formal and signed letter from the volunteer organization.**

To help students keep track of hours completed beyond the 40-hour minimum, they may choose to record them in their **Individual Pathways Plan (IPP)** in myBlueprint.

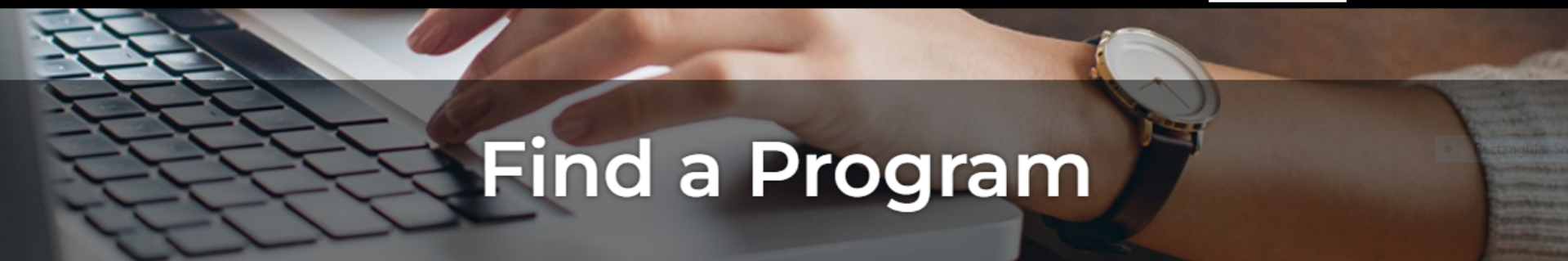

- OSSD
- **All Gr. 11 & 12** high school grades are sent to colleges.
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12).
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses – English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required.

- Some programs are highly competitive.
- Colleges also offer Applied Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course (Required marks usually lower than University)

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), or equivalent including the following required course(s):

- ✓ English – any Grade 12 (C) or (U), or equivalent
- ✓ Biology – Grade 11 (C) or (U) or Grade 12 (U)
- ✓ Chemistry – Grade 11 (U) or Grade 12 (C) or (U) **OR**
Physics – Grade 11 (U) or Grade 12 (C) or (U)

Recommended Courses and/or Skills:

These courses and skills may help you succeed academically in this program, but they are *not required* for admission.

✓ Selection and Ranking

Applications are evaluated based on the published [admission requirements](#). When the applicant provides proof of meeting the requirements, an offer of admission can be issued, provided space is available in the program.

In the event the number of qualified applicants exceeds the available seats in the program, selection will be based on Ontario residency and the most senior level final grade available in required courses at the time of ranking.

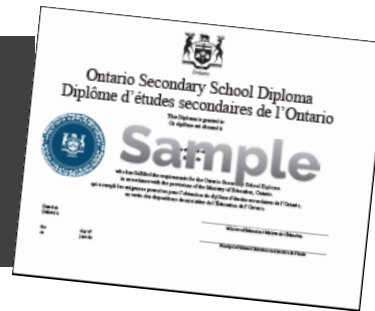


OYAP-FAST Apprenticeship Program

Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training (FAST) is a specialized program that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional Co-op credits, while completing their OSSD.

Students who meet the completion requirements, and all other OSSD requirements, will be awarded the OYAP-FAST seal on their diploma.

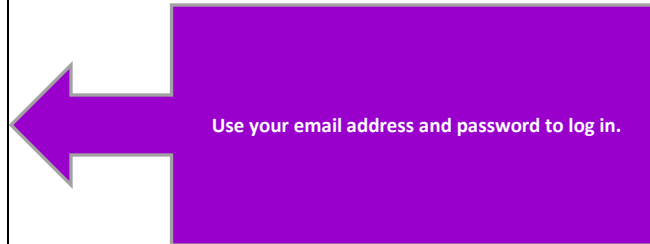

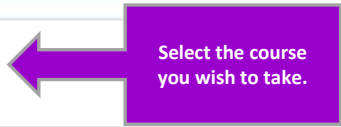

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using academic language coherently and confidently, selecting the reading strategies best suited to particular texts and particular purposes for reading, and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace. Students considering moving from one destination to another (e.g., college to university; workplace to college) must successfully complete a transfer course.

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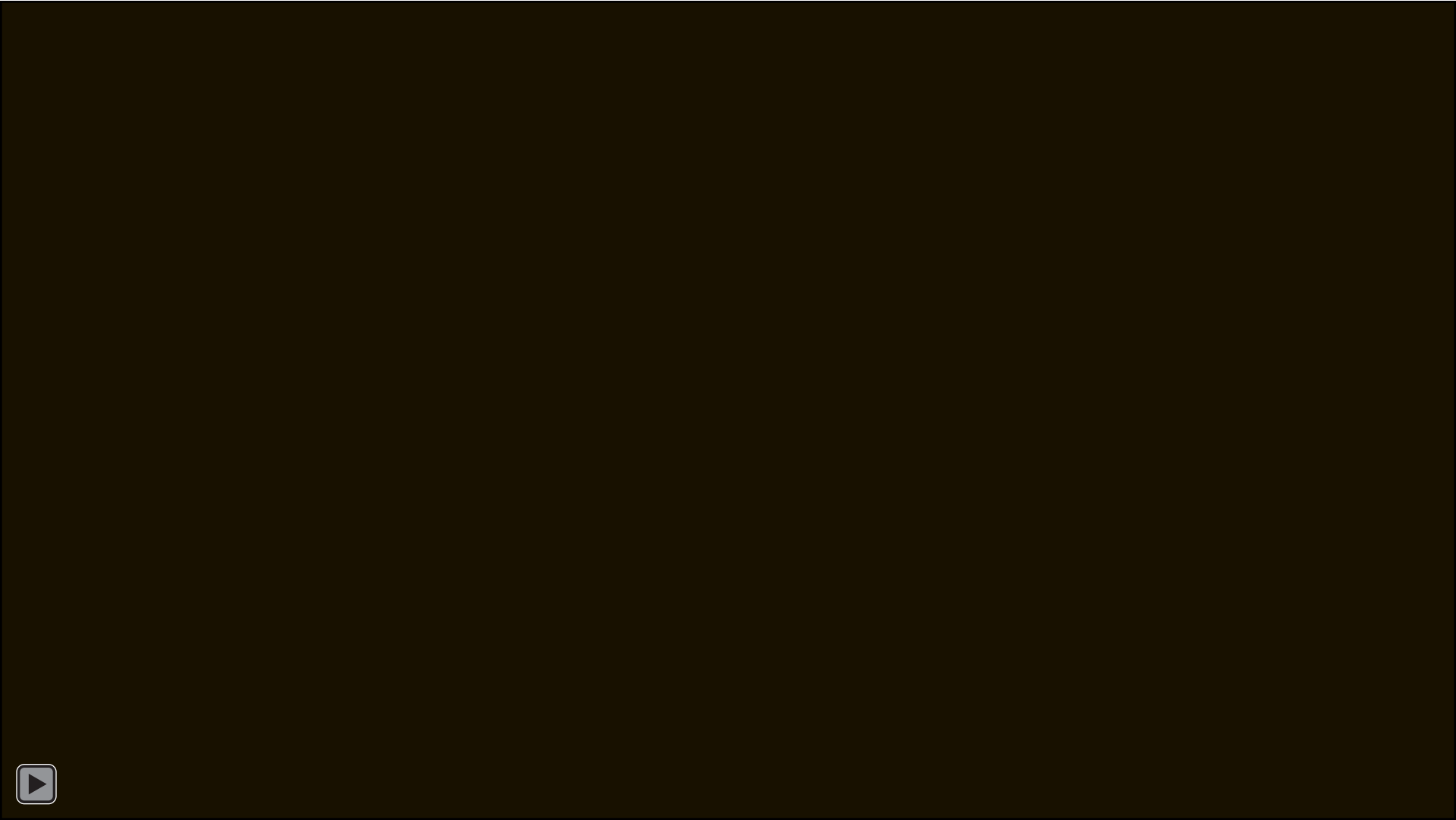
