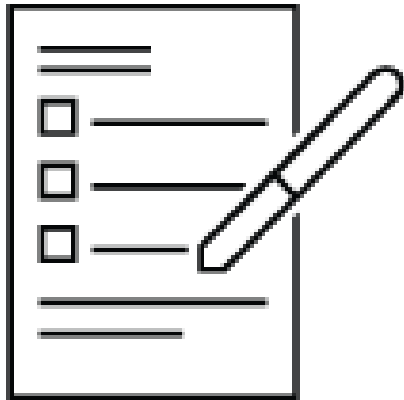

Overview

Course selection will be done online using **myBlueprint**.



Activity Fee Payment must be paid through **SchoolCashOnline** (please keep a copy of your receipt)



Having trouble with myBlueprint?



You will not be able to submit your course selections without myBlueprint, so make sure you can log on.



Forgot your Password? Click on the “forgot password” link.



Can't remember your email? Speak to your Guidance Counsellor or contact myBlueprint directly (contact details are on their homepage).

Forget how to get into MyBlueprint?

Log in with your board/school provided email and password.

This would be the same log in that you use to log in to the computers at school

Tip: Use the email address that you used last year – it will probably be

firstname.lastname.###@students.hcdsb.org

Use the password that you used last year.

Click “Forgot Password?” to reset it if you can’t remember it

Creating an account if you did not come from an HCDSB school:

Students activate their accounts by following the steps below:

1. Visit www.myBlueprint.ca/hcdsb and click 'Sign Up'
2. Select your school from the drop-down and click 'Create Account'
3. Select 'Student'
4. When prompted, enter your Ontario Education Number (OEN) & Date of Birth and complete the sign-up steps

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT 40 hours

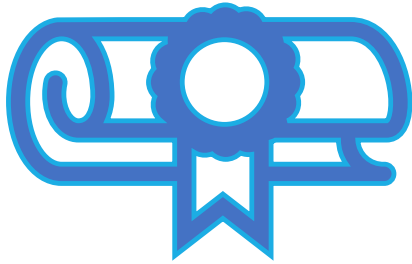

- **Grades 9 and 10:** only successfully completed courses are recorded
- **Grades 11 and 12:** all attempts, and the marks, are recorded
- Transcripts used for admission to university and college

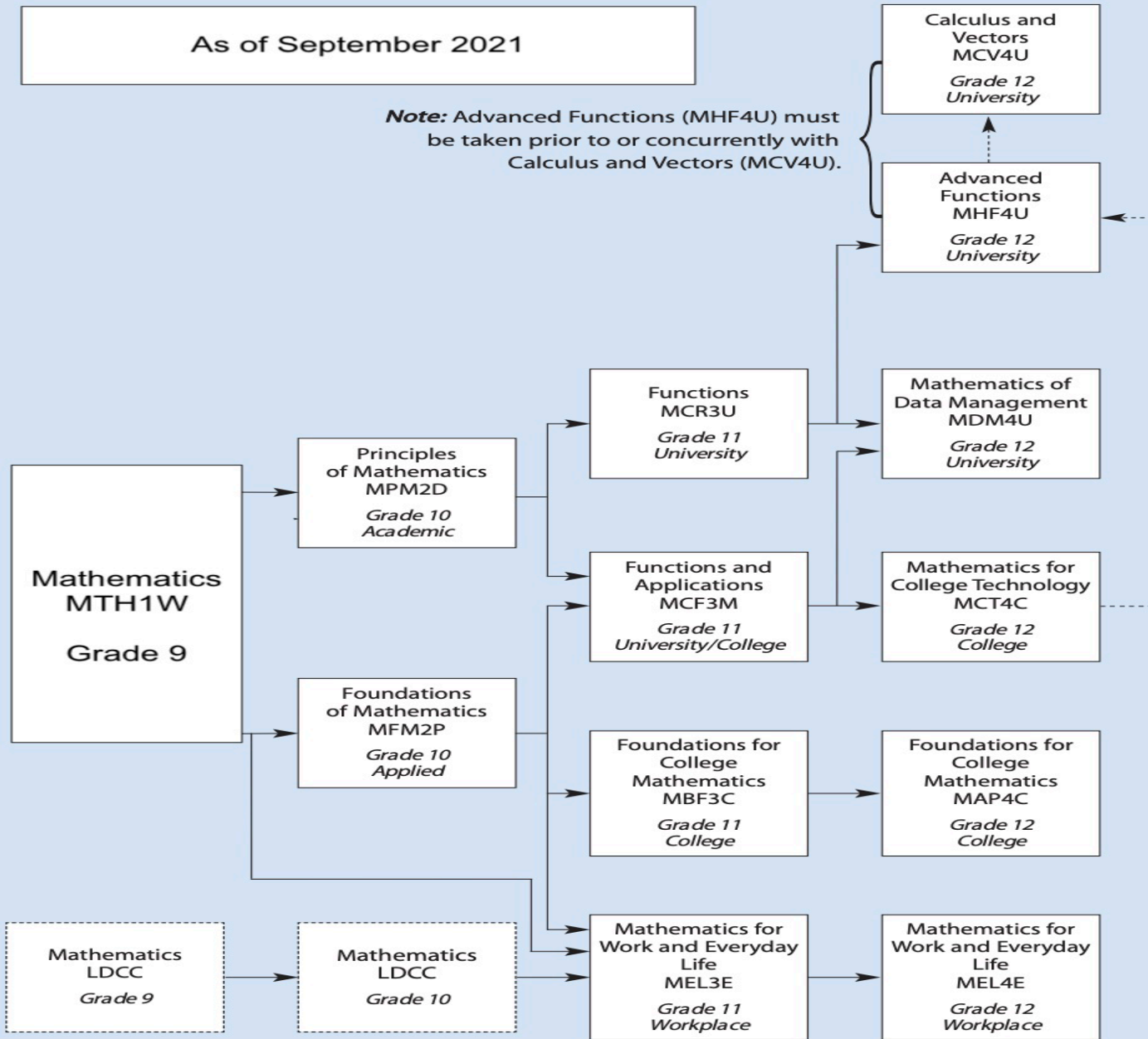
Backwards Map: Plan your courses from grade 12 to grade 10 on myblueprint.ca

Planning Considerations




Research university/college/apprenticeship programs and their **course requirements** using the “Post-Secondary Planner” in **myBlueprint** or **<https://www.ouinfo.ca/>** and **ontariocolleges.ca**. Every university and college program can have different requirements.

For example, Engineering programs usually require Physics, Chemistry, and Math, while Health Science programs require Biology, Chemistry, and Math. All programs require English!

You should also check the admission requirements on the University or College website. In particular, check the policy on repeated/upgrade courses.

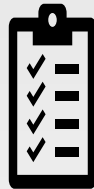

Online Learning Requirement



Two online courses are a graduation requirement, unless an opt-out form is completed.

It is recommended that students/families delay an “opt-out” request until Grade 11 (*when selecting courses for Grade 12*)

If you prefer to opt out before Grade 11 course selections, opt-out forms are available in Student Services.

If you do plan on selecting an online learning course, select it through MyBlueprint with your other course selections. An online learning course will appear as a scheduled class.

Summer School (July)



- **4 week courses** are offered:
 - For repeating a failed course
 - For earning a reach ahead course (such as Religion, English, Math)
 - Coop usually runs a few days into August

Registration will take place on myBlueprint in **April 2026.**

Summer School *(continued)*:

If you plan on taking a compulsory course in summer school, you must still select it in myBlueprint during course selection. **Once you are registered for summer school (April), see your Guidance Counsellor to have it removed and another course added to your planner.**

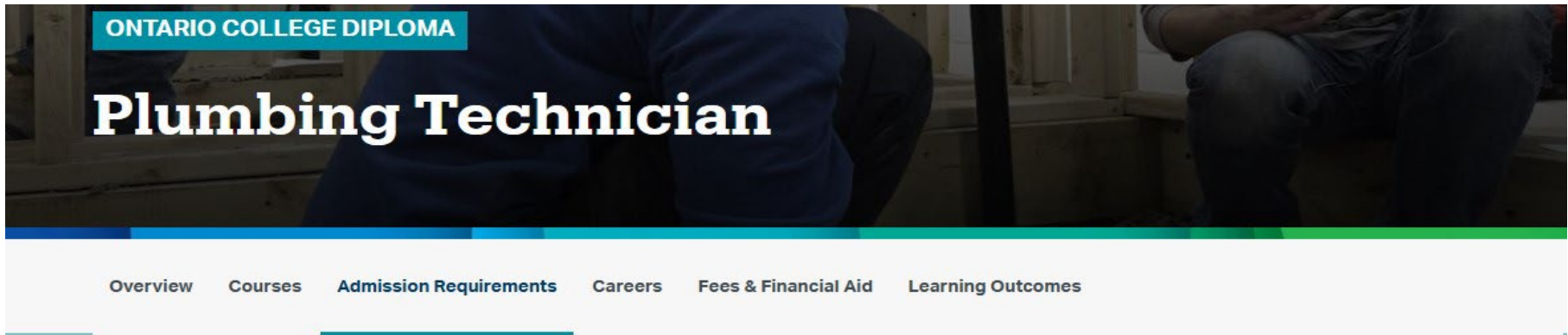

COLLEGE ADMISSION GUIDELINES

- OSSD
- **Ontario transcripts** with high school grades are uploaded to colleges
- Most programs will use an average of 6 best senior level credits (Grade 11 and 12).
- Some colleges will only use the grades of the required courses – English, Math, Science etc.
- Specific courses and grades may be required
- www.ontariocolleges.ca
- **Some programs are highly competitive – apply by deadline**
- Colleges also offer Degrees which need 6 Grade 12 U or M course. (required marks sometimes lower than University)

- OSSD
- Universities may consider both Grade 11 and 12 U and M courses for early admission

Programs require ENG 4U plus 5 other U or M courses at the grade 12 level

Some programs will have other pre-requisites like math, science

Some programs are grades + Supplemental

Each university could be different even with the same program

COOP and Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP)

- Get hands on experience in a career/profession of your choice

- Awareness campaign from the Ontario government to try and address a shortage of highly skilled workers

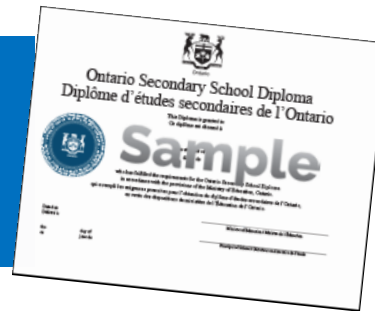


OYAP-FAST Apprenticeship Program

- ✓ Are you a hands-on learner who wants to get a head start on a great paying career in the skilled trades?
- ✓ Would you like to work towards becoming an apprentice while earning your high school diploma?

Focused Apprenticeship Skills Training (FAST) is a specialized program that allows students in Grades 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional Co-op credits, while completing their OSSD.

Students who meet the completion requirements, and all other OSSD requirements, will be awarded the OYAP-FAST seal on their diploma.

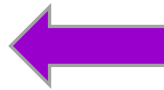

English: Contemporary Aboriginal Vo

Course Outline: This course emphasizes the development of literacy, critical thinking, and communication skills through the study of works in English by Aboriginal writers. Through the analysis of literary texts and media works, students will develop an appreciation of the wealth and complexity of Aboriginal writing. Students will also conduct research and analyse the information gathered; write persuasive and literary essays; and analyse the relationship between medias and audiences. An important focus will be the further development of students' understanding of English-language usage and conventions.

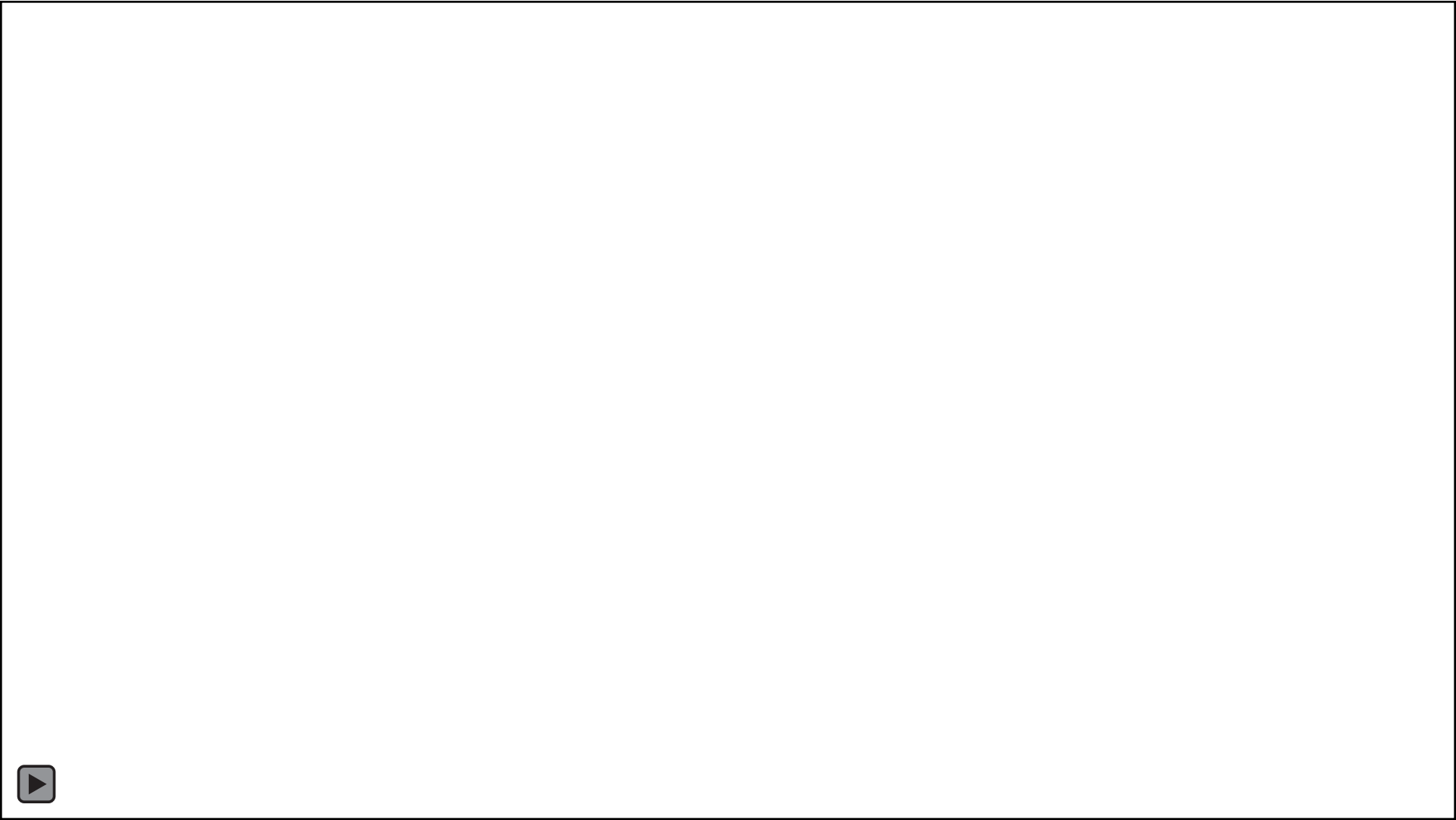
